Q1	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>How do I apply?</p> <p>For educational awards, the application link can be found on the specific program page on our website at hualalaiohanafoundation.org under 'Ohana Awards & Programs. All educational award applications must be submitted online.</p> <p>For medical awards, a printable application can be found on our website or by visiting our office.</p>
Q2	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>When should I expect to be notified about my award?</p> <p>From the time we receive a complete application packet, you should expect to hear back within two (2) weeks' time. If your application packet is missing any required documents, it will delay processing and response time. All scholarships have a different timeline, please be sure to read through the specific program details you are applying for.</p>
Q3	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>Do my grandchildren qualify?</p> <p>No. HOF awards are designed to assist Hualalai employees and their immediate dependents. If your grandchildren are listed as your legal dependents, you must provide documentation of legal guardianship.</p>
Q4	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>Do my parents qualify?</p> <p>No. HOF awards are designed to assist Hualalai employees and their immediate dependents. If your parents are listed as your legal dependents, you must provide documentation of legal guardianship.</p>
Q5	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>How many awards can I apply for?</p> <p>You can participate in as many programs as you are eligible for. Each program has different award limits. Please be sure to read through the specific program details you are applying for.</p>
Q6	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>Who is the award check made out to?</p> <p>It depends on the award type and category. Please refer to program details or contact our programs office.</p>
Q7	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>My daughter is 26 years old. Does she qualify?</p> <p>The dependent cap is age 24 for the majority of Educational Awards.</p> <p>The dependent cap is age 12 for LEAP Keiki Literacy & Learning Programs.</p> <p>The dependent cap is age 26 for Medical Awards.</p>
Q8	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>What if my hours of work vary throughout the year?</p> <p>An average of 20 hours per week must be reached to be eligible for all HOF awards.</p>

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Q9	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>I recently changed jobs from within the Four Seasons to a position as an independent contractor. Does this affect my eligibility?</p> <p>No. Your tenure of employment within Hualalai Resort carries with you, so long as you are still servicing Hualalai Resort in some capacity. You also need to maintain the minimum hours work requirement, which is 20 hours per week.</p>
Q10	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>Can you explain the \$230,000 income cap?</p> <p>The income cap considers your household's after-tax income. Earnings withdrawn from retirement or investment accounts are not required to be included. There are a few programs such as Honor Roll Award and Keiki Literacy & Learning Programs that does not have an income cap. Please be sure to read through the specific program details you are applying for.</p>
Q11	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>What is an employee eligibility verification and what do I need to do?</p> <p>Use the form at the following link to verify your eligibility for support through the Hualalai 'Ohana Foundation: https://hualalaiohanafoundation.dm.networkforgood.com/forms/employee-eligibility-verification-form Hualalai Resort contractor employees must provide (2) two employment references with their application.</p>
Q12	ALL HOF PROGRAMS	<p>What is a Hualalai Community Employee?</p> <p>Hualalai Community Employee includes employees of Hualalai Investors, LLC or Four Seasons Hualalai; and any Hualalai Resort contractor, which means an independent contractor or employee of another company that provides services to the resort, hotel, or resident homeowner for a minimum of 20 hours per week for a minimum of six (6) months (effective March 1, 2023). Hualalai Resort contractors must provide two (2) verification letters of eligibility – from your employer, hotel or resort verification, or homeowner – with their application. A reference letter must include start date, tenure and average hours worked per week.</p>

Q13	MEDICAL	<p>What do I need to gather from my dental/medical provider?</p> <p>A complete application includes a treatment plan explaining the diagnosis and prognosis of the medical situation. Examples of acceptable documentation include a treatment plan from a dental provider, hospital discharge paperwork, or a completed 'Ohana Medical Treatment Plan (page 2 of the medical application packet) signed by your medical professional. You will also need official documents detailing the specific amount that you are responsible for as well as what portion insurance has paid. This must show the dates of service (dental codes if applicable) and the cost breakdown.</p>
Q14	MEDICAL	What is a diagnosis?

