A Message of Gratitude

Dear Partners and Supporters,

Because of your generous support, the 2026 Rural Ghana Missions successfully delivered life-changing medical care and spiritual hope to underserved communities across Ghana. Your contributions made it possible to reach hundreds of individuals with essential healthcare, uplift communities, and bring lasting transformation.

Mission Overview

In May 2026, RGM deployed volunteer teams to the **Upper West Region (Wa area)** and the **Central Region (Twifo-Praso area)**. Over two weeks, multidisciplinary teams—including healthcare professionals and ministry workers—carried out **health screening programs, educational outreach, and Gospel campaigns** in four rural communities.

Despite logistical challenges—including a serious road accident, vehicle breakdown and adverse weather—the mission moved forward with resilience and purpose.

Lives Reached

- **Total individuals served:** Over **1,800**
- **Adults screened:** ~565
- **Children/students screened:** ~870
- **Students receiving school supplies:** 400

Services Provided

- Blood pressure and blood sugar screenings
 - Eye and dental health checks
 - Deworming treatment and basic medical care
 - Counseling and health education
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Community Engagement

- Outreach conducted in **4 rural communities:** Tindoma, Poyetanga, Mbaabaasa, and Somnyamekodur
 - Teams of **11–12 volunteers per outreach**, including doctors, nurses, pharmacists, and support staff
 - Some communities recorded **over 50% population participation**
 - Programs ran full-day, demonstrating strong community interest and trust
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Spiritual Impact

The mission combined physical care with spiritual outreach through **evening Gospel campaigns**, often held in areas without electricity using generator-powered equipment.

Faith Outcomes

- **12 individuals baptized**
- New believers included **3 former Muslims and 2 traditional shrine priests**
- Some converts received English Bibles (local language bibles needed urgently)

Church Growth

- Sunday worship attendance **increased up to threefold** in some communities
- Example impacts:
 - Tendoma, attendance rose from 23 to 69, despite the Sunday market day.
 - Poyetanga, attendance rose from 11 to 32, with restoration of members.
 - At Mbaabaasa joint-worship, attendance rose from 60 to 99.
 - Mbaabaasa joint-worship, offerings nearly tripled (~\$60 to ~\$160).
 - The increase in attendance has been sustained over the past month, only decreasing marginally at some churches due recent to heavy rains.

These results reflect renewed faith, stronger congregations, and sustained community engagement.

Stories of Resilience

- **Early Challenge:** A road accident involving key local partners resulted in serious injury; nevertheless, the team continued operations with courage and unity
- **Weather Setback:** Heavy rain forced cancellation of one outreach event—yet overall participation and impact remained strong
- **Vehicle Breakdown:** On our return from the last location, one of our vehicles broke down and coupled with bad roads, a 6-hour journey took 12 hours.
- **Community Loss:** The unexpected passing of Johnson Bonye, a key volunteer and interpreter was deeply felt; we continue to support his family in prayer

Lasting Impact

This mission demonstrated a powerful model of **holistic transformation**, where:

- Health needs are addressed alongside spiritual needs
- Communities are empowered through education and care
- Local churches are strengthened for long-term growth

Your support enabled not only immediate relief but also **sustainable change** in some of Ghana's most underserved regions.

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List of Urgent Request

We are hoping to raise funds (\$10,600) to meet these needs, some very urgent:

- Purchase 20 combined Twi and English Bibles at \$25 each (a total \$500).
- Donation in support of the wife and children of our departed interpreter (\$500).
- Start-up funds for 3 of the newly baptized women and a preacher's wife (\$1,000).
- 3-month salary/allowance for 2 preachers to help with follow-up (\$300).
- 5 Refurbished desktop computers with monitors for the computer lab of Official Town Church of Christ Basic School, Twifo-Praso (\$2,000)
- Tendoma church (which currently meets under a tree) building project (\$6,300).

Looking Ahead

With continued partnership, RGM aims to:

- Expand health screenings to additional underserved communities (10,000 pers.)
- Strengthen follow-up programs for new believers
- Provide more medical resources (multivitamins and oral hygiene kits) and educational support (computers)
- Deepen collaboration with local churches and leaders
- Purchase a portable public address system and a truck for reliable transport
