Over the summer of 2022, the Hualālai 'Ohana Foundation brought together 40 children of Hualalai Resort employees for a two-week summer program at Kalaemanō Interpretive Center.

Children received two snacks and a healthy lunch each day, sponsored by the Four Seasons Hualālai. A backpack filled with school supplies, a beach mat for outdoor journaling, a reusable water bottle, observation journals and take home materials added excitement to the program.

The program was held in partnership with 'Imiloa and the University of Hawai'i Hilo in celebration of people, place and purpose. Children connected to culture, language, song, art, and history in an outdoor classroom environment from 8am to 3pm daily.













My child loved making new friends and learning about where she lives. I loved that she came home everyday with so much excitement about going back.








We liked that kids got to make new friends and learn about the native land and culture. Everyone was really positive and we enjoyed all it had to offer.
