Like Alina, **Giselle Dew** bought her Hamish as a pet but now he has become her first show dog. Under the tutelage of Paul La Fontaine, she has been grooming him herself.

Dew also attended her 1st dog show, the All Terrier Club of Western Washington. But she chose a different route than Oleg and Alina. She decided to jump, feet first, into showing and showed her Hamish herself.

With her nerves in check, she showed to Breeder Judge Kathy Brown. She entered the 12-18 class and Novice Dog Class. "I didn't know I was suppose to enter only one class. I thought I would get more experience if I showed him both classes," she said with a laugh. And she did get more practice, winning both classes.

Regarding showing her Scottie, she said, "I thought it was great fun in most respects. But, I was really nervous. Hamish isn't from champion stock, and I'm pretty old to be just starting out at this. But if you don't try, you can't learn," she said.

Continuing, she said Kathy Brown was a great person to show to for the first time. "She was really nice and gave me some great info and pointers. I learned a lot about being in the ring and by watching the other handlers. Kathy said to throw my bait or a piece of chicken in front of him when walking in the ring, I saw Danica do it as well, but I don't know why? (Editor's Note: It gets the dog's attention and helps to show off the arch of the neck).

Giselle said she was grateful to the members of the club who supported her at the show. "I felt a kind of comradery with them that you don't get anywhere else. They were so helpful in so many ways," she said. "I enjoyed seeing the other Scotties and watching the handlers.

I particularly want to thank Paul La Fontaine. He has been so helpful and has taken so much of his time teaching me how to strip and groom him and we have had practice sessions on walking and handling him. I have learned so much and there is still so much to learn. He has been invaluable

I would tell the next new person to take handling classes. They helped Hamish learn what was expected of him. I learned not to over-think it and not to stress out too much. "It is, after all, only a 2-minute walk!"

Oleg Dolgikh and his wife **Alina Briazgunova** have never attended a dog show. That is until the All Terrier Club of Western Washington Group Show on July 5.

"When I took Hamish to his first dog show in Puyallup, it was the first-ever dog show for me too. What an experience I had!" Alina said with a smile on her face. "I've been taking Hamish to handling classes on Wednesday evenings. We learned a lot in the classes and made some new friends as well."

"I didn't think we were ready, but club president Vandra Huber said are grooming looked great. She said there were two routes to success. I could either show Hamish myself or use a professional handler for the first show and watch how it done. Oleg and I chose to use a handler. "

Continuing, Alina said she was surprised by how big and well-organized the show was. "Everything ran so smoothly. Busy owners and handlers getting their dogs ready in the grooming pavilion seemed like a well-orchestrated symphony—buzzing blow dryers, clouds of powder applied to make white dogs even whiter, and the smell of hairspray.

"Actually, I was surprised by the use of hairspray, as in Northern Europe, they don't use it at all. Sea salt spray and some hair conditioner, like cholesterol, are the only things that can be used on dogs' coats."

Hamish was shown by a professional handler, Baylee Lewis. She found her approach to the dog in minutes—some cheese and a lot of love, and their bond was built. When it was time to move to the show pavilion, I was shocked by how big it was also. SO many show rings operated simultaneously (There were 16 rings).

At that point, I was also impressed with the handlers' outfits. They were smartly dressed, with polished and fancy looks. It felt like a fashion show running alongside the dog show. Time flew by while meeting new people and talking to club members.

I'm so pleased with how Hamish managed his first show. He trotted beautifully alongside the handler and didn't mind the extra attention. Now, he's a true show dog, earning his first points and ribbons.

I'm incredibly grateful for the help and support I received from fellow Scottish Terrier Club members during my first-ever dog show., she said, adding that they will be back for more. Next time, Alina will show Hamish herself.


Acupuncture Relieves Pain

Acupuncture targets specific areas of your dog's body to help relieve pain. It is shown to be most effective for conditions like hip dysplasia, ACL injuries, osteoarthritis, allergies, immune disorders, and bladder and gastrointestinal disorders. This treatment is low-risk, and involves needles being inserted into the body at points where your dog's nerves and blood vessels come closely together. This is usually an ongoing treatment, used in addition to other pain relief practices.

In traditional Oriental medicine, "Chi" ran through channels (called meridians), which can be thought of as rivers of energy. The rivers can become blocked like a dam, and needling releases the obstruction. In modern scientific terms, needling specific points leads to the release of chemicals in the muscles, spinal cord, and brain. These chemical mediators can change the perception of pain and lead to release of other chemical mediators that influence organ function. This improved "chemical communication" stimulates healing

Put another way, acupuncture for dogs can help reduce pain by causing the body to release cytokines, which are signals that help control inflammation of the muscles. There are many approaches to treatment, but veterinarians are the only acupuncture professionals trained to understand both the traditional Oriental as well as the scientific aspects of acupuncture therapy in animals. When choosing an acupuncturist for your dog, you'll want to make sure they are a certified veterinary acupuncturist (CVA). To get a list of certified canine acupuncturists, check out the referral list on the [American Academy of Veterinary Acupuncturists](#) website. There are 53 certified AAVA members in Washington State.
