Helpful Tip: Request your Official Transcript be sent to your email and be sure to save a copy so you can use it for multiple program applications. Official transcripts are signed by the Registrar and bear the institution's official seal. Official transcripts are not printouts available through a student web portal and will be deemed invalid as a supporting document to fulfill your application packet. The Foundation requires an official transcript for 4 of its programs. Those programs include the Hualalai Scholars, the Higher Education Scholarship, Academic Merit Awards, and Work for College Match at point of application and by the established application deadline. If your final grades are not available yet, the Foundation will accept an unofficial transcript but cannot cut your first scholarship payment check until the official transcript is received.