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		<p>A medical diagnosis identifies the applicant's present illness, disease, or injury. A medical prognosis is an estimate of the outcome of the condition and is used to determine treatment. On dental applications, diagnosis/prognosis should include the tooth number, dental code, and procedure name. It should define the medical necessity of the situation. Effective January 2024, the Hualalai 'Ohana Foundation Dental Award amount is set at a cap of \$1,000. One award per year, including braces.</p>
Q15	MEDICAL	<p>What is a treatment plan? A treatment plan is developed by a medical provider and states a patient's diagnosis and necessary procedures. It defines the medical necessity of the condition.</p>
Q16	MEDICAL	<p>What is an itemized receipt? An itemized receipt includes the patient's name, provider's name, dates of service, type of service, cost, and insurance adjusted amount.</p>
Q17	MEDICAL	<p>Do you reimburse prescriptions? Yes, as related to the approved diagnosis/prognosis. The original prescription label and receipt are required for reimbursement.</p>
Q18	MEDICAL	<p>Which medical procedures qualify for an award? HOF covers medically necessary surgeries and dental procedures that are insurance eligible. If a procedure is not covered by insurance, it is typically not something the Foundation will be able to support.</p>
Q19	MEDICAL	<p>Can my spouse travel with me to O'ahu for my knee surgery? Yes, HOF medical awards grant economy/coach airfare for one travel companion, if medically necessary. Other allowable travel expenses may include lodging (up to \$200 per night), food/meals per diem (up to \$75 per day), rental car (mid-size car) or ground transportation, and parking. Maximum 90 days. Reimbursements are for off-island travel only, not to the other side of the island.</p>
Q20	MEDICAL	<p>Does the dental award cover braces? Yes, as medically necessary with a treatment plan, up to \$1,000.</p>
Q21	MEDICAL	<p>Do I need to have insurance to qualify for medical financial assistance? Yes, all medical applications must indicate the insurance eligible adjusted amount on the invoice from the medical provider or insurance company.</p>
Q22	MEDICAL	<p>I don't like my teeth. Does the award cover tooth implants or veneers? We cover medically necessary, insurance-eligible tooth implants. Cosmetic tooth implants or veneers are not eligible for HOF dental assistance awards.</p>
Q23	MEDICAL	<p>My dentist said I need a crown and an extraction; can you help me? We cover medically necessary, insurance-eligible dental/surgical procedures. Please refer to policy guidelines or call our office for more information.</p>

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Q24	MEDICAL	<p>I am having surgery next month, what do I need to do or know at this time? Do I need to wait to apply?</p> <p>We encourage you to apply as soon as you have a medical diagnosis and prognosis ready. With your completed application and treatment plan/diagnosis and prognosis, we will be able to advance your application for further review and evaluation with the Medical Committee.</p>
Q25	MEDICAL	<p>Can you contact my medical provider for me?</p> <p>No. It is your responsibility to provide all necessary documentation to qualify for medical financial assistance through the Hualalai 'Ohana Foundation. After reviewing the FAQs, if you need further assistance, please contact our office directly for support.</p>
Q26	MEDICAL	<p>I had surgery a couple of months ago and have kept my receipts. The bills from the doctor's offices are starting to come in and I'm worried I can't pay for it all. Can I still apply for a medical financial assistance award?</p> <p>Yes, you can apply for past surgical procedures within the current calendar year.</p>
Q27	MEDICAL	<p>What information should I ask my doctor for to assemble a complete application for medical financial assistance award through HOF?</p> <p>You should request a formal treatment plan, discharge paperwork, or a completed 'Ohana Medical Treatment Plan from your doctor. Be sure to include your diagnosis on your patient authorization form.</p>
Q28	MEDICAL	<p>I've been approved for an award through HOF and my doctor's appointment is on January 3rd. Do I pay the doctor or does the Foundation pay the doctor?</p> <p>It is possible to proceed in either situation. If you pay the doctor, keep your receipts with the original copy of the itemized bill, complete with the insurance amount paid, to request reimbursement. If you would like HOF to pay your doctor directly, you still must provide the itemized bill with the insurance paid amount shown. Providing an explanation of benefits from your medical insurance provider detailing what insurance covered and what you paid or are required to pay out of pocket can expedite the processing of your award.</p>
Q29	MEDICAL	<p>How are medical financial assistance award payments made?</p> <p>To be able to disburse payment for a procedure, we will need an invoice that details the dates of service, services rendered, and applicable insurance. Providing an explanation of benefits from your medical insurance provider detailing what insurance covered and what you paid or are required to pay out of pocket can expedite the processing of your award.</p>
Q30	MEDICAL	<p>Does the medical award cover prescription costs?</p> <p>Prescription co-pays are an eligible expense for the diagnosed condition accepted. Prescription co-pays must include original RX labels and receipts that must include name of patient.</p>

