January 2020 Chaplain's Corner



Another new year -2020! There was a time in my life when this date seemed so far in the future. Isn't It amazing how those dates start to pile up and the years fly by? 

HOPE CENTER HOUSTON -Karen Doolittle

CDA Court #2731 began the expansion of our Hope Center Houston (HCH) Ministry by opening the center on the third Saturday of

the month serving a light breakfast and lunch. We have four Third Saturday's under our belt and our Sisters and participating Parishioners enjoyed the experience as did the guests that came. In December we served 21 guests out of 40 that signed up! The last weekend in December 28 guests were served, the highest Saturday to date. During the week the number of guests has increased and they are serving over 50 guests and sometimes over 60 guests per day so there is a need for weekday volunteers as well.



SANDWICH



What does the expansion of this ministry mean? We open HCH on the THIRD Saturday of each month to make and serve lunch and also to serve a light breakfast. HCH is open from 10:30 to 1:30. We arrive at 9:45 and are finished and leaving before 2:00.

What is served? Breakfast is a breakfast taco consisting of chopped hard boiled eggs on a warmed white corn tortilla topped with warm bacon bits and warm salsa, mandarin oranges and bananas. If there are pastries leftover from a previous day those are also served. Lunch is a sandwich of turkey and cheese on honey wheat bread accompanied by sliced tomatoes, romaine leaves, pickle chunks, mustard

packets and mayo cups. Oranges and bananas along with cookies or cupcakes if left over from the previous day.

How do you get involved? The first step is to complete the Texas Food Handler Course, pass the final exam and leave a copy of your Certificate in the CDA box at CGS and let Karen Doolittle know it is there.

How long will the course take? Allow 2-3 hours from start to finish, although you can pause the course at any time and come back later. You can also go back over sections, but you cannot pause the Final Exam!

Other requirements? Yes, you must wear a hat or hairnet and apron the entire time you are in the kitchen. Wear disposable gloves which we provide and directions will be given when you come to HCH.

Mary Jane's Travels:

We started off on our 3 week journey by going to Macau for a golf tournament. My husband, T. Wayne, had to defend his title, and I had to work at the tournament. After that we took a ferry over to Shekou, China, where we used to live. We have many friends there, and one lesson we learned from living in different places in the world, is that **most** people are the same. They want the same things we do, to live in peace, have a family, and be the best they can for their family. We lived in China for 5 ½ years and developed many relationships with the Chinese people. They've always been super kind to us and we return that kindness.

Faye was my maid for 5 ½ years and she is like a daughter to me now. Many of you met her when we brought her here to visit. She will always be a part of our family.

Fr. Adam lived in Hong Kong for many years, wrote many books, and traveled around the Far East reaching and teaching special needs children in the summer. He loved all the children he connected with. He came to Shekou every other week to celebrate Mass for us in a school room. This picture is in his apartment in Hong Kong when we went to visit him. He found out that Maryknoll was calling him back to the "Mother House" in New York...and he was not happy about that. He said he had many more children to teach and he still had the energy to do it, at age 91. He's right, we had trouble keeping up with him when he walked. He did have to go back to New York in December, with a little grumbling.



He asked us to bring all the certificates back to Cheryl, so she would have them in case anyone needed them, which we all do at some point in our lives. He was preparing to leave after so long in Hong Kong and China.

My Favorite person "of the street", Lijuan.

Lijuan is disabled and has been on the streets since we lived there. She has a disabled husband who cannot get out anymore, and several older children. We've talked to her son on the phone. She does have a collection basket, but never asks for anything. She saw my crucifix and said "Jesu". She is a Christian. We have prayed together and laughed together. We always try to sneak money to her, because her "handlers" take most of what she gets. They drop her off and they pick her up to go home at night.

Faye and Kun picked us up at our apartment at 6am to take us to the ferry terminal. We are ready to go to the Hong Kong Airport and fly to Japan. We have tearful goodbyes, but we know we'll see each other again.

We had hoped to get into the Mass, but all tickets was passed out to the Japan Dioceses and they had long waiting lists. We didn't get in but we did see his car pull into the Dome.

Since we couldn't get into the Dome, we thought it would be on the BIG Screen. It wasn't, so we found a group of Philippine ladies who were sitting on the pavement in front of the Dome, and live streaming the Mass on the local phones. They let me take videos and pictures of their "phone live stream". It 10 wasn't up close and personal but It worked for us.

What we learned in Japan is that the people are so organized. They don't push to get in line early. They stand single file and stand on one side of an escalator so others can pass. They are very polite, and bow every time they greet you or serve you in some way. Even on the trains (the BEST way to travel in Japan), the conductor would turn around and bow before he left a car. We were impressed with the Japanese people and their culture. Also impressive is how modernized they are. They are ahead of us in many ways.

God blessed us with a good snow fall while we were in the Chapel. It was beautiful. Going to Our Lady of Akita was a highlight of our trip.
















National Shrine of the Little Flower in Detroit.





