

General Park Rules

NWPPRD Resolution 2021-04

The following rules apply to all areas of the park:

- Speed limit in the park is 10 mph.
- Park is open 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily.
- No after hour use allowed.
- No overnight parking or camping.
- No discharge of fireworks or firearms.
- No fires or flammable materials, including grills or open flames, unless part of a permitted event.
- No dumping.
- No dog off-leash except in designated areas.
- No glass containers.
- Special equipment and/or temporary structures must receive prior approval and be in conjunction with a rental agreement.
- No solicitation, fundraising, distributing information or conducting unauthorized business.
- No littering or polluting.
- No motorized or remote controlled planes, drones helicopters and/or model rockets.
- No un-approved amplified sound and personal audio.
- No tobacco, alcohol, and/or drug use on NWPPRD properties.
- Dog waste must be cleaned up immediately, placed in bags, and disposed of in the receptacles provided.
- Owners or custodians of a dog can be legally liable for the acts and conduct of the dog within the park.
- Dogs, owners, and park users creating a disturbance or violating rules must immediately leave the park if/when requested by law enforcement and/or District personnel.
- Failure to comply can result in being asked to leave the park and/or be suspended or banned from using the park in the future.



Off Leash Area Rules

The following rules are specifically for the off-leash dog area within the park:

- No food is allowed in the off-leash area.
- Items located in the off-leash area including, but not limited to toys, tools, or
 equipment are for the use of all guests. Please do not remove anything you did not
 bring into the off-leash area.
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- There is no limit to number of dogs permitted per dog handler; however, reasonable management of dogs is required.
- The District reserves the right to limit the number of dogs any one person can bring into the off leash area.
- Make sure gates are always closed behind you.
- Dogs must be leashed when entering and exiting the park.
- Dogs handlers must be present in the off-leash area, in sight, and always maintain voice command of the dog(s) in their care.
- No chain collars.
- Aggressive dogs are not allowed in the off-leash area.
- For the safety of all dogs, immediately leash your dog if it exhibits aggressive or anti-social behavior and then leave the off-leash area.
- Dogs may not be groomed within the park. Professional dog trainers and/or groomers
 are not permitted to conduct business on park grounds.
- Dogs in heat and puppies under four (4) months and dogs without full vaccination are not permitted.
- Entry into the off-leash area constitutes your voluntary consent to assume all risks and dangers - including injury to persons or dogs that may occur.
- Any dog designated as legally "dangerous" in the State of Washington is prohibited from using the park.
- In Island County, it is unlawful to have possession or custody of, or to harbor or give shelter/refuge to, any dog without valid dog license and without having conspicuously displayed, on a strap or other device place on the dog, and authorized identification tag issued by Island County or another jurisdiction. (Island County Code 6.08.020)
- In Island County, it is unlawful to refuse to show or exhibit to any
 law enforcement officer or Island County official in charge of dog licensing any dog in
 one's possession, custody, or control any dog license or dog identification tag issued
- It is unlawful to intentionally abandon a dog, cat, or other animal within the limits of Island County.
- Use of off-leash area is at your own risk. Entry constitutes your release and discharge
 of the NWPPRD from all claims, actions, liabilities, and damage arising from injuries
 to persons or dogs, including claims resulting from any actual or claimed negligent
 acts or omissions, active or passive, by the NWPPRD commissioners, employees,
 volunteers, or agents.