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Q31	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>How do I apply?</p> <p>For educational awards, the application link can be found on the specific program page on our website at hualalaiohanafoundation.org under 'Ohana Awards & Programs. All educational award applications must be submitted online.</p>
Q32	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What is a tuition statement?</p> <p>A tuition statement or invoice will include the student's name, student ID, current charges, and account balance.</p>
Q33	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What information needs to be on my uploaded Grade Transcript?</p> <p>An official or unofficial grade transcript is required for all applicants. A valid transcript for HOF scholarship qualification purposes must include all of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Institution's name • Student's full name • List of course history • Current Grades/Information for each course: • Continuing College Students – must also include past semester grades/information • High School Seniors – must include 9th through 11th grade at the minimum (IF available, include grade 12 information) • Current cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA)
Q34	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What are some examples of Grade Transcripts that may be deemed invalid?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grade Transcript does not have your most recent academic history • Name on your Grade Transcript does not match the name on your HOF application • Grade Transcript cannot be clearly read • Grade Transcript does not include all pages and/or all course work • Attached file format cannot be opened upon review by HOF scholarship staff <p>NOTE: The validity of your Grade Transcript is up to the discretion of HOF's Scholarship staff. Any transcript under suspicion of doctoring or editing will be eliminated from review and the applicant will not be considered for awards.</p>
Q35	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What is a Personal Statement and what should I include?</p> <p>A personal statement is a special type of essay that gives you an opportunity to share a little bit about who you are and demonstrate that you're a good fit for a particular program.</p> <p>We encourage you to include personal stories or examples in these essays which can support your answers and give the review committee a good sense of who you are.</p> <p>We also encourage you to proofread your essays for any grammatical or spelling errors. Keep in mind that applications may be read by HOF staff, decision-makers, and donors who may have established these scholarships.</p> <p>Tip: Compose your essays in a Word document (or equivalent) and then copy and paste it into your application to avoid the system timing out after thirty (30) minutes.</p>