MONDAY, JUNE 1

We meet as a group at Houston Intercontinental Airport (IAH) and check-in for our group flight that will take us to the Munich Airport in Germany.

TUESDAY, JUNE 2

A state of the art luxury coach will transport us from the Munich International Airport to Hotel Gablerbrau, which is our hotel in Salzburg, Austria. The hotel is conveniently located across the river from the historic old town of Salzburg. Enjoy the sights at your leisure. Try to stay awake until your 'regular' bedtime to minimize effects of jet lag.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 3

Make sure to enjoy a full breakfast buffet which is included in your trip package. Consider a nice stroll through Salzburg before a light lunch. At 9 AM we gather at the Salzburg Cathedral where Mozart served as music director. We celebrate mass and conclude with a brief concert, sung by our choir. The afternoon will be at your leisure, but we gather at 6 PM in our Hotel restaurant to enjoy and celebrate the day with drinks and a group dinner. [B, D]

THURSDAY, JUNE 4

After breakfast, we depart at 830 AM on our coach to Hellbrunn Castle where we will have two hours to enjoy the castle tour and grounds. We will also travel to the picturesque Königssee and see the idyllic setting of St. Bartholomew's Church. This excursion will return to the hotel at 3 PM. 




Abortion rate drops lower than any time since 1973 Roe v. Wade decision

TRENDS IN ABORTION

The number of U.S. women having abortions has dropped to its lowest point since abortion was legalized in 1973.

The abortion rate has been steadily decreasing in recent years and was 13.5 per 1,000 women of childbearing age in 2017. This rate is less than half what it was in 1980 when the highest rate was 29.3.

More than 860,000 children were aborted in 2017. We continue to pray and work to end abortion.

Bishops condemn Equality Act to erase all legally protected sexual differences

The United States House of Representatives passed the Equality Act last spring. The bill is awaiting a vote in the Senate. Many Catholic bishops have expressed alarm against it.

Call or email your U.S. Senators urging them to vote no on the Equality Act (S. 788). The Act would add the new terms "sexual orientation" and "gender identity," as well as "pregnancy...or a related medical condition," to the definition of "sex" in federal civil rights laws. Laws and rules concerning rape, assault, adoption, school bathrooms and competitive sports would all be upended.

"The Equality Act," said the Family Policy Alliance, "is at once the most dangerous piece of legislation we've seen in Congress. It threatens parental rights, including how parents make healthcare and education decisions for their children. It even threatens parental custody over their own children. The Equality Act puts the LGBT agenda ahead of constitutional religious freedom rights, forces LGBT curriculum and policies into schools (likely both private and public), and equates the Black Civil Rights movement with the LGBT agenda."

Support Dignity for Aborted Children

When Indiana abortionist Ulrich "George" Klopfer died in September, his family found 2,246 preserved fetal remains on his Illinois property. In response, Indiana's U.S. Senators have introduced a bill ensuring dignity for the remains of unborn children.

Call or email your U.S. Senators urging them to vote yes on the Dignity for Aborted Children Act (S. 2590)

After an abortion, the unborn child's body is often treated like common medical waste. This act would ensure that women seeking an abortion would be given the option of keeping the remains or giving the abortion facility permission to dispose of the remains. Abortionists would be required to provide burial or cremation of the remains or face a fine and up to five years in prison.

"Regardless of their stance on the issue of abortion, Americans from all walks of life were appalled to discover how children who are aborted are treated after death," said a spokesperson for National Right to Life.

<u>Psychiatrist speaks on child sex</u> <u>change surgery: Many will regret this</u>

In September Maria Lencki, a student at Franciscan University of Steubenville, interviewed prominent Johns Hopkins psychiatrist Paul McHugh. Here are excerpts:

"A psychiatrist from Johns Hopkins University has slammed the medical and psychiatric industries for what he says is reckless and irresponsible treatment of patients who claim to be transgender.

"Paul McHugh, a renowned psychiatrist from Johns Hopkins University, told *The College Fix* he believes transgender people are being experimented on because the doctors treating transgender patients with hormones "don't have evidence that (the treatment) will be the right one." He also criticized the manner of treatment given to many children who claim to be transgender.

"'Many people are doing what amounts to an experiment on these young people without telling them it's an experiment," he told *The Fix* via phone."


... "Asked about the possible long-term consequences of the growing practice of helping children develop transgender identities, including with hormones, McHugh expressed pessimism.

"They're going to be in the hands of doctors for the rest of their lives, many of them are going to be sterilized, not able to have their own children, and many will regret this," McHugh said.

"'Can you imagine having a life where you need to seek doctors all the time, for everything, just to live? Getting your hormones checked, getting everything checked. That is something doctors should like to spare people of," he added.

"McHugh thinks that eventually our society will look back on this craze as something of an historical shame. "I believe it will be something like how we think of eugenics now. We will come to regret it when we discover how many of the young people that were injured regret it themselves." Taken from: TheCollegeFix.com
