#### WHAT CAN WE DO?????

- 1) Cut off their FOOD SUPPLY
- 2) Lay out RAT BAIT STATIONS
- 3) Barricade NESTING AREAS

## 1) Cut off their FOOD SUPPLY

- No birdfeeders -No littering -Pick up trash
- Monitor vegetable gardens & lay down a protective barrier like Repels-All or Critter Ridder
- Pick up dog poop as poop is a food source for some animals like RATS
- Secure your garbage bin(s) with a heavy brick or a bungee cord



## 2) Lay out RAT BAIT STATIONS

Rat bait stations are boxes that house rat poison. Rats go in the stations,

eat the poison & die later most likely in the sewer. Lay out 2-3 per house.

## WHERE TO GET RAT BAIT STATIONS???

1) **DO IT YOURSELF** - Go to a hardware store, purchase rat bait stations & bait

## 2) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CAN DO IT FOR YOU CALL 716-961-6800

- the home owner will start a "Service Request"
- the Dept of Health will come out & lay the baited stations for you
- the Dept of Health will also bait your garage

## - THIS IS A FREE SERVICE

\*\*To be effective, rat bait stations must always have poison in them so check them often.

\*\*The Department of Health will check & fill your bait stations as often as you ask.

3) Barricade NESTING AREAS - Block off openings under porches & decks
