

## Pastor's Message

Happy New Year!! Happy New **Fiscal** Year. I doubt anyone stayed up until midnight on June 30 to ring in the New Fiscal year but none the less we began a new fiscal year on July 1. In this issue of VOICES you will find the end of the year financial numbers for 2018-19 fiscal year as well as a new budget for the 2019-20 fiscal year. I want to use this opportunity to once again thank everyone for their response to the letter that I sent out as we neared the end of the fiscal year. At that time if we had continued on the course we were on we would have ended the budget year \$60,000 behind budget which would have affected our ability to pay some annual expenses that come in the first of July. Thank you for prayerfully considering my letter because several came forward with very generous one time donations and others changed their regular giving to help down the road. We were able to end the Fiscal Year ahead of budget and well situated for the current fiscal year. Thank you for your generous response.



The big news this past year was the retirement of Fr. Tony Shonis. He began speaking about retiring early in the year. Many people that I encountered in the parish would ask if he was REALLY going to retire and after he began to pack up and give away most of his books to the Brescia University Library, I knew that it was true. Many ideas surfaced about living quarters for after he retired and finally a house in Henderson became available and the decision was made. We had a wonderful pot-luck dinner with the Men's Club providing pork chops. The gym was full with family, friends, parishioners, and others. We celebrated our last Faith Quest with the committee shutting down as Fr. Shonis retires. We may see some of the events but not the week-long event. We thank Fr. Shonis for his wonderful ministry at Holy Name and we look forward to his living in the community and his desire to be a part of the parish.

The Youth Group, Religious Education families and the Hispanic community have for years taken care of the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen one Saturday a month. We decided to open up that opportunity to other groups in the parish and it has been a wonderful opportunity for many people. The parish staff, the parish council, the Men's Club, the Knights of Columbus and several other groups or committees in the parish have taken part throughout the year. The school has called upon their hoUSe system to offer opportunities for families from various hoUSes. A hoUSe was selected for a month, they would minister at an all school mass, the older students would go to the Salvation Army to serve at the Soup Kitchen one day during the school day and the families were invited to come together with their teacher sponsors to cover the Saturday serving. The Soup Kitchen is a wonderful ministry that helps us all to remember the many blessings that we have and to put a face on the needy in our midst.

So as the Fiscal year came to an end, we moved one priest out of the Rectory and welcomed to the parish, Fr. Gary Clark. Fr. Gary is originally from the Leitchfield, KY area and comes to Holy Name after serving in Bowling Green at St. Joseph Parish. We look forward to his ministry here at Holy Name Parish. Scottie Koonce announced at the end of last school year that he wanted to return to the class room and to have more time with his family. Scottie provided two wonderful years of leadership at Holy Name School and we wish him all the best. We welcome a new principal to Holy Name School as the school year begins. A new principal but a very well known and friendly face, Judy Jenkins. Judy has taught for many years and is well known as a Kindergarten teacher. We are very excited for Judy to take over the helm at school. She is well known and respected with the faculty, teachers, parents and students. We are looking forward to a great school year.

Last year I ended my message speaking about the Alles Estate and so I will conclude this time with the same. As we are all aware the Alles Furniture Business and buildings sold and it is wonderful to see the store reopened by relatives of Herman and Mary Frances Alles. We are still waiting for the estate to be fully resolved and we will keep you informed as we move along.

Once again, I thank the parish for a wonderful year and I continue to look forward for the year to come. Thanks for all the parish and let us continue to pray for one another.



#### **EXPLANATIONS OF PARISH FUNDS: THEIR USES AND HOW THEY ARE FUNDED**

The Parish Operating Fund: This account pays for the normal operations of the parish, providing for salaries, benefits, utilities, phone bills, postage, and computer services as well as routine maintenance such as mowing, snow removal, waxing floors, light bulbs, and filters. In addition, it pays all expenses necessary to operate the many ministries available in the parish.

The Parish Operating Fund account is funded by collections. Annually, a budget is prepared based on an estimate of the operating expenses and this determines the amount needed in collections for the coming year. It is through these collections that the many ministries are made possible.

The last three years has made it necessary to use up cash flow reserves as collections have been under budget. At the beginning of April 2019 with some large expenses coming due, the cash was at a very low balance and collections were under budget. A plea was made to the parishioners to prepare for this shortfall and as always, the parishioners responded with enough to cover the deficit.

In June, the parish received the final settlement of the Mary Francis Alles Estate totaling \$370,000. While estate money is normally placed in the Plant Fund for future expenditures, due to the lack of reserves for the General Operations, it was decided to keep these funds in the General Operations Fund.

<u>The Parish Plant Fund</u>: This account pays for capital expenditures. Capital expenditures are items for all properties: church, school, St. Margaret Chapel, convent, including building repairs and improvements, land and parking improvements, possible land purchases, large furniture and equipment repairs and purchases. A "plant fund" monthly envelope is provided however these larger items required additional funding. The parish is depended upon receiving estates and memorials for these major expenses.

<u>The Cemetery Fund:</u> This account pays for all expenses of the St. Louis Cemetery. These expenses would include: lawn maintenance, road improvements, and landscaping, fencing, and computer expenses. The cemetery is self-supporting. As to date, the sale of grave spaces have been enough to maintain the property.

**Food Pantry:** This investment account is solely for maintaining the food pantry. Withdraws are made annually for the amount needed to purchase food for the pantry.
