St. Benedict & Anonymous Servanthood!

To begin, I want to thank ALL those who planned, supported, carried out and participated in the Memorial/Training event. Recognizing the 40th year of Alabama Emmaus was wonderful. The birthday party theme added to the feeling of joy and celebration as we heard from special speakers, learned how we can better serve on Emmaus teams and, of course, shared snacks and meals together.

As an Oblate of St. Benedict, I periodically read through his "little rule" for life. For me, the Benedictine vows of Stability, Faithfulness and Obedience are core to the spiritual journey. In Chapter 7, Benedict names 12 "steps" or facets of humility and points out behavior that can be an obstacle to that facet. I cannot think of these vows or read this chapter without thinking of Emmaus and our call to anonymous servanthood.

Anonymous means "with no name known or acknowledged." Humility means "absence of pride or self-assertion." Are you making a connection? In her commentary on Benedict's rule, Joan Chittister says humility is the "basis for right relationships in life."

We are given a perfect example of these characteristics in Luke 7:36-38. A woman "brought an alabaster jar of perfume, and as she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them." This woman offered Jesus radical hospitality. We are to offer the Pilgrims radical hospitality. The name of this woman is unknown but her actions have been recorded for all time. Our names may remain unknown and Pilgrims may never see (Please See Shotts Page 2.)

our faces, but our willingness to be conduits of Jesus' love to them will remain with them the rest of their lives.

Pages 21-25 of the Upper Room Walk to Emmaus Team Manual addresses Team Formation. If you plan to serve on a Walk for the first time or for the 50th time, I invite you to read these pages. Email me (marydshotts@gmail.com) and I'll be glad to share them with you. There is valuable information for EVERY team member on Spiritual Formation; Team Conduct; Obstacles to Service; Discipline; and Obedience and Servanthood. In these pages, I hear a call to stability, faithfulness, obedience and humility.

The main obstacle to service that is discussed is "egos getting in the way." Can this be because we haven't internalized the "12 steps" of humility that Benedict recognized? As I read through this section, here are just a few questions that came to my mind and I invite you to ponder them with me:

Do I call attention to the service and sacrifice of others, thus making the Pilgrims feel they are expected to feel gratitude toward us? Do I have a personal need for recognition? OR, do I allow the Holy Spirit to lead Pilgrims to an awareness of service, sacrifice and gratitude?

Do I talk more than I listen? Do I unconsciously or even intentionally try to direct Pilgrim responses to various aspects of the weekend.

Do I instigate applause or recognition for speakers, music leaders, or other team members, thus calling attention to the person (people) rather than the message they share as they speak or serve? OR, do I allow affirmation for the speakers and others to begin with the Pilgrims.

There's a lot of I in these questions. Egos are tricky things so let us all meditate on our own state of humility and how we engage in anonymous servanthood. I trust God will help us become even better servants on Walks to come.

In its June meeting, the Alabama Emmaus Community Board voted to add the following reminders to the guidelines of every Team Committee:


