How We Began...

The idea for the Hualalai Ohana Foundation was formulated in the Spring of 2001 during a lunch meeting attended by Kahu Billy Mitchell, Richard Albrecht, Nicola Opdycke, Tom and Debby Davidson and Joe Schell. These founders wanted to find a way to return the spirit of aloha that we all receive from the resort staff as soon as we drive in the entry gate to Hualalai.

They discussed the extraordinary financial hardship a resort employee endured (despite coverage by medical insurance) due to extended off-island treatment for



a life-threatening disease. The Foundation founders felt our community could be even more supportive through the organization of a foundation accepting tax-deductible donations. Employees in need would have a central place to go for assistance, and fellow employees and residents could provide financial assistance at one convenient time thereby helping all those who needed support during the course of a year. At the second meeting of this nucleus group, the founders elected to expand our mission to include educational scholarships for the employees, their spouses and their children.

With the willingness of Hualalai Development Company to pay all of the organizational expenses, lawyers were retained to draft by-laws, assist with the articulation of our mission statement and the appointment of officers, and file necessary documents with the IRS, all of which were necessary steps to obtain the "public charitable organization or 501(c)(3) status" the Foundation now enjoys. This administrative process took about 15 months before the Foundation could get started with its mission.

In late 2002, a Board of Directors was formed, and these directors set about fundraising and establishing procedures for granting medical awards and seeking applications and determining appropriate criteria for granting educational scholarships. While the directors had set up various committees to do the work of the Foundation, most of the ground work was contributed by three very special, passionately committed people: Kessie Hollister, Nicola Opdycke, and Joe Schell, who were tireless in their volunteer efforts to get the award process up and running in early 2003. All of us at the Foundation thank them for setting such a solid, sensitive base for all that the Foundation does today.


Joe Schell was instrumental in establishing our first Annual Fund in late 2002. The goal was to raise \$400,000 to fund educational and medical awards to be granted in 2003. Thanks to the collective generosity of our residential ohana and a lead gift from the Hualalai Development Company, the Foundation received donations from 100 individuals and families (50% participation from the residents at that time!) totaling \$423,000. This was a spectacular result for a brand new foundation on its maiden voyage, beautifully and clearly demonstrating the aloha spirit which flows so freely at Hualalai.

Our Mission...Our Guidelines...

"Consistent with preserving the tradition of respect for the land and for the Hawaiian culture, we wish to acknowledge and support the exceptional individuals of the community who work to make Hualalai a paradise to the eye and to the heart. Our mission is simply to provide educational scholarships, educational opportunities and medical awards to the immediate families of the employees in the Hualalai community."

Educational scholarships are granted to employees, their spouses and their children for:

- 1. Private Kindergarten -12th grade education
- 2. Higher Education through an accredited college
- 3. HPA and Kamehameha School Summer Programs
- 4. Career-enhancing Training and Coursework
- 5. Reading and Math Tutoring
- 6. English as a Second Language and other language/literacy programs



Education:

To qualify for a scholarship, an employee must work on property a minimum of 20 hours per week for at least one year. Each successful applicant must demonstrate financial need, merit and motivation in his or her application.

Since inception in 2002, the Foundation has granted over \$1,000,000 in educational awards.

Medical:

Medical awards are granted to employees, their spouses and their children in cases of serious or life-threatening illness. Medical awards cover expenses incurred beyond those covered by medical insurance. When off-island treatment is required, the Foundation reimburses for eligible travel expenses for the patient and an accompanying family member.

Since 2002, the Foundation has been able to grant over \$260,000 in medical support and relieve the financial burden for affected families.





Our Organization and Management...

The Foundation is headed by a Board of Directors. Each person serves a three-year term; the Board is responsible for all policy decisions. The Board meets approximately five times per year, and most of the work is done by the six committees of the Board each of which consists of board members, interested residents and some volunteers. We appreciate all of their time and effort on the following committees: Development, Education, Event Planning, Finance, Governance and Medical. We welcome additional members of our Hualalai community who wish to participate on the Education, Medical, or Events committees.

The Foundation's day-to-day work is done by our Executive Director, working from office space on property provided by Hualalai Investors, LLC. She is assisted by our new part-time Foundation Administrator, who acts as the Medical Shepherd and co-reviews education applications. In addition, we continue to be blessed with the volunteer efforts of several of the resort employees, most notably Kaulu Amaral, Sean Bartlett, JoAnn Furusho, Pat Nagy, Vivian Tobias, and the incomparable Hualalai and Four Seasons Human Resources teams.







