-Isaiah 9:2

There is no real basis for us to believe that Jesus was born on December 25th. There are a lot of explanations for how we came to celebrate Jesus' birth on a day that we do, but I will not get into them here. However, the fact of the matter is that Jesus was likely born in the fall, not in the depths of winter.

That said, I have always found it so beautifully appropriate that we celebrate

Every day of Advent is a shorter day than the one before it until we reach the shortest day of the year on December 21st, winter solstice. We are, quite simply, plunged deeper and deeper into darkness this time of year.

In this darkness, the light of Christmas shines even brighter. We put lights on our houses and on our trees, We place candles on our mantles, and light fires in our fireplaces. The light of the coming of Christ shines brightly in the darkness, no matter how long the nights.

After the winter solstice, just a few short days before Christmas, the nights get shorter, the days get longer, and we begin to emerge from the darkness--just as we celebrate Christ's birth.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. John 1:1-5

May we--Emmaus people, church people, Christmas and Easter people--be active bearers of the Light, not just this Advent and Christmas season, but in all of our Fourth Days, wherever they may take us, in the year to come.
