

Dear Beloved Resurrection Family!

Grace, love, and peace are gifts to us from God, our provider, as we make our way through the final days of our Lenten journey!

As I mentioned in my Ash Wednesday when we began this journey, it feels as though Lent is exactly what our souls have needed for a while now. Most of you, like me, are so weary and worn from the years we've recently navigated that we've needed the space to be still and know that God is God. I hope that this season has been a place where you have felt nourished in God's Word and found the space to reconnect with your soul.



In the coming weeks we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and I am so elated that this year we anticipate a full, vibrant, festival worship with all the bells and whistles! Yet, I feel the same sense of elation in my soul as I look around to see what God has been doing while we've held our collective breath for two years. Council News

The congregational council is thankful that the first quarter of the year brought about the ability to begin meeting in person following worship each month. In the first quarter the council gathered for a Council Retreat that focused on the cyclical nature of change. This model offered us the opportunity to consider how re-emerging after the pandemic is an invitation to bring the really important traditions with us, but also to open ourselves to new things that are emerging around us. This process is often hard and painful as change is typically accompanied by a trauma (example: pandemic) of some sort. However, if we are willing to attend to the change and grief that comes with the trauma, we can follow the Holy Spirit into resurrected life!

COVID-19 Task Force

Following the holidays COVID cases hit record spikes as the Omicron variant swept through. The COVID task force and congregation responded by adopting more vigilant protocols that increased mask wearing, social distancing, and shorter services.

Mercifully, the COVID numbers have dropped to the point that when the COVID task force met at the end of February they were able to recommend the following:

- 1. Optional masking: Each person / household should choose when to wear a mask based on their personal comfort levels.
- 2. Social Distancing: Ropes were removed from the sanctuary so that each person / household can determine their comfort level with social distancing.
- 3. Communion: Holy Communion is now offered at the head of the aisle with a wafer and wine / grape juice. Those who prefer to continue to receive communion individually may do so as they feel comfortable.

The task force continues to monitor trends and numbers to keep the congregation informed and safe. Any updates will be communicated as they develop. Most of all, the COVID task force and Pastor Jennifer wish to express their gratitude for the love displayed in the congregation's willingness to observe the increased protocols for the months of January and February.

Witness & Outreach

Greetings RLC Family!

As Outreach Chair I have been busy both in the community and here at home. I was chosen last year to serve as the Congregation Coordinator for Lutheran Disaster Recovery. I have been attending 2 to 4 meetings weekly on various sub committees for Long Term Recovery. This includes Allocations Table, where we were generously granted funds for me to distribute to the survivors who need help rebuilding. It is sad at times, stressful at times, but mostly gratifying knowing that I am helping to make our fellow Newnan resident's lives whole again. There is still so much to do, but this is a marathon, not a sprint. Once RLC donated all the gift cards last year, it became my job to figure out what to do with them. I came up with the idea of a Welcome Home Basket. These are for the residents who have used Long Term Recovery to rebuild and are now home. They may have a new home, but nothing inside. We have had one basket distributed so far, but starting April 14th , we will be attending 2 ribbon cuttings every Thursday through June 2nd . I could use help with packing the baskets, buying any extras they may request and even attending the ribbon cuttings. We were given a large donation of brand-new Ikea home furnishings, like dishes, kitchen goods, etc. which we can add to the basket, along with one of our gift cards and a hand painted blessing by our Pastor Jennifer. (The donation included 8x10 picture frames perfect for the painting!)

Our Little Free Food Pantry is serving our neighbors, especially with rising food costs. I appreciate every single item you have donated and all of you who have helped to keep is filled. (Shout out to Sandy and David Israel, Brenda Allen, Susan and Sophie Widdowson, Mary Childs and Helvi Jalonen for helping keep the pantry full!) We can use help in being a weekly or monthly filler, who just once or twice a week, checks the pantry and fills it as needed. We also could use some folks who can drive to Bridging the Gap, as they have offered to supply us with large donations of food! If you are wanting to give food to the pantry, please keep a few things in mind: please give Mac and Cheese that does not require milk or butter to cook. They may not have those. Please consider canned or microwavable Chef Boyardee type pasta meals, as they have some protein and are easy to make. Pasta sauce and pasta is great, but try to get canned sauce, like Hunts, rather than jars of glass in case of breakage. Instant potatoes, canned gravy and ramen are great, along with granola bars, lance crackers, small boxes of cereal and pudding or fruit cups. One item I like for us to always have cake mixes and canned frosting. This may be the only way they can afford a birthday cake for a child. Again, thank you help in assisting those in need!

Food Truck Friday Nights will be coming back starting May 13th! We have made a few date adjustments and are hoping to add more entertainment to the evening with small musical groups and maybe even Karaoke! We would love to have you join in planning or hosting. We have some great new trucks coming this summer, including a Funnel Cake truck, Caribbean Truck, local Pizza Truck and several new dessert trucks that specialize in Belgium Waffles or Churros and more! Stay tuned for a full season flyer with all the dates, themes and trucks!

Do you work with a non-profit? I would like to know so RLC can help to support you! I now have access to where you could get grants for your passion or maybe we can find RLC Family that would like to join you in your ministry! Please email me and let me know so we can add it to our list of ways we can help our community!

Finally, Fellowship is back! Now that the pandemic is easing, it is time to get some events planned for us to be together. If you have any ideas or would like to help in planning a fellowship event, please contact me. Property

On February 26th our congregation hosted a church workday. Our main focus for this day was organizing storage areas, cleaning up clutter to make space for improvements, and organizing the children's room. Thanks to all that came out to help on this day! We made great progress, but still have much to accomplish.

The property team has been busy this quarter with several building issues that require our attention as the church continues to open more fully. The first is our ongoing issue with the leaking of ceiling/windows in the sanctuary. Headley construction has been contacted to review damage. Our insurance company assessed the building, and no damage was caused from the tornado, and they referred us back to Headley. Another place we are spending attention is our security issues which require us to look at replacing the front doors.

Finally, painting has started to freshen up the inside of the church. Fred Buyarski has been contracted to do this work and a generous, anonymous donor has provided the paint. The work will include patching holes or damage throughout the building too. This project will last for a few months.

Publicity & Marketing

After two years of limited use, there are things popping up throughout the property that will need resources directed toward them. The Stewardship Team will be working over the next year to identify the kind of capital campaign our congregation will take part in and the various needs and areas that will be addressed.

^{*}The month of January was hard for RLC (and many other congregations) as the Omicron spike of COVID reduced the number of people attending in person worship. Due to weather, the congregation worshipped completely online one Sunday. Additionally, due to a miscommunication regarding a benefits invoice, the large deficit number is also the result of paying 3 months of a bill at one time. These combined factors resulted in January being an abnormal month.
