#### **SPONSORSHIP 101**

So many things have changed this year. WOW! Is that an understatement!?! It is all one can do to keep up. not only with absorbing the revisions, but keeping the information itself revised! As most know, the last eight Walks of 2020 were moved over into 2021. At this point, Camp Sumatanga plans to open with the new year. All the changes include a new Camp Board of Trustees, a new Camp Director, and the request of the Camp that all Emmaus Walks be held at the McKinney-Atkins/Retreat Centers. Every part of the Walks will be there except Candlelight, which will still be held in Hutto Auditorium. The

(Sponsorship con't.) first Walk, which is #494, is scheduled for Feb. 4-7. With the move to smaller facilities, the AEC Board of Directors has reduced the maximum number of Pilgrims per Walk to 21. In an historic move on Oct. 24. the Board reduced the number of pieces of agape requested from 80 to 60. So, keeping up can be a moment by moment thing. The Sponsor Letter is also being revised to reflect these changes, so be sure to read yours carefully when you receive it. You will need to know all this to be able to guide your Pilgrims accordingly.
