Yorkton Has Much to Offer Visitors

When you're travelling through East Central Saskatchewan you will enjoy a stopover in Yorkton.

It starts with the city simply being an inviting one, offered Juanita Polegi, Executive Director with the Yorkton Chamber of Commerce. "It's a pretty city with tree lined avenues and streets and well maintained residential and commercial districts," she said. "The public spaces are well maintained and boast attractive flowers and shrubbery, with barrels of flowers lining the streets and the city is so clean.

"There are numerous green spaces and walking trails for people to stretch their legs and re-energize.

"And, the people are friendly."

Yorkton Mayor Mitch Hippsley says what exists today is built on a long history.

"Yorkton dates back to 1883 beginning as York Colony located only two KMs north of its present location. When the first post office opened, it was re-named Yorkton. When CP rail was being built, the settlers picked up & moved to our present location," he said.

"It is interesting to know that at the turn of the century it was one of the fastest growing cities in the province & even bigger than Saskatoon at the time!"

History is a draw of its own, offered Yorkton Business Improvement District Executive Director Donna Brothwell.

"If you love history our old buildings and sky line is a walking tour of its own," she said. "Our downtown buildings such as the Land Title or the Hudson's Bay are architectural sights, plus with the flowers the city and YBID add to the streets it is a beautiful walk."

Brothwell said ultimately Yorkton is a good place to be.

"Coming to Yorkton is a real experience and tourists stop here for many reasons," she said. "Family is a draw for tourists as many come to see their special persons and we have nice hotels with waters slides at the Home Inn and of course the Casino. While here visitors and tourists can see the schedule for the walking track, indoor pool, curling and many indoor as well as outdoor activities."

"We are full of culture, arts, restaurants, shopping, sports, family amenities and best of all ... our hospitality. Our pioneer ancestors have cultivated a "down home flavor" to all our visitors," noted Hippsley.


"Summer we have so much for our tourists to stop here for which include our golf circuit. So a person can stay at our hotels and play at three local courses and so many more in just a half hour drive."

Brothwell said it goes beyond golf of course ranging from walking trails at Logan Green to the City Central Park one of many amazing city parks, which include outdoor water spray parks, tennis and pickle ball courts, basketball nets, disc golf and more.

Polegi said the city always seems to have an event going on; the Yorkton Film Festival, Summer Fair and Harvest Showdown all being signature events, plus "tournaments, meets and rallies of all kinds are held each weekend on the diamonds, pitches, fields, fairways and speedways."

Visits can be made to the Western Development Museum; Godfrey Dean Cultural Centre to view the latest art exhibits; the library; and the Brick Flour Mill to learn more about the history of the area, added Polegi.

The downtown skateboard park is also a popular spot for young people.



"Now that the Flour Mill is taking tours that is another attraction to come and see," said Brothwell.

And, "St. Mary's dome is another attraction that is something to see."

Even if you're just coming in for an evening you can do a movie, go bowling and dinner.

Brothwell said it starts with many restaurants and great eats unique such as Wonders, TeaPro, Chester's Chicken (Philippines cuisine), and the recently opened Moose and Bannock.

There are also unique shopping opportunities such as the Philippines store, Garam Masala, SMAK Ukraine Store, to mention a few, added Brothwell.

Polegi agreed with the city having a vibrant business district.

"The Business community is diverse with the retail industry ranging from small, unique local shops to the big box stores found everywhere," she said.

The local Arts Council offers professional shows which are posted and advertised, and events such as YBID June days gives the tourist and locals fun activities," added Brothwell, noting the "City does park parties all summer long as well."

Then there is the Yorkton Film Festival, the oldest in North America.

"It's a huge draw for tourists and filmmakers alike," said Brothwell.

Recreationally, "our Gallagher Centre offers many activities and events, hockey games, swimming,

Harvest Showdown, skating, so our tourists can stop and take in an activity or event," said Brothwell.

Hippsley said the Gallagher Centre is certainly a community hub.

"Make sure you visit our gem, "The Gallagher Center", the gathering center of our city located on Broadway Street West," he said. "We have an incredible wave pool attached to our swimming pool with an awesome water slide, a hockey rink home to our famous 'Yorkton Terriers', a six sheet-curling rink that has been a birthplace for a few Olympic Champions, a flexi hall

for sports and big special events throughout the year."

Water features are huge in the community, said Polegi.

"A water park in the Gallagher Centre and spray parks located throughout the city are a great way for kids to cool down and have some fun," she said.

"With all the amenities Yorkton has to offer, it can serve as a base for tourists who wish to explore the nearby lakes or who wish to take day trips to our neighbouring communities to visit their local attractions," said Polegi. While the city offers a number of fine hotels and motels there is also camping in the City Campground, or at York Lake Regional Park, or even nearby Good Spirit Lake which offers the full lake experience of swimming, boating, and fishing.

