When Traci finished, our club Secretary, Jim Leach, took over and did a wonderful job as the auctioneer for the Live Auction items. When the Live Auction ended, Mike Pikelis and Jim Leach handed out the door prizes. There were so many door prizes this year, thanks to the hard work of Lion Dave Tucker. Lion Dave went to every business from the Palace to the White Horse Inn in Metamora to solicit donations. I do not know how many donations Lion Dave collected, but it was substantial.
