The Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation strives to support the educational goals and exceptional medical needs of Hualālai Resort employee families while providing a vehicle to allow residents opportunities to contribute to the well-being and aloha spirit of our uniquely blessed community.

Known widely for its rugged beauty, the ahupua'a of Ka'ūpūlehu is considered one of the most historic and desirable areas along the Kohala Coast. It's also home to the Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation, sharing space with the Four Seasons Resort Hualālai and surrounded by a community of over 350 Hualālai resident households, providing services to residents, guests, and over 1,300 jobs to kama'āina families.

For many, Hualālai is a winter paradise or summer vacation hub. What many don't realize is what makes Hualālai so special; the people and families that live and work to maintain a world-class community. In order to sustain this unique culture, Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation

provides resources for local families, as well as support for young adults moving into post-secondary schooling and then into the workforce.

Because of your generosity, toddlers have entered elementary schools with a love of reading and learning. Children have thrived in their Hawai'i Island education and begun their adult lives in college. Adults have continued to expand their knowledge and grow their abilities. The Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation is proud to host four different types of college and career readiness scholarship awards for high school seniors looking to attend post-secondary education. These students often learn, grow, develop, and return to Hawai'i Island and give back to their hometown by joining the workforce. Our local keiki deserve to have a good future and our goal is to help them thrive, making it easy for them to access high-quality educational opportunities.

Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation's scholarship program helps students who may not have otherwise had the opportunity to attend college. Each year, many of our scholarship recipients are first generation college students; the first in their family to attend university.

There are seven keiki and youth development programs that help inspire a love for reading, travel and learning as well as inspire children to do well in school through academic merit and honor roll programs designed to motivate.

Supporting bright minds

Though the primary goal of the Foundation's scholarships is to fund thriving students, the scholarships also impact the lives of young community members far beyond the classroom.



Above and beyond the financial support that the scholarships provide, they also serve as a reminder to students that they have the community's support as they enter this next stage in their life.

Our students come back with so much knowledge on how to build a thriving economy that is resilient and such a deep passion for this place they grew up in that they can make a really significant contribution.

Medical Awards

Health & Community Well-Being – Medical Financial Assistance for Our Families...

SERIOUS ILLNESS AWARD

Access to quality healthcare can be limited on Hawai'i Island. In the event of a serious illness, employees and their family often travel off-island to receive care, incurring excessive medical expenses. When this occurs, the Foundation helps ease the burden by assisting with patient co-pays, prescriptions, and travel-related expenses. Proudly, the Foundation has placed no cap on this award and supports employees throughout their time of need.

SURGICAL ASSISTANCE AWARD

Some medical conditions, though not life-threatening, still require necessary treatment. Due to the costs involved, some employees postpone the surgery until they are no longer able to work. To encourage earlier care for these types of non-urgent issues, the Foundation established this award to help with the out-of-pocket costs and travel expenses. The Foundation awards up to \$3000 to assist with the average cost of necessary routine and serious surgeries.

DENTAL ASSISTANCE AWARD

To help support the significant number of employees suffering from a wide range of dental issues, an award specific to dental care was created. Following similar guidelines to the Surgical Assistance Award, this helps with the high cost of urgent and necessary dental procedures. The Foundation awards up to \$2000 to address the growing cost of crucial dental treatments.