Birding Opportunities

Birdwatching is a favoured activity of many on vacation, and the Yorkton area is a wonderful spot with many excellent locations to discover. For those wanting to search out local species the Tourism Yorkton Centre has copies of 'Gone to the Birds' a special information sheet showcasing all of the birding opportunities in the area. The brochure includes everything from viewing tips, to details on where to look for the wildlife you are interested in.

Eleven spectacular birding opportunities are highlighted and waiting to be discovered. June 5, 2003 marked the inception of the YFBTA which works to promote awareness of the importance of preserving and protecting spaces for wildlife to exist. YFBTA works to promote these spaces and to facilitate tourism. "Birds are symbolic of nature. Migration is an incredible feat and it is, to say the very least, remarkable that they can travel incredible distances in volatile weather to arrive each spring. Many of the birds are sporting wonderful plumage in spring," said Rob Wilson with the Yellowhead Flyway Birding Trail Association (YFBTA), who added there is a near inherent interest most of us have in birds, and the local area is a good place to feed that interest. Throughout the summer, excursions in nature



are organized by association members. For details or to be a part of the outings check the website at www.yfbta.com or find us on Facebook, Yellowhead Flyway Birding.

The area of the Yellowhead Flyway Birding Trails Association extends from the Manitoba border west to Highway 9.

The southern part of the area begins with the Qu'Apelle Valley and its northern boundary lies north of Highway 10.

There are currently five birding trails within the YFBTA region: The Carlton Trail Regional Park, Cherrydale Golf Course and Nature Preserve, Kaposvar Trail, Leflay Trail and Slough View Park. "I think our birding group attracts members because many people although not able to be active or choosing not be active are nonetheless interested in being supportive of the advocacy. I believe that most people feel a sense of responsibility to ensuring that enough spaces and places are preserved facilitate the stopping, resting, feeding and sheltering that are an essential component

of the migration process that birds attempt twice each year," offered Wilson. The YFBTA is affiliated with Nature Saskatchewan which publishes 'Nature Views' and 'The Blue Jay'.

Geocaching

If you like a good mystery and you want to go on a grand adventure, then geocaching might be just what you need to try.

In recent years the hobby of geocaching has been growing, and with that growth the opportunity to enjoy the activity while traveling.

Geocaching uses global positioning technology to help with what is essentially a modern take on a treasure hunt.

It's a case where other people hide things all over the place (outdoors generally), and then other people go out and find them using the GPS coordinates.

There are specialized GPS tracking units which can be used; Magellan and Garmin two of the best-known, but cellphones work too using various apps for iPhone and Android which link directly to the geocaching site.

The coordinates to the hidden spots are posting at www.geocaching.com, an Internet site which acts as a hub for sharing information with geocachers around the world. The site has thousands of caches to seek out around the world. There are some 40 in Yorkton and 500 in Regina as examples, and is free to sign up for.

Some caches are active year-round. Others, especially on the Canadian Prairies are hidden only through the warmer months.

In some cases there are connections to history with many caches related to old school vards. cemeteries and similar

locations. Often information of the locales is included on the geocaching site.

While geocaching seems to be pretty widely based, there are some rules.

Caches are not supposed to be buried underground making access too hard, as an example.

Heritage Walking Tour

Often the history of a community can only be found in a dusty book and by looking at faded photos; but the history of Yorkton is alive and well in the form of a self-guided walking tour. The tour begins at the Godfrey Dean Cultural Centre on Smith Street and ends at 29 Myrtle Avenue. If you proceed at a leisurely pace, the walk will take about an hour and a half. City Cemetery Walking Tour

A self-guided walking tour of the City of Yorkton Cemetery gives visitors a chance to experience the unique history of the area. It guides visitors along the pathways of this beautifully treed 10.5 acres. The book, containing 28 grave sites can be purchased for \$3.00 at City Hall. The complete tour will take about one hour and a half, but can be shortened to the individual's liking. Stroll at your leisure, as you follow the trail outlined on the book's map. There are benches at various locations in the cemetery where a visitor can rest. On the tour you will learn about many of the early pioneers, and some of the more contemporary figures of Yorkton and area. revealing much of the region's history. The Ravine Ecological Preserve

The Ravine Ecological Preserve offers a diverse 2.8 km hiking trail, which includes a floating boardwalk across the marsh, and then works its way through grassland, and aspen parkland habitat. Located on the west side of the city, just past the Gallagher Centre, the park is designed to allow for people to connect with

our natural world through an abundance of birds, plants and animals. The Preserve is an approximate 80-acre natural park space, which includes a walking/hiking trail that winds through rolling grasslands and aquatic and aspen parkland habitats. The Preserve is also home to the Dulmage Farmstead, a municipal heritage



site of a local farmer, inventory, and entrepreneur. The area also includes an arboretum of various Parkland species, and a peace grove of planted trees. Connecting with nature is easy at the Ravine Ecological Preserve.