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Q36	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>How do I know what is required to submit my application?</p> <p>We recommend you thoroughly read through each specific education program detail to determine what additional documents may be required for those opportunities. All additional documents must be uploaded to be able to submit your online application. The system will also prompt you with an error message if you try to submit your application without completing a required answer or section. Carefully review your application prior to submission. Submitting your application in advance of the deadline will allow you time to correct any missing/required answers.</p>
Q37	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>Is there any cost to apply for HOF education program opportunities?</p> <p>No, HOF offers multiple educational award programs that are free to apply.</p>
Q38	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>Can I make changes to my application after it has been submitted?</p> <p>Once your application has been submitted, you will only be able to view the information you have submitted. You can edit any part of your application if you have not yet submitted your application. We highly recommend that you use the review option to review your information carefully before submitting.</p>
Q39	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What if I don't have a computer and/or scanner to scan and upload my documents?</p> <p>You may want to seek assistance from a relative, friend, working professional or counselor who may have access to a scanner. You can also visit copy centers, such as Office Max, which can assist you for a small fee. We highly recommend that you format your files format into a PDF form before attaching them to your application. You may want to download a free PDF converter on your computer to convert documents into a PDF format. Recommended websites are www.freepdfconvert.com or www.pdfonline.com.</p>
Q40	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>How can I upload or attach multiple pages to my application?</p> <p>The online application portal 'Ohana Online will allow you to upload multiple documents to your application.</p>
Q41	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>How can I upload or attach multiple pages to my application?</p> <p>All supporting documents must be submitted online. We recommend that you start early to gather the necessary tax documents to fill out the FAFSA when it becomes available and request a copy of your transcript from your registrar's office once your applicable semester is completed. Online applications can only be submitted once all required support documents have been uploaded.</p>
Q42	ALL – EDUCATION	<p>What if I do not want to accept my award or I will not be attending school for the awarded academic year?</p> <p>We understand that circumstances may change between the time you submit your application to when our awards process begins. If you receive an award notification and do not wish to accept your award, there is an option to decline your award on the Award Agreement Contract (AAC). We ask that you do this as soon as possible as this may allow us to award another deserving student.</p>

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Q43	ALL – EDUCATION	What is an AAC? AAC stands for Award Agreement Contract.
Q44	ALL – EDUCATION	If I receive a scholarship one year, will I automatically receive an award for the following year? No, students must complete the application process again to be considered for an award the following year.
Q45	ALL – EDUCATION	When will I receive the scholarship money? Once awarded, we need you to accept each award by signing and returning the AAC within 2 weeks' time. Higher Education & Hualalai Scholars Scholarships are paid to the student in two equal payments in August for the Fall semester and January for the Spring semester. It is your responsibility to submit your grades and tuition statement to the Foundation by the deadline listed on your AAC in order to receive your second semester payment. Higher Education & Hualalai Scholars Scholarship awards are paid directly to the student and can be applied to tuition costs, official student fees, and textbooks that correspond with each semester's official curriculum. This award does not cover extra-curricular activities, housing, supplies, or transportation costs. The applicant will be responsible for any expenses not covered by this award. If you receive an award, you must provide a current invoice, tuition statement or receipt with proof of payment. The tuition information provided in your application packet to the Foundation is not acceptable for payment of your award. Award payments are made twice per academic year. To receive your second semester award payment, you will need to submit a copy of your second semester invoice and first semester grades showing a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA for Higher Education Scholarship or a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA for Hualalai Scholars Scholarship. Preschool and K12 Scholarship awards are paid directly to the student's school once a tuition statement is provided to HOF during the awards processing period.
Q46	ALL – EDUCATION	Are the scholarships awarded sufficient to pay the full cost of my college education? No. These scholarships are intended to provide only partial support. In addition to applying for scholarships through the Foundation, you should investigate other financial aid resources such as other scholarship organizations, federal grants, loans and work-study awards. A complete financial aid package can be put together by your school's financial aid office and may include various types of financial aid.
Q47	ALL – EDUCATION	How much will I receive in scholarships from HOF?

