A Letter from the Pastor

As I reflect on this past year, the one thing that stands out is the faithfulness of our parish family. Through the pandemic, with all the uncertainty and confusion, I always felt the support and faith of the community. Even though it was greatly distressing when the parish had to shut down completely, the parish was able to transition to new ways of worship and remained faithful. When able to reopen and return to mass with strict restrictions, the parish responded with concern for the health and safety of all. With the reinstatement of mass obligation, with fewer restrictions, the parishioners once again responded and have filled the pews, once more. While still missing some, I understand that there are parishioners who still feel uncomfortable due health reasons and I ask that you please keep them in your prayers. I am also concerned that we may have lost some for a whole variety of reasons and I ask that you join me in praying for those who no longer worship with us, that they will come home.

You may have noticed the recent construction work going on around the parish. I want to catch everybody up on what has been accomplished and what is in the works.

- **Rectory:** We have renovated 3 ½ bathrooms, Fr. Gary, Fr. Maury, the Guest Room and a powder room on the first floor. Two of these bathrooms were in small closets and the other two were exactly as they were when I was here 30+ years ago. We also took the opportunity to open up Fr. Maury's bedroom to an old office to increase the size of the room.
- **Front Entry of Church:** Due to the poor condition of the front steps and the difficulty of bringing a body in for a funeral, changes were made to the front entrance. Tim Skinner's new design provided a ramp and a gathering area outside the doors. AVP Construction completed the job and with the assistance of Gary Caton, Caton Electric, the ramp can be heated to remove snow and ice. Shortly, after completion of the beautiful entrance, the new roofing project began with the installation of the scaffolding.
- New Roof for the Church: After years of buckets, small areas of ceiling falling in, and spot fixing the roof, it has become time to replace the entire roof. The scaffolding continues to dominate the Henderson skyline. While the scaffolding was up, we took the opportunity, or should I say Brad Eadens took the opportunity to sand and repaint the cross. The steeple is finished and the process of removing the roofing off the body of the Church has begun. The next step is to remove the scaffolding from the steeple area so that all the old roofing can be removed and begin replacing it with new roofing. A surprising discovery was made in the midst of the roofing project. The existing roof looked like copper and patinas like copper but was NOT copper. It is a metal roof with two very fine layers of copper on either side. While this does not affect the removal of the roof, the project will be unable to recoup the \$50,000 to \$60,000 for recycled copper, as originally expected. The roofing on the parish hall, which is actually cooper, is also being replaced and will be recycled. Hopefully, a few more months and we will have a beautiful new roof on the church and parish hall and no more leaks.
- **Grounding the Buildings:** The parish has experienced two lightning strikes in the last ten years with significant damage, each time. With all the available scaffolding, it seemed a good time to investment in getting the buildings grounded. When this project is complete, our buildings will have Master Certification of grounding and protection.
- **St. Margaret Chapel:** Due to a mold issue and wear & tear at the Chapel, a project to treat/remove the mold and repaint the interior has been completed.
- **Multipurpose Room:** In the multipurpose room, the ceiling of the youth room and bathrooms were reinforced and steps added to provide additional storage for the parish. Thanks to a grant from the Welborn Foundation and Shannon Long, our Faith Community Nurse, a new sound and projection system was added which allowed livestreaming of Masses during the pandemic and various future programs.
- The Alles Estate: On Wednesday, July 21, 2021 the parish received the Final Settlement of the Herman C. Alles Estate. As of Monday, July 19, 2021, \$6,813,696.66 was distributed to Holy Name Parish. After the 10% cathedraticum (this is the amount paid to the Diocese), \$6,132,326.99 was credited to a Holy Name Parish account designated and restricted by Herman Alles' will, to be used for future maintenance and building projects for Holy Name Parish. This \$6.1 million dollars is made up of the sale of Mr. Alles Home, the sale of the Alles Furniture Business and Buildings, the liquidation of bonds and other assets, and the sale of 3 parcels of the farm land. The Diocese has instructed Holy Name to also put onto the books the estimated value of the rest of the farm land, \$8,928,500 plus a pending stock sell, valued at \$363,132. A Farm Manager with Field & Main will help administer the plan to sell the remaining farm land over the next three years in three auctions. By policy of the Diocese, the money will be held in a Diocesan Inter-Parish Deposit and Loan Fund and will earn 1.5% interest.



EXPLANATIONS OF PARISH FUNDS: THEIR USES AND HOW THEY ARE FUNDED

The Parish Operating Fund: This account pays for the normal operations of the parish, providing for salaries, benefits, utilities, phone bills, postage, and computer services as well as routine maintenance such as mowing, snow removal, waxing floors, light bulbs, and filters. In addition, it pays all expenses necessary to operate the many ministries available in the parish.

The Parish Operating Fund account is funded by collections. Annually, a budget is prepared based on an estimate of the operating expenses and this determines the amount needed in collections for the coming year. It is through these collections that the many ministries are made possible.

Because of Covid-19, collections have been down since March and collections ended under budget \$199,772.00. The shut down of ministries due to Covid-19 led to expenses being under budget. The decision was made to continue salaries during this time. The Owensboro Diocese applied for a PPP grant and the parish was awarded \$104,320.00 to assist with salaries.


<u>The Parish Plant Fund:</u> This account pays for capital expenditures. Capital expenditures are items for all properties: church, school, St. Margaret Chapel, convent, including building repairs and improvements, land and parking improvements, possible land purchases, large furniture and equipment repairs and purchases. A "plant fund" monthly envelope is provided however these larger items required additional funding. The parish is depended upon receiving estates and memorials for these major expenses.

The Cemetery Fund: This account pays for all expenses of the St. Louis Cemetery. These expenses would include: lawn maintenance, road improvements, and landscaping, fencing, and computer expenses. The cemetery is self-supporting. As to date, the sale of grave spaces have been enough to maintain the property.

Food Pantry: This investment account is solely for maintaining the food pantry. Withdraws are made annually for the amount needed to purchase food for the pantry.
