Hurricane Season is June 1-November 30 Essential Supplies & Shelter Options Emergency Preparation

- ✓ **MPH, Inc. Recreation Hall is Not a Hurricane or Tornado Approved Building!**
- ✓ **Whether you shelter in place or go to another location, you need a plan.**
- ✓ **Never assume you will be able to return to your home by the next morning!**
- ✓ **If your home is damaged, you may need alternate lodging.**

Pinellas County Emergency Management recommends that you keep the following items in a "Ready to Go Kit" in case you need them on a moment's notice.

- Medications and copies of prescriptions. Ask your pharmacist for a printout.
- Important documents (Take photos of your documents with your phone for backup).
- Place important papers together in a sealed plastic bag. Include:
- **Driver's license or ID card, Passport, Social Security Card, Immunization Cards, Insurance Documents, Power of Attorney, Healthcare Proxy. Bank Account Information, Property Titles – Home and Vehicle.**
- Rain gear and flashlight or lantern
- Battery-operated radio and extra Batteries
- Extra batteries for medical devices such as hearing aids
- Inflatable mattress and sleeping bag or bedding
- Eyeglasses, hearing aids and extra batteries or charger
- Ear plugs & Eye mask for sleeping
- Sunscreen

Food and Water

- Water: At least one gallon of water per person per day for drinking
- An additional one gallon per person per day for hygiene and cooking
- One-week supply of nonperishable food that does not require cooking.
- For example: dried fruit, canned tuna fish, canned chicken
- (Buy canned foods with pop tops for ease of access)
- Pouches of tuna & salmon, pre-cooked seasoned rice in pouches, peanut butter, bread, etc. Remember snacks and comfort foods.
- Non-electric can opener and sealable plastic storage bags
- Paper plates, plastic cups and utensils

Hygiene

- Antibacterial wipes, hand sanitizer
- Hand and shower soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste
- Toilet paper, disposable washcloths, paper towels & hand towels, diapers.
- Water for bathing – Enough for each family member.
- Change of clothes

First Aid Supplies:

- Over-the-counter pain reliever, bandages, anti-itch and antibiotic creams/ointments, antihistamines
- Alcohol pads, Anti-diarrhea medicine, laxative, antihistamines, insect repellent

Other:

- Full tank of gas in vehicle
- Cell phone with charger, extra battery backup, solar charger
- Emergency contacts in mobile device and in print for backup
- Information downloaded to your mobile phone (contacts, maps)
- Extra bottled oxygen if needed
- Cash for when ATMs are out of service. Small bills will make purchasing easier
- A paper map, paper and pencils, books, cards, board games for entertainment
- Basic Supplies for Pets – Enough pet food and water for two weeks
- Identification/chip (remember to update), Toys/blanket
- License & Immunization records, Current photo of your pet
- **Collar and leash, carrier/crate, cat litter, pan, scoop, disinfectant**
- Unless you have a registered service animal, all animals must be leashed or crated
- Medications for two weeks with instructions,
- Plastic waste bags, Paper towels, Newspaper or other lining

NOTICE: Pet Owners Who Choose A “Pet Friendly” Public Shelter!

Pets Will Be Placed in A Separate Area of The Shelter and Not Allowed to Stay with their Owner. Owners may be Allowed to Feed and Walk their Pets.

Special Needs Residents: If You Have a **Registered Service Dog** that Assists You with Tasks, the Dog will be Allowed to Remain with You

Additional Documents to Include

- **Medical records:** Pharmacy prescription record, doctors, medications, dosages, blood type
- Insurance policies for home, health, flood, auto, renters
- Titles to house, cars and boats
- Household inventory for insurance claims: Photo or video documentation stored electronically
- Other irreplaceable papers: birth, marriage, divorce, death and adoption certificates; passports; military records; wills; trust documents
- Account numbers for bank, credit cards, savings and investments

Supplies to Add If You Go to a Host Home or Hotel

In addition to basic supplies: **Check with Host for Needed Supplies**

- Pillow and blankets
- Air mattress, sleeping bag, floor mat or other as needed
- Food and water. Find out from the host what you can bring, including the perishable food you might have.
- Paper plates, plastic cups and utensils
- Complete change of clothing for several days

Public Shelter – General In addition to basic supplies:

- Wearable medical alert tag
- Blanket, pillow, cot, folding chair or twin-size air mattress
- Complete change of clothing for several days
- Special dietary items (sugar-free, low sodium, gluten-free, etc.)
- **Basic food and water are supplied.**
- Flashlight, Battery-powered fan, Battery-powered radio
- Ear plugs & Eye mask for sleeping

Public Shelter – Special Needs – Individuals with special needs are urged to register with Pinellas County. If you qualify, transportation will be provided to a shelter in emergencies. You must register! Request a form be mailed to you or complete the form on the County website. Call Pinellas County Emergency Management at (727) 464-3800.

Any durable medical equipment or supplies you may need such as:

- Portable oxygen, Oxygen concentrator, Nebulizer
- Wheelchair, walker or cane
- Medications in the original container (two-week supply)

Severe Weather Supplies & Shelter Options

- Blanket, pillow, cot, folding chair or air mattress. (Available cots in shelters are limited)
- Complete change of clothing for several days

Personal hygiene: Toothbrush/toothpaste, antibacterial wipes, soap, shampoo, hairbrush, adult diapers

- Earplugs, headphones, sleep mask
- Written instructions or orders regarding your care
- Pet emergency kit. Pets will not be staying with you unless they are **registered service animals that assist you with tasks.**

A Kit for Home: Supplies to Add If You Stay (or When You Return)

- Two weeks of fluids to drink and nonperishable food that does not require cooking. For example: dried fruit, canned tuna fish, peanut butter, etc. Remember comfort foods.
- Paper plates, plastic cups and utensils
- Cooler with ice. Make extra ice in plastic bags and plastic food storage containers, and keep those in the freezer to keep food cold longer.
- Insect repellent
- Sunscreen
- Tarps with rope or elastic cord
- Whistle to signal for help
- Tools: Wrench to shut off water; utility knife for sheeting; and duct tape, hammer and nails to make temporary repairs
- Dust mask
- Sheets of plastic and duct tape to seal windows and doors if ordered to do so
- Matches or lighter in waterproof container
- Large garbage bags
- Portable toilet: Use one from a boat or camper, or make one using a five-gallon bucket with lid, trash bags, chlorine bleach.
- Household chlorine bleach with medicine dropper to disinfect or treat water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleach with added cleaners.
- Extra gas for a generator and somewhere safe to store it
- Extra propane or charcoal for outdoor grill
- Battery-powered fan
- Camera to take photos/video of damage
- Disinfectant to prevent mold

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