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		HOF Scholarship offers varying award amounts, which generally range from \$1,000 to several thousand dollars, depending on the size of each scholarship fund, the number of qualified applicants and directions given by the donor(s). Applicants are encouraged to complete the application as thoroughly as possible (i.e. providing all applicable supporting documents, providing personal statements as requested) to increase the chances of being eligible for multiple educational award opportunities. The average award for students is approximately 50% of student financial need and varies each year.
Q48	ALL – EDUCATION	When will I be notified if I am awarded? After the program deadline has passed, applications will be evaluated by the review committee. No applications will be reviewed before the stated deadline. Please refer to the Program Application Deadline calendar for the year. For year-round awards, application review happens on a monthly basis.
Q49	ALL - EDUCATION	If I have more than one student, do I need to fill out a new application for each one? Yes. You must complete a separate application for each student.
Q50	ALL - EDUCATION	How do I access a saved application? Once you click on the <i>Apply Now</i> link, it will take you to a new application. To access a saved application, go to the very top right corner and select <i>My Applications</i> . From there, you can view all your applications.
Q51	ALL - SCHOLARSHIPS	How long will it take to complete the online application? It will take approximately 2 to 3 hours to fill out the application. Your application session will time out after 45 minutes of inactivity but will regenerate if you use the save function or move on to a new question in the application. You may save your application and return to it at any time prior to the deadline. Click here to return to our education application portal.
Q52	ALL - SCHOLARSHIPS	Do I need to submit additional essays to submit my application? Yes. Personal statements are required for specific education awards to submit your application. Personal statements weigh heavily in the review process and it is important that you take the time to provide a thoughtful and relevant personal statement explaining why the Foundation and its donors should support your request. We recommend you thoroughly read through each application detail to determine what additional documents may be required for those award opportunities.
Q53	ALL - SCHOLARSHIPS	What will my scholarship award cover? The scholarship can be used for any educational expenses related to your school's cost of attendance, which may include tuition and fees, books and supplies, and other miscellaneous school expenses for the awarded academic year. Please refer to your AAC for specific award criteria.

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Q54	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What is FAFSA?</p> <p>The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form you need to fill out to get any financial aid from the federal government to help pay for college. The FAFSA asks for information about you and your family's finances, including tax returns, so you'll need your parents' help to complete it. HOF uses FAFSA data as one factor to determine your award amount.</p>
Q55	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What is a SAR?</p> <p>Your Student Aid Report (SAR) is an electronic or paper document that gives you some basic information about your eligibility for federal student aid. It also includes your answers to the questions on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form.</p>
Q56	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>How do I obtain my Student Aid Report (SAR)?</p> <p>Your SAR will be sent to you after your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) has been processed. Beginning October 1st, you can start your FAFSA for the following academic year, by going to https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa. Click here for further instructions. For more information regarding the FAFSA process, please visit the FAFSA Help website at https://studentaid.gov/apply-for-aid/fafsa/filling-out/help.</p>
Q57	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What information needs to be on my uploaded Student Aid Report (SAR)?</p> <p>Your uploaded SAR must include ALL pages of your processed report, including your full name and Student Aid Index (SAI) number (formerly EFC).</p>
Q58	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What are some examples of Student Aid Report (SAR) that may be deemed invalid?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FAFSA Summary Report (the report you receive immediately upon submitting your FAFSA) • SAR does not match the academic year for which you are applying • SAR states that there is missing or incorrect information submitted on your FAFSA which needs to be corrected or addressed • Name listed on your SAR does not match the name on your HOF scholarship application • Name and/or SAI cannot be clearly read • SAR does not include all pages • Attached file format cannot be opened upon review by HOF scholarship staff <p>NOTE: The validity of your SAR is up to the discretion of HOF's Scholarship staff. Any SARs under suspicion of doctoring or editing will be eliminated from review and the applicant will not be considered for awards.</p>
Q59	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What is an SAI?</p>

