
Image below is a clip from 1820 Plan City of Savannah McKinnon & Wright Record Series 3121-007, Engineering Department - General Maps, Item # XA-005, City of Savannah Municipal Archives, Savannah, GA.

The Blue box is the City Commons. The only areas known at the time are the Garden Lots, Farm Lots, and Poor House and Hospital (PH&H). The PH&H was granted 5-acres in the City Commons by the Mayor & Aldermen in 1818. Currently, this is the only known configuration of the 5-acres. The displayed Garden Lots and Farm Lots were privately owned. This map shows the imagined continuation of Oglethorpe's Plan to the edges of the City Common. In the early evolution of Forsyth Park, Forsyth Place was the name given to the northern part of the park (light green). The red area is the approximate shape/location of the hotel with a star in the area where the bone was found.

The 1844 articel below explains the placement of the two, lost cemeteries. The surveys for the cemeteries is lost. Using measurements generated from SAGIS, 5-acres is depicted for the location of the Poor House and Hospital going south.





SAGIS measurements for the area depicted in the 1820 map for the Poor House and Hospital: 303.8-feet x 697.0-feet = 4.86 Acres.
