

Fernwood Financial Investment Update

Recently a few board members (Michele, Sonia, and Teri) along with past board members Scott McKern and Patricia Baker met in person with our Edward Jones account manager for our annual account review. Heath Cornick; our local Edward Jones account manager explained for our "long-term investment goals" we have a mix of stocks and bonds in the Franklin family in the low-medium risk category. He did advise us to consider moving more of our "excess" funds currently kept in our checking and savings to an Edward Jones government money market fund which is currently paying 4.8% interest. If we ever need to access this it can be deposited directly into our US Bank checking account. We will discuss this at the upcoming annual meeting. We will continue to meet annually with Heath to review the account activity.

You may be curious as to how someone from Pendleton in Eastern Oregon became a Fernwood Cemetery Board member. After much loving persistence on the part of Ron Parrish, I acquiesced to becoming part of the board. I am so very impressed with all the people that are involved with the cemetery and its care and operation! I live in Sheridan with my husband; we are both retired educators. After becoming involved with Fernwood, we were delighted to purchase our niche, with a view of peaceful beautiful Fernwood.

Member at Large: Ladd Brothers

My wife Donna and I are longtime residents of Newberg. When I was asked to serve on the Fernwood Pioneer Cemetery Board this past year, it was with a great sense of honor and pleasure that I accepted the role. The cemetery means a great deal to us because members of our family are interred there, including my Great, Great Grandfather and Grandmother, Sebastian and Mary Everest Brutscher. They are the founding members off Newberg. I want to help to preserve this cemetery for family connections, the history and the sense of peace it provides.

Member at Large: Sonia French

My partner Mark Raia and I relocated to Newberg, OR in April of 2021, which was a new town for us. Initially, we didn't have any acquaintances or family in the area. After a few months, we started to meet new people and make friends. One of our newfound friends is Ronald W. Parrish. Ron realized that I had a last name that matched a Fernwood Pioneer family and was convinced that we were related. Having access to the Ancestry Family Search website I ran a query to see if I was related to one Robert Augustus French. I thought it might be a long shot to find a connection since the last name French is quite common, similar to Miller or Davis. As it turns out, my initial assumption was correct - I am not related to Mr. French. However, I discovered something quite surprising - I am distantly related to his wife, Margaret Anna Embree. Margaret was born on September 8th, 1875 in Montgomery, Iowa, United States, and she passed away on September 21st, 1964 in Newberg. She is my 12th cousin through my Paternal Grandfather's family, whom I have never known. I am thrilled to join my newly discovered cousins on the Board today. Finding out that I had family, even if they were distant, in the area gave me quite a thrill. I then tried searching for Mark's name on FamilySearch.org and ran a search on Ronald W. Parrish as well. Sure enough, we found another relationship, as Mark turned out to be an 8th cousin to Ron! All of this seems rather fitting, as Mark and I moved into a small apartment in an area formerly known as Fernwood. We became member volunteers at the Fernwood Grange #770 in 2022, I became a member of the Fernwood Pioneer Cemetery Board in 2023, and we both joined the Newberg Charitable Organization's Thrift Shop volunteer core, also in 2023. We have tried searches for a few other long-term families in the area, but it is the Fernwood Pioneer Cemetery lineage to which we are related. It is truly amazing how our paths have led us to this tight-knit community, and it is clear that fate has played a role in our journey. Additionally, it appears that Ronald W. Parrish has a keen ability to identify his family members at a glance only God could have graced him with this special gift of natural intuition.

Member at Large: Sharon Lucas

My Grandpa and Granny were Wallace and Ruth Jones. Grandpa's parents homesteaded in Newberg. They and more than twenty other Jones family members are in Fernwood. The Jones family has connections to the Parishes and the Shucks of Newberg, going back generations. My Grandpa was amazing and an avid learner. Growing up, we had a treehouse with rings at our home in Damascus. In his seventies, Grandpa could do flips on the rings. The creative bug runs deep in my family. Grandpa learned to paint, hook rugs, crochet, do bead work and, in his later years, wrote a small book about life growing up in Newberg. My mom could do all of those things, except do flips. My brother, myself and our son all enjoy doing artistic things. My Granny was also creative and one of her relatives was a silversmith for Napolean Bonaparte. I feel an attachment to Fernwood as many of my family members are buried there. Two years ago in 2021, we lost our son, Eric, at 42 years old. We wanted him to be buried at Fernwood to be with family. Dave and I will also join Eric there some day. I currently live Wilsonville with my husband Dave. I retired in 2018 after 37 years of working at Freightliner/Daimler.

Each lot can contain 1 burial; 1 burial and 1 cremation; or 2 cremations

Second Right Burial fee is when there is a request to have cremains buried with an already purchased lot. It was not planned for in the original purchase.

Property Manager Report

This past 6 months have slowed down for me as Property Manager. We haven't had any services and only one plot purchase. I've made a commitment to update the sign board each October with any changes. I went through all our files to identify every military loved one buried in Fernwood and was surprised we have 41 to celebrate and give thanks for their service.

Update on the recent grant we received to purchase supplies and update the chain link fencing on the left side of the cemetery - all supplies have been purchased and the clearing of branches completed. I ran into a slight snag when contacting a fence contractor to help with the slats. It seems our fence is a bit worn-out and has no support rails needed to help support slats so I'm in the process off gathering pricing for a full/partial replacement or looking at other options such as wood. I feel our #1 goal should be what will last the longest for the future of Fernwood. We will be discussing options at the upcoming annual meeting.

We were recently audited by the Oregon Mortuary & Cemetery Board. It included on-site facility inspection, document review and permanent records review. I have to show all our current forms, records of the last four plot/niche sales and the last four interments. This type of audit is mandatory every two years. We just got word we passed with no violations!! Please if you have opportunity to inspire any of our younger generation to get involved with the cemetery encourage them to attend the upcoming annual meeting on May 18th. That is the key to assuring we will always have an active board of directors to look out for the future of Fernwood.

Treasurers Report as of March 29, 2024

Checking: \$12,855.00 Savings: \$8355.34

Edward Jones: \$41,419.81

Monetary Donations: \$10,270.00

In Memory or Honor of Donations: \$300.00 Goods & Services Donations: \$119.15

Since the last report in Nov. '23 we've experienced no out-of-the-norm expenses. We used \$1659.76 of our Grant Funds for some planned "extensive" clean-up along the left fence line and we also purchased "grounds supplies"; which leaves \$1590.24 in that fund. With the Boards recent approval, I have transferred those remaining Grant Funds and the generous donation of \$3000 for "1 Year Lawn Maintenance" from our Checking Account to our Savings Account so they no longer appear as general funds; I believe this will also help to ensure these funds are set aside for their intended uses. And lastly, I am happy to report that our Edward Jones Investments have been on the rise. In May '23 we invested an additional \$5000. Our account has grown to \$41,419.81.