Yorkton boasts one of the premier outdoor skateboard parks in the province. It is an ideal place to show off skills in a sport with a growing base and increased recognition of what it takes to be great at the activity. The park, situated right off Broadway Street, is part of the Brodie Recreation Corridor which includes a paved walking path, and connects

Yorkton has become a destination hub for those interested in the sport of dis golf.

"We truly are fortunate in this area to have a number of excellent courses within an easy 90-minute drive of Yorkton," offered Trevor Lyons a spokesperson with the Parkland Association of Disc Golf.

The 90-minute drive radius also happens to be the area the PADG serves, promoting the sport to local authorities, organizing tournaments and helping the sport grow.

"It seemed a reasonable area to represent when the Association was organized. Yorkton sort of acts as a hub and the courses we try to promote are great for day trips. You can get out, play, and be back for supper, and still tackle some fun courses," said Calvin Daniels, founding, and now past president with the PADG.

For tourists it's a great situation. They can stop in Yorkton and take on the local courses, then stay over and explore the region's courses. "Here in Yorkton we are really fortunate," said Lyons. "The original nine basket course at Patrick Park is beautifully treed, which creates challenges, but is also very beginner friendly. "The second nine added most recently at

Golfers can also take on the alternate tees at Patrick Park for a greater challenge too. From there you can head out of the City on most of the highways and explore courses in

pavement," said Lyons, who along with Daniels had his hand in designing several of the courses. So what courses should disc golfers head to from Yorkton?

"Over time play them all," suggested Lyons adding, "there really are some fun features on any course you find."

If you head east on Highway #16 there are courses every few miles.

"Bredenbury has a really nice course. It's a tonal course, not baskets, but has some real challenges including a tunnel shot off the first tee, and it's a bit different as a 12 rather than the usual nine or 18 (target) course," said Daniels.

"Churchbridge is a 12 basket course that has lots of trees, and a tunnel shot off tee three," added Lyons.

Then just south of Yorkton there is a course at Carlton Trail Regional Park.

"If you want a little longer drive cross the border and check out the great course at Asessippi Beach and Campground north of Russell too. It really is a gem of a course," said Daniels.

If you head west on #16 there is a short, but treed 18 hidden away in a park in the northwest corner of Springside, and a bit farther along #16 there is a long 18 at Whitesand Regional Park near Theodore.

Highway #9 North will lead disc golfers to a range of courses.

Around Good Spirit Lake are courses at the provincial park, at Burgis Beach and at Sandy Beach.

"It's a pretty nice mini-tour around the lake," said Lyons.

Another turn and you can connect to a fun course at Benito, Man., then at Duck Mountain Provincial Park.

"And don't forget Kamsack, that is one of the best courses in terms of the variety of shots needed," said Daniels, adding, "the tunnel shot in number nine is a bear."

Another option is a bit of a swing west to hit a new course in Sturgis, or find your way to Kelvington to take on that basket course. Finally, there are options south from Yorkton too. "There is a very challenging course on cross country ski trails near Rocanville," said Lyons. "The course at Stockholm is a personal favourite," added Daniels.

Then there is an 18 basket course at Melville. "The course really is a fine one with lots of trees and a variety of shots needed," said Lyons. A bit farther south you can access courses in Balcarres, Lemberg, and Fort Qu'Appelle. "So make sure to book a few days to stay in Yorkton, pack your golf discs and explore the courses. We really think we have the best in the province in the east central area," said Lyons.

Motocross Racing

Few sport events are more thrilling than motocross. In Yorkton, that means a trip to the Millstone Park Raceway which has been operated by the Yorkton Motorcycle Club since 1995. Named the Sask Motocross Track of the Year multiple times, the raceway is located two km north of Yorkton on the #9 highway next to Millstone Park, the original site of Yorkton. The track is open daily for riders of all ages and abilities to sharpen racing and off-road handling skills. Daily and yearly riding passes are available for non-members Monday to Saturday at Schrader Motors during normal business hours. Parental accompaniment is required for riders under 18 years of age. A smaller, entry-level track is available for beginning riders plus group and private lessons are offered by some of the club's experienced members (check the Facebook page for details). "One of the very unique things about motocross is that racers of all ages, genders and abilities compete on the same day on the same track," said local sport spokesperson Rick Bradshaw. "With so many different classes to group riders by ability and ages, there are very few if any sports where an entire family compete on the same day. New spectators are often surprised by the ability of a rider only to discover they

are a 12-year-old girl then watch as two 50-year-old men bang bars and battle back and forth with the stamina of men half their ages. 


