



**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** That the Tribal Business Council hereby formally opposes the commercialization of peyote/mescaline in any form; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That Tribal Business Council requests meaningful consultation prior to the enactment of any legislation or regulatory policy regarding psychedelic substances; and

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED,** That Tribal Business Council affirms peyote/mescaline as a sacred medicine of the people, not a recreational substance, and commits to its spiritual protection, ecological preservation, and intergenerational respect.


### CERTIFICATION

**RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE  
THREE AFFILIATED TRIBES OF THE  
FORT BERTHOLD INDIAN RESERVATION**

**A Resolution Entitled, “*Resolution to Affirm the Sacred Status of Peyote (Lophophora Williamsii)/Mescaline and Oppose its Inclusion in any Commercialization Efforts.*”**

- WHEREAS,** The Mandan Hidatsa and Arikara Nation (MHA Nation), also known as the Three Affiliated Tribes, having accepted the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, the authority under said Act, and having adopted a Constitution and By-laws (the Constitution) under said Act, and
- WHEREAS,** Pursuant to Article III, Section 1 of the Constitution, the Tribal Business Council is the governing body of the MHA Nation; and
- WHEREAS,** The Constitution authorizes and empowers the Tribal Business Council to engage in activities on behalf of and in the interest of the welfare and benefit of the MHA Nation and of the enrolled members thereof; and
- WHEREAS,** The MHA Nation is a sovereign Indigenous Nation with the inherent right to protect its sacred traditions, medicines and ceremonial practices; and
- WHEREAS,** Peyote (*Lophophora Williamsii*)/Mescaline has been used for thousands of years by Indigenous Peoples in sacred ceremonies for healing, prayer, and spiritual guidance; and
- WHEREAS,** The American Indian Religious Freedom Act (AIRFA) and associated federal statutes recognize the legal right of Native American Church members to use peyote/mescaline in bona fide religious ceremonies; and
- WHEREAS,** The increasing efforts to commercialize psychedelic substances, including psilocybin, at the state level pose an ecological, spiritual, and cultural threat to peyote and Indigenous religious sovereignty; and
- WHEREAS,** Wild peyote/mescaline populations are already endangered due to over harvesting and habitat destruction, and further access could lead to extinction and loss of sacred knowledge; and
- WHEREAS,** The Tribal Business Council finds that any attempt to regulate and commercialize peyote/mescaline without full consultation and free, prior, and informed consent from sovereign tribal nations constitutes a violation of tribal sovereignty and treaty rights.
