Be Bold. Be Ready.

My Dear Sisters in Christ Jesus, the peace and love of the King of kings and the Lord of lords be always with you.

One of my favorite scripture passages is the story of the walking on the water found in Matthew, Mark and Johns' gospels. Jesus, as He often did, went off by Himself to pray. The apostles went across the Sea of Galilee in a boat. In the early morning Jesus finished His praying and walked across the Sea of Galilee to get to the other side. The disciples were terrified when they saw Jesus walking near the boat. In a bold move, Peter asked Jesus if he could walk on the water also. Jesus told him to come, and Peter started walking on the water. When Peter noticed the strong wind he began to fear and started to sink. And as is always the case, Jesus is right there to save him. He draws him into the boat and the storm ceases.

When we try to serve God we sometimes experience strong winds against us. There is a certain boldness in Peter's actions. When God is asking us to do something, we need the boldness to "just do it." We do it even if it does not make any sense. The Holy Spirit often moves us in ways that do not appear to be logical. They do not seem to be logical, but, in reality, they are part of a grand plan working in our lives to bear some kind of good fruit for other people or ourselves.

People are hungry, hungry for Almighty God, hungry just to know Someone is always there. They are hungry for human companionship. Their deepest hunger is for divine companionship, although many do not know this. Let us remember that we are ambassadors for Christ (2 Cor 5:20). By your baptism, you are an adopted daughter of God. I am an adopted son of God. Let us do spiritual and corporal works of mercy. The world needs us to be other Christs. Recognize the voice of one near you who is crying out for the love of God. Who is it?

And remember, God is your power. When you try to do good deeds remember, "The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it." (1 Thes 5:24) Let us be bold in helping others. Let us be listening enough to God so that when the Holy Spirit wants us to do something, we boldly try to do it, even if we are somewhat afraid.




A Message from Patrice Hampton, Financial Secretary

For those who were not present at the last meeting for the reading of the Thank You note from Sam's mother, it is attached below. May we continue to be inspired by this extraordinary woman!


A Message from Katherine Lee, Treasurer


🛮 A Message from Priscilla Hargraves, Past Regent

Of course, the boys had virtual classes on their laptops in the dining room. (Where they could be monitored by Mom!) We were blessed to spend a week with them, talking, laughing, playing games, just being present to one another. If you've never been to Castle Rock, you need to plan a trip! It is a picturesque town south of Denver, at about 6200 feet elevation. A beautiful mountain range is visible from Gizelle's house. When it's dark, the lights of Denver are visible in the valley. When in town, you can see Pikes Peak, even though it is miles away. I love the mountains, and thankfully, we had sunshine and 70+ degree weather while we were there. 





Seeing Through Another's Eyes

There is a story of Gandhi that reveals how profound and daring his sense of compassion was. It occurred during one of his famous hunger strikes. A man whose daughter was killed came in anguish, saying to Gandhi that he would stop fighting if 'the great souled one' would eat. But Gandhi knew the healing was deeper than just stopping the violence, and so he told the man he would eat only when the tormented father embraced the man who killed his daughter.

It is said that the man collapsed in tears, but did as Gandhi asked, and the larger conflict ended. This is an enormous thing to ask of someone in grief, of someone who has been violated. But beyond the vast courage needed to incorporate this kind of love into our daily lives, Gandhi's request reveals the irrefutable wisdom that only when the broken are healed, no matter what they have done, will we as a people heal.

It is hard to comprehend how this works, yet the mystery of true forgiveness waits in letting go of our ledgers of injustice and retribution in order to regain the feeling in our heart. And so, I am forced to look into my own small life, into my own small and all-consuming pains, and ask, Who am I? Why can't I forgive the wrongs done me? Why can't I, more than forgive, and begin to trust again?





On the Moral Permissibility of Recently Announced Vaccines for COVID-19

On December 2nd Governor Abbott announced that the federal government will be distributing an initial allotment of approximately 1.4 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines in Texas during the month of December. These vaccines will be administered by qualifying providers throughout the state.

Some individuals and groups are publicly asserting that if a vaccine is connected in any way with tainted cell lines then it is immoral to be vaccinated with it. This is an inaccurate presentation of Catholic moral doctrine and I would like to offer some clarifications regarding the moral permissibility of using the COVID-19 vaccines developed by the companies Pfizer and Moderna.

Neither the Pfizer nor the Moderna vaccine involved the use of cell lines that originated in tissue taken from the body of an aborted baby at any level of design, development, or production. However, these vaccines are not completely free from any connection to abortion, as both Pfizer and Moderna made use of a tainted cell line for one of the confirmatory lab tests of their products. There is thus a connection, but it is relatively remote and should not be the basis for refusing to receive the vaccine.

A third possible vaccine, this one produced by AstraZeneca, is morally concerning because of its origins. However, according to Catholic moral teaching it is also acceptable to receive it for the sake of our own health and the health of others if it is the only vaccine available in a given place.

It is morally permissible to receive the COVID-19 vaccines which will be available for distribution in Texas beginning this month.

On this Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary we unite ourselves more closely to the intercession of the Mother of God as we pray for an end to the Coronavirus pandemic. Please be assured of my continued prayers for the clergy and lay faithful of the Church in Galveston-Houston.
