### Pastor's Page

Happy New Year, Resurrection Family!

My hope and prayer is that this quarterly newsletter finds you beginning a new year open to what God is doing in and around you! A new year is often an invitation to reflect on the previous year, with all its joys and sorrows, accomplishments and disappointments. This space is holy ground because it invites us into honest conversation with God and ourselves, holding in tension gratitude, grief, and grace.

However, the new year is also an invitation to hope and be bold in our faith as we prayerfully discern how God will lead, transform, and call us into new adventures within ourselves and among family, friends, our congregation, and community!

Yesterday, was the day of Epiphany, a day when the church remembers the arrival of the wise men to visit the holy family, bringing their gifts to the Christ child. The day of Epiphany and the short season that follows focuses on a theme of light, the light that the wise men followed to find Christ and the light that shines within and around us as we continue to follow God in our own lives.

It is interesting to me that both the occasion of a new year and the celebration of Epiphany occur within a week of one another, as an invitation to see how both inform and invite us into the continued mysteries of God's presence and promise in our lives.

So, in this new year and Epiphany season, I have found this quote from theologian Walter Brueggemann to be a place of reflection, prayer, and hope. Perhaps these words are also inviting you on this journey too ...

"On Epiphany day, we are still the people walking. We are still people in the dark and the darkness looms large around us, beset as we are by fear, anxiety, brutality, violence, loss – a dozen alienations that we cannot manage. We are – we could be - people of your light. So we pray for the light of your glorious presence as we wait for your appearing; we pray for the light of your wondrous grace as we exhaust our coping capacity; we pray for your gift of newness that will override our weariness; we pray that we may see and know and hear and trust in your good rule. That we may have energy, courage, and freedom to enact your rule through the demands this day (this year). We submit our day (year) to you and to your rule, with deep joy and high hope."

Beloved, this new year personally and as a congregation will be a beautiful testimony to God's work and love and I am so grateful and honored to be on this journey with you all!



The COVID-19 task force continues to keep an eye on the trends and numbers statewide for Georgia and is monitoring recommended protocols as there are developments.

Currently, the task force is monitoring the numbers following the holiday season and gatherings among friends and families. Given the recent spike in cases and the transmissibility of the Omicron variant, the task force asks that anyone who is unvaccinated wear a mask to worship and any other church activities. If you are fully vaccinated the task force highly encourages you to mask in worship and at other church activities. As always, practicing precautions that will continue to keep you safe is also highly recommended and those include frequent hand washing, distancing when able, and joining us online if you feel unwell.

As winter settles in, it is good to be aware of illness trends, both COVID-19 related and others such as the flu and respiratory viruses. If you wake up not feeling well or are running a fever, the task force asks that you worship from home or attend events via Zoom until you are feeling better, the fever is gone for 24 hours, or you have a negative test result.

As always, part of loving our neighbor is making sure that we are doing our part to not spread germs and to make the church a place where all can gather safely. Thank you all for your continued efforts to show love in this way!

The Worship Team has been active over the past quarter at RLC. In-Person worship has continued the past several months, with attendance generally increasing from Reformation Sunday through the end of the year. We also have continued to offer live-streaming of our services. Members have served in worship by singing in the choir, serving as readers, serving as worship assistants, and serving as ushers. The past 3 months have been rewarding with all the things we do. Most of our members are aware of what our team does for others. Just a quick review for those who are not aware: meal train provides for those in need of meals following surgery, prayer shawls for cancer victims, prayer vigils (generally multiple times per year), individual prayers said for those or with those requesting it, and a weekly written prayer list to keep us on our toes (or better said, on our knees).

The Meal Train is a process whereby our parishioners provide meals either by cooking them or providing a restaurant delivered meal. This service includes options for those with diet restrictions or allergies. It is a very helpful service for when the family requires assistance and gives others an opportunity to enjoy serving others in need.

Prayer shawls are knitted, crocheted, sewn, quilted, and created by those in our congregation. These shawls are used over the shoulders or lap which bring joy to the recipient as prayers are said for them as they are created. By the way, we need volunteers to create more shawls. If you are interested or looking for more information, please call us.

The prayer vigils that took place over the last quarter included remembering in our prayers Mike Twomey, the hurricanes in Haiti, a thanksgiving vigil for all the things we are grateful for, and the Stations of the Nativity.

If you want or need prayer, please call us. We maintain confidentiality whenever you want it kept that way. Some people choose to be placed on the weekly prayer list so others not on the care and prayer team can pray. However, there are some who do not wish to be placed on that list.

The committee members consist of Ish Rios, Peter Anderson, John Setzer and George Arnold. Pastor Katie was very influential in moving this committee forward and I would like to thank her. Since we "restarted" inhouse worship we have renewed the stewardship aspect of our congregation. During the fall drive for the campaign, we had several congregation members share stories of faith and their personal interactions with ministers from their past. With the help of Pastor Mike Ward and his staff at "Stewardship For All Seasons" we were able to put together a campaign to raise awareness as well as funds to obtain a full-time pastor. 

#### We plan to be BACK IN-PERSON for AFFIRM 2022!!! June 12-17, 2022 University of West Alabama, Livingston, AL

Affirm is a Summer Youth Event of the ELCA Southeastern Synod *typically* held at the **University of West Alabama in Livingston, Alabama**. Affirm nurtures faith, equips youth leaders for today and tomorrow, and trains youth in discipleship skills. Affirm is for youth who have completed grades 6-12 and the Young Adult and Youth Ministry Institute (YAYMI) is held simultaneously with AFFIRM For college freshman and sophomores interested in exploring a call to youth ministry. Affirm is based on 10 different age-appropriate leadership and discipleship units. Each of these units are staffed by small group leaders and a pair of unit directors. Youth will spend about 6 hours each day in experiential learning with games, skits, and discussion.