Our Fundraising Efforts...

- In addition to our annual donations, the Foundation is delighted to host a variety of events that enhance the sense of Hualalai community, while raising money to support our programs. Perhaps no example of this is more celebrated and memorable as our **Annual Golf Event and Auction** at Ke'olu. In April 2008, an unprecedented 100 participants played in the golf tournament, which was followed by a light-hearted dinner and auction, all of which raised over \$98,000 for Hualalai families.
- The Foundation was also fortunate to be the beneficiary of the 2008 MasterCard ProAm fees. Due to the generosity of Hualalai Investors, LLC this event donated an amazing \$100,000 towards our annual goal.
- A family favorite is the **Keiki Cart Wash**, a special fundraiser put on by the children of our Hualalai residents during the busy holiday season. In December 2007, these generous keiki washed enough carts to raise \$1,250, which was matched by residents to achieve almost \$18,000!









Educational Awards...

The Foundation administers the review of K-12 and Higher Education scholarships from January through May. Summer Program applications can be submitted until August.

Coursework, Tutoring and English as a Second Language (ESL) awards are available year-round.





For the 2007-2008 academic year, K-12, Higher Education and Summer Program scholarships were capped at the cost of tuition and books up to \$4,000 for families earning a combined income of \$75,000 or less. Families with a combined income of more than \$75,000, but not more than \$150,000, were awarded \$3,500 in scholarships. These income-based award amounts were chosen by the Board of Directors to offer the maximum benefit to each student while maintaining available funds and longer-term financial goals of the Foundation.

For Coursework and Tutoring programs, employees and their children were provided half the cost of tuition and books up to \$1,000 per year. Any employee registering for a certified ESL or literacy program was offered the full cost of tuition and books, up to \$1,000 per year.

For the 2007-2008 academic year, the Foundation is proud to have granted educational awards totaling \$249,420 as follows:


- 46 scholarships for K-12 (\$165,668)
- 22 scholarships for Higher Education (\$53,608)
- 3 scholarships for Summer Programs (\$9,243)
- 37 Coursework and Tutoring awards (\$20,901)

Over 40 proud families attended a special award ceremony, which included a congratulatory video message from actor, Dwayne Johnson.



Our Foundation's Financial Picture...

The Foundation remains in strong shape financially, thanks to the breadth and depth of support from our residential ohana during the last few years, but we continue to need income to support existing and expanded programs. Below is our Budget vs. Actual for FY2008:

In the annual fundraising there were 155 donor families, which represent 54% of our homeowners and reflect an average gift of \$3,182. *In FY 2008, the Foundation utilized the expertise of a non-profit consultant and saw an increase in our auditor fees.

Our budget for FY 2009 allocates \$345,000 for educational awards; \$75,000 for medical awards; \$44,500 for fundraising and events; and \$101,750 for staff and administrative expenses.

We believe that by aggressively pursuing creative ways of encouraging education among children and adults, we will increase our recipients. Successful fundraising in 2009 will enable us to fulfill our mission with a strong financial base. We hope that our residential ohana will support our initiatives with the same enthusiasm and generosity of the last six years.

Looking Ahead into 2009...

Education

- In reviewing the differing higher education programs, especially those for adults pursuing online degrees, the Education Committee made a decision to allow Higher Education scholarship applications to be accepted year-round. We hope to see a greater involvement in this program, including more adults pursuing post-graduate studies.
- In January, the Foundation will release the 2008-2009 Scholarship applications for children K-12th grades. Our revised deadline will be April 17th, allowing parents to finish their tax returns before submitting them.
- After the success of our first Honor Roll Awards, we are looking forward to another season of excellent report cards and an award ceremony full of proud families. The Honor Roll Award amounts will remain the same:

\$75.00 for students 6th - 8th grade and \$125 for students 9th - 12th grade

Medical

• Early in the new fiscal year, the Foundation responded to a recurring request for support following "necessary, but non-emergency" surgeries. Although not life-threatening, these injuries or illnesses required surgery that placed a significant financial burden on the families, especially if it entailed a long recovery time. In answer, the Medical Committee created the Surgical Assistance Award, consisting of \$1,000 to use towards medical bills, prescriptions or eligible medical travel.