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		<p>Your Student Aid Index (SAI) is an index number used to determine your eligibility for federal student financial aid. This number results from the information you provide in your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form.</p> <p>Your SAI is reported to you on your Student Aid Report (SAR). You can view your SAR by logging in to your FAFSA form and selecting “View SAR” from the My FAFSA page.</p> <p>HOF uses the SAI as a factor to determine your award. We understand that there may be gaps in the amount of aid you need.</p>
Q60	ALL -SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>Do I need to attach any other document(s) besides my SAR and Grade Transcript in order to submit my application?</p> <p>Please be sure to check the specific application details for each education program that you are applying for. However, additional documents may be needed to qualify for specific scholarships. Examples of additional documents may include letters of recommendation, SAT/ACT scores, verification of enrollment, etc. If you do qualify for a scholarship that has an additional document requirement, a section to upload that additional document will appear within your application. We recommend you thoroughly read through each application detail to determine what additional documents may be required for those opportunities. All additional documents must be uploaded and submitted with your online application. Please notify HOF if you will be submitting hard copies or emailing copies of any documents.</p> <p>NOTE: The validity of any documentation submitted is up to the discretion of HOF’s Scholarship staff. Any documents under suspicion of forgery, doctoring, or editing will be eliminated from review and the applicant will not be considered for awards.</p>
Q61	ALL - SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>What is an official transcript and when it is required?</p> <p>Official transcripts are ordered through the Registrar’s Office at your University or Community College and can be mailed or emailed to HOF. Official transcripts are signed by the Registrar and bear the institution’s official seal.</p> <p>Official transcripts are not printouts available through a student web portal and will be deemed invalid as a supporting document to fulfill your application packet.</p> <p>The Foundation requires an official transcript for 3 of its programs. Those programs include the Hualalai Scholars, the Higher Education Scholarship and the Academic Merit Awards at point of application and by the established application deadline. If your final grades are not available yet, the Foundation will accept an unofficial transcript but cannot cut your first scholarship payment check until the official transcript is received.</p>
Q62	ALL - SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>Should I still apply for HOF scholarships even if I am waitlisted or undecided?</p> <p>Yes, you should still apply for HOF scholarships even if you are waitlisted or undecided.</p>

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Q63	SCHOLARSHIPS - HED	<p>What should I do if I am undecided about my college plans?</p> <p>If you are undecided about your college plans, don't let that stop you from applying for HOF scholarships. To be considered for a scholarship, we will need an application to review, even if you are not yet accepted or enrolled. Without a submitted application by the scholarship deadline, you will not be eligible for a scholarship. This is also true for PreK-12 Scholarships. There may be no exceptions to late applications. You are still encouraged to apply for scholarships in the case that you decide to enroll. If you ultimately decide not to enroll, you can withdraw your application and/or scholarship.</p>
Q64	SCHOLARSHIPS - HED	<p>I'm not sure if I want to go to college yet, but I don't want to miss out on any scholarship opportunities. What should I do?</p> <p>You can still apply for scholarships even if you are not sure if you want to go to college yet. We will require you to be enrolled in college and provide proof of enrollment prior to award payment.</p>
Q65	SCHOLARSHIPS – HUALALAI SCHOLARS	<p>Do I need to submit letters of recommendation (LOR)?</p> <p>Letters of recommendation are required for the Hualalai 'Ohana Scholars Scholarship Application. For this, it's a good idea to request your two recommendations ahead of time. When choosing a recommender, think of people who can speak to your academic performance, leadership capabilities, or community service involvement. This could be a previous or current academic instructor, a school counselor, a club advisor, a mentor, a coach, an employer and/or church leader, etc.</p>
Q66	SCHOLARSHIPS – HUALALAI SCHOLARS	<p>How are letters of recommendation submitted with my application?</p> <p>Letters of recommendation will be a required document upload task for the Hualalai 'Ohana Scholars Scholarship Application. For this, it's a good idea to request your two recommendations ahead of time.</p>
Q67	SCHOLARSHIPS – HUALALAI SCHOLARS	<p>What would be considered examples of invalid recommendations?</p> <p>NOTE: The validity of a submitted letter of recommendation is up to the discretion of HCF's Scholarship staff. Any letters suspected of being forged, doctored, or edited will be eliminated from review, and the applicant will not be considered for awards.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recommendations from parents, friends, and relatives • Recommendations in a file format that is unable to be opened by HOF staff
Q68	PREK12 SCHOLARSHIPS	<p>Can I apply for Preschool scholarship for my 3-year-old?</p> <p>Yes, the minimum age for scholarship awards is 3 years old at the time of application.</p>
