



Texas State Contest Winners:

All our members should be immensely proud of our court and all that we do! The way that is exemplified is in the State and National contests. Our court won in the following categories in the Texas Contest:

Quality of Life won 1st place, due to our ministry to the guests of Hope Center Houston. Every month, our court members get together and make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches and assemble manna bags with enough product to last 2 days. Before Covid 19, we were also providing a light breakfast and lunch every 3rd Saturday of the month. We started this service in August 2019. We are still making the manna bags, but currently are unable to provide this in-house service. Please be sure to read Karen Doolittle's article about this ministry.

Leadership won 2nd place, thanks to court members stepping up to lead various projects of the court. Projects lead by members were: a major presentation to the parish and surrounding faith communities; a retreat experience, opened up to all women of the parish, at a local monastery, meals for the homeless, making rosaries and delivering them to the Veterans' Hospital in Houston, a corporate Mass and luncheon for the district courts on CDA Sunday, honoring our veterans through the Wreaths Across America Campaign, accumulating and distributing many books to area Catholic schools, parishes and neighborhood libraries, and senior residential facilities and assisted living centers. One of the members not only hosted the "Our Lady of Fatima" statue in her home but also coordinated a public rosary in the parking lot of a major furniture store in Houston.

We have been publishing The Spirit, our court's newsletter for 3 years. It won 1st place this year in our category and has now won 1st place in State all 3 years! Thanks to all the contributions by the members! It is very important our members take a look at the newsletter, as it is a very good resource to spread the word about our court. Equally important is our website....



We are dedicated to leading others to Christ and to His service through active participation in the Catholic Daughters of the Americas."







National News

Our National Regent, Olga Samaniego, presented a tearful 'live' Facebook speech today regarding the 58th Biennial Convention in Dallas in July. Some of the highlights of her speech were: As of today, the convention is cancelled. Some reasons given were: Texas is still experiencing a surge in Covid cases; the Sheraton Hotel is not completely open and did not know when they would be; not enough delegates registered, only about 100 registered with 275 needed for a quorum; the National CDA office is not open yet, so there was not enough time to get everything together.

The Sheraton will be refunding all money received, as this cancellation will fall under Force Majeure in the contract.

This is the first time a National Convention has ever been cancelled, therefore the Executive board has sought advice from the national lawyer. It was decided each court will receive the number of ballots for the delegates elected in the mail, by June 10th. The ballots should be mailed back very quickly so the board can count the votes by mid-July. All State Regents will receive a letter of instructions.

The Executive board will also meet the first weekend of June to make decisions on various convention business topics and inform the State Courts of those decisions.
