



MEDICAL Financial Assistance Awards

Health and Community Well-Being For Our Families...

\$74,386 spent on lifethreatening awards. Average serious illness award of \$3,719.

SERIOUS ILLNESS AWARD

Access to quality healthcare can be limited on Hawai'i Island. In the event of a serious illness, employees and their family often travel off-island to receive care, incurring excessive medical expenses. When this occurs, the Foundation helps ease the burden by assisting with patient co-pays, prescriptions, and travel-related expenses. Proudly, the Foundation has placed no cap on this award and supports employees throughout their time of need.

The Foundation awards up to \$3,000 to assist with the average cost of necessary routine and serious surgeries.

Average amount spent on surgical awards in 2021 was \$1,543.

SURGICAL ASSISTANCE AWARD

Some medical conditions, though not life-threatening, still require necessary treatment. Due to the costs involved, some employees postpone the surgery until they are no longer able to work. To facilitate earlier care for these types of non-urgent issues, the Foundation established this award to help with the out-of-pocket costs and travel expenses.

My wife and I have been going through a tough time not knowing whats going on with our daughter. We have made many trips to Oahu, plenty doctor visits and a lot of testing along this rough road. The Foundation helped pay for her medical bills and get us through a difficult time. Now our Jasmine is running and chasing her big brother, playing and jumping all over like a normal 3-year-old again. She's turning 4 soon and we recently enrolled her at Creative Day Preschool. From medical financial support to scholarships for my children to access quality early education here in Kona, the 'Ohana Foundation continues to be one of our biggest blessings. - Austin

2021 MEDICAL AWARDS GRANTED TO

144 HOUSEHOLDS

TOTALING \$252,060 IN SUPPORT.

The Foundation awards up to \$2,000 (two awards per year) to address the growing cost of crucial dental treatments.

DENTAL ASSISTANCE AWARD

To help support the significant number of employees suffering from a wide range of dental issues, an award specific to dental care was created. Following similar guidelines to the Surgical Assistance Award, this helps with the high cost of urgent and necessary dental procedures.

EDUCATIONAL Tools for Learning

In 2021, your partnership meant that the Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation's mission could grow to serve the needs of working families. In all, 522 families received the tools to reach their educational goals through child literacy programs, educational scholarships, and academic incentive awards.

In all, the Foundation supports 3 educational priority program areas to help others reach their dreams, removing barriers to access and post-secondary educational attainment:

ACADEMIC INCENTIVE PROGRAMS:

Honor Roll – financial awards for academic performance in grades 6-8 (\$150) and 9-12 (\$250)

Academic Merit – incentive for high-performing college students to earn between \$500 - \$2,500

Work for College Match – a summer earnings match up to help pay for college of \$1,500

LEARNING ENRICHMENT AWARD PROGRAMS:

Child Literacy Initiatives – monthly subscriptions to learning kits including Dolly Parton Imagination Library, Little Passports, science kits with Kiwi & Co., Tinker & Company, Bumo Brain and more.

Tutoring, Coursework & Lifelong Learning – awards between \$1,000 and \$3,000 for personal and professional development coursework, tutoring and special interest or certificate programs including art classes, summer courses, financial literacy programs and other learning enrichment opportunities.

Technology for Education – need-based awards to support the remote learning needs of families through \$500 - \$800 supporting the purchase of a computer, laptop, printer or router.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

Preschool and K-12 Scholarships – need-based scholarships to private schools for eligible families based on income, household size, cost of tuition and estimated family contribution.

Higher Education Scholarships – need-based scholarships to colleges and universities are based on income, household size, cost of tuition and estimated family contribution.

Hualālai Scholars – a competitive \$10,000 college scholarship providing students who are the first in their families to attend college the opportunity to attend a university within the State of Hawai'i.




