A Quick Snapshot of the Lions Michigan Forum

The Lake Orion Lions Club was well represented at the Lion's Michigan Forum in Kalamazoo held over the weekend of February 23rd. Our group was led by Forum Committee Chair Jim Leach, Jr and consisted of Lions Jim and Lauraine Pettinato, Jim Lykins, Beth Slade, Rick Rice, Pam Kline, Janet Mazetti, Denise Hood, Angie Boomer and myself. The event was held at the Delta Marriott, with an overflow hotel located just minutes away.

The Forum began on Friday with a service project in the evening. A goal was set to tie a number of blankets to be donated and, as is typically the case, Lions in attendance not only met but they exceeded that number!

After an early breakfast on Saturday (ask Lion Jim Lykins about his delicious meal with MHSAA Wrestling Team!), we were offered sixteen breakout sessions to choose from across the morning. Four were offered in each time slot and each one lasted approximately 50 minutes. We started the day with a fantastic presentation by Lion Beth Slade where she spoke about Leader Dog and gave us all a lesson in communication and teamwork as we struggled to instruct a blindfolded member of our team how to construct a building block sculpture. Lion Angie made the club proud by constructing hers perfectly!

Our next session was called "Build Healthy Clubs" and the presenters outlined several highly successful clubs and shared what they did to remain an integral part of the communities that they serve. The Seal Beach Lions Club in California was featured for discussion and we learned that while they always have an eye towards membership, they choose to focus upon keeping their club relevant in the community and they have a heavy social media presence. Take a look at their calendar posted on their website at www.sealbeachlions.org and you will see that they have events in their community several times each week! Rarely do they allow more than three days to go by without some sort of event or activity.

Next, we attended a session hosted by Bear Lake Camp Director Traci Tribley. She gave an overview of what has been going on at the camp, describing improvement projects, new sessions of campers and a look towards the future for the camp. Things are really happening up at the camp!

Our final session was a presentation on the use of social media to promote not only our club activities, but also to promote Lionism in general. Other sessions that were available included Servant Leadership, Lion Traditions, Eversight and Lions & Service. A vendor floor was also featured between sessions that included tables for many Lion-supported projects from throughout the state.

The forum offers an opportunity for growth in Lionism through education, networking and service. I encourage any Lion to attend next year and to enrich their Lions experience by seeing how our service organization impacts the world outside of our own community.

Lions Clubs International has already approved the dues increases shown. Michigan Lions are scheduled to vote on dues increases at its convention later this year in May..

Lake Orion Lions Club's policies regarding dues:

- Life Members are not charged any dues. However, the Club still pays the MI Lions and 11 A 2 dues for those members. The Club has asked that Life Members pay voluntarily half of the annual dues assessed.
- When 2 members are at the same address, one member pays the full dues amount and the other member pays half that amount.

This data is presented for information purposes only so all members are aware of it. There has been no suggestion of the Lake Orion Lions Club increasing the \$100.00 dues currently assessed.
