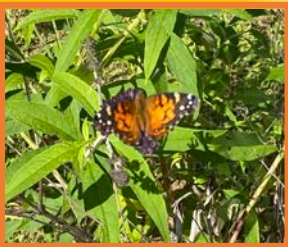

A Message from Club President Lion Kathy Lamb

As the 2023-2024 year comes to a close, the Booneville Lions Club is proud to look back on a year filled with service, community, and camaraderie. From fundraising events to volunteer projects, our club has been dedicated to making a positive impact on our community.

Highlights from the Year: The Booneville Leo Club was chartered in October and the charter ceremony was held in January with Governor Amanda Harrison performing the ceremony.

In the late summer, our club planted a butterfly garden as an ecology project for the community. It will be an ongoing project with us maintaining and improving the garden.

In September the Booneville Lions club spearheaded the first Celebrate Community joining with the Kiwanis Club, the Rotary Club, and the Civitan Club to better understand how we could join together to serve our community. We met with Lori Tucker, Director of Booneville Main Street Association.

We built our first Christmas float in many years to the theme of "Frosty's Winter Wonderland" and took home the first-place prize in the non-profit category.

We received a \$1,500 grant from Propel to be used toward purchasing glasses for children and adults who otherwise couldn't afford them.

We donated \$1,500 to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), \$500 Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation, \$500 to Mississippi Lions Sight Foundation, \$500 to adopt a puppy from Leader Dogs and provided \$2,000 of glasses and exams to children and adults. We donated \$100 to the Mississippi Lions All-State Band 4th Meal,

The Booneville Lions Club achieved the Mission 1.5 Premier Club Award by achieving 100% retention and 10% growth.

Booneville Lions achieved the Club Excellence Award for another year along with the Member Satisfaction Award for 2023-2024.

Four members of our club attended the Tennessee Lions Leadership Institute (TLLI) in Lebanon, TN where each learned advanced leadership skills.

Last but certainly not least, we have increased our membership exponentially to the point of

needing only five more members to have doubled our membership to earn the Mission 1.5 Platinum Club Award by June 30, 2024.

More important than earning an award for increased membership, is the fact that adding more members increases our diversity. This enables our club to be able to provide more service to our community.

With a new Lions year, our club will have new leadership and exciting new opportunities. It has been my honor to serve as the president of the Booneville Lions Club for the past two years. The new officers will assume their respective offices on July 1, 2024. Please get involved with the committee of your choice and interest. The incoming officers need your wholehearted support!

TWO RECEIVE MELVIN JONES FELLOWSHIP AWARDS

Her classmates at Radcliffe University in Massachusetts purchased it for her after the dog became attached to Keller during a class trip to a kennel, and he was her constant companion throughout her college years.

JUNE 1st IS HELEN KELLER DAY

Born in Tuscumbia, Alabama in 1880, Helen Keller developed a fever at 18 months of age that left her blind and deaf.

With the help of an exceptional teacher, Anne Mansfield Sullivan of the Perkins School for the Blind, Helen Keller learned sign language and braille. A few years later, she learned to speak.

As an adult she became a tireless advocate for people with disabilities. In 1925, she attended the Lions Club International Convention and challenged Lions to "become knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness."

The Lions accepted her challenge and our work ever since has included sight programs aimed at preventable blindness.

In 1971, the Board of Directors of Lions Clubs International declared that June 1 would be remembered as Helen Keller Day. Lions around the world implement sight-related service projects on Helen Keller Day.

If you would like to hear Helen Keller's speech you can find it on YouTube by searching Helen Keller's speech at 1925 International Convention. It was at Cedar Point, Ohio on June 30, 1925 on the shores of Lake Erie.

Both Hayley Brooke and Sarah Kate can be dual members of Leos and Lions. In October, the girls will become the club's first Leo-Lions.

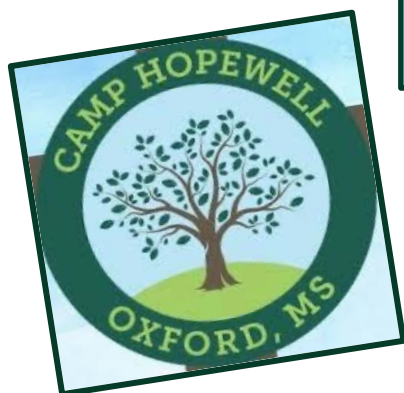
Both girls are going to be students at Northeast this fall.

Keep Destiny's Legacy Alive

Lion Destiny has been a lion all her life. While she did not march in the Parade of Nations at Lions Con 1995 Phoenix or Lions Con 1997 Montreal, Destiny traded Lions pins with every Lion she saw holding a pin in his hand! By the time Lions Conv 1998 Philadelphia rolled around, she was right there marching with Mississippi Lions behind our All State Band and the incoming IP, Judge Howard L. "Pat" Patterson from Hattiesburg.

In 2013 at 30M Mid-Winter, Destiny listened intently as ID Carolyn Messier of Connecticut spoke about the tragic Shady Hook Elementary School shooting where 20 children between the ages 6 and 7 died and the work Lions of Connecticut were planning for the surviving children to cope with loss and horror. Destiny decided for her personal potholder project she would give the money to Lions MD23 support the program.

At the earliest age possible, Destiny joined the Clarksdale Sunset Lions Club. She also served 30M as Leader Dog Chair 2015-16, visiting the school in Rochester Michigan. Then she got her big break, she was elected to MD30 Diabetes Awareness Committee.
