This list from thecut.com highlights just some of the many amazing organizations that we urge you to donate to in support of the black community. We have included some additional organizations as well. <u>This article</u> also offers other ways to join the fight for justice:

• <u>The Bail Project</u>, a nonprofit that aims to mitigate incarceration rates through bail reform.

• <u>Black Visions Collective</u>, a black, trans, and queer-led social justice organization and legal fund based in Minneapolis-St. Paul.

• <u>The National Bail Fund Network</u> has a directory of community bail funds to which you can donate, along with a COVID-19 rapid response fund. Another list of funds is available here.

• <u>A Gas Mask Fund</u> for black youth activists in Minneapolis is raising money to buy gas masks for demonstrators who've faced tear gas during protests.

• <u>The NAACP Legal Defense Fund</u>, which supports racial justice through advocacy, litigation, and education.

• <u>Communities United Against Police Brutality</u>, which operates a crisis hotline where people can report abuse; offers legal, medical, and psychological resource referrals; and engages in political action against police brutality.

• <u>Northstar Health Collective</u>, a St. Paul-based organization that provides health services and support at protests.

• <u>The ACLU</u>, which provides legal services and support for a broad range of people with civil rights complaints.

• <u>Free Them All for Public Health</u>, which aims to free incarcerated people amid the coronavirus pandemic, is raising money for people who have been arrested during New York City protests over

the weekend. What doesn't go toward local bail will reportedly be sent to other cities, and COVID Bailout NYC.

• <u>The Atlanta Solidarity Fund</u> is raising bail and bond money for jailed protestors in Atlanta.

• <u>No New Jails NYC</u> aims to keep the city from constructing new jails, and to instead divert funds that currently go toward the police and incarceration toward housing, ending homelessness, mental health, and other community support systems.

• <u>The Know Your Rights Camp</u>, an organization founded by Colin Kaepernick that provides education and training in black and brown communities, set up a legal fund for Minneapolis protestors.

• <u>Fair Fight</u>, an organization founded by Stacey Abrams that aims to end voter suppression and equalize voting rights and access for fairer elections.

• <u>The Massachusetts Bail Fund</u> pays up to \$2000 bail so that low-income people can stay free while they work towards resolving their case, allowing individuals, families, and communities to stay productive, together, and stable.

• Black Disability Collective is a group meant to uplift and advocate for black disabled lives
