A Letter from the Pastor

Greetings,

With this report generated by Holy Name Parish staff, we give an accounting to the Church of our parish stewardship. The Lord Jesus Christ entrusts himself to us in Word and in Sacrament along with giving us family, earthly resources, personal talents, and graces in the Holy Spirit beyond measure. Only some of the fruits of these gifts can be measured or described in metrics. Having employed God's gifts for our neighbors' benefit and God's glory we offer here a limited description of our service "to the praise of God's glory."

Ours is a Eucharistic attitude of self-sacrifice. It is how the Christian lives out the gift of Jesus Christ received in the living Sacrament of his Body and Blood. While from the earliest days, the Lord's Supper or Mass was celebrated in the assembly of the Faithful, it was lived out as an ongoing, living sacrifice in their homes and villages, in their labor, their businesses, on their streets, in their daily lives. The main focus was in their homes where husbands and wives and parents and children were notably different than their non-Christian neighbors. They did not conform to the pagan world around them and it showed. In that light, may I repeat the exhortation of St. Paul in Romans 12— I urge you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect. [Romans 12:1-2] And, may the Lord who has called us to the labor of his Kingdom prosper the work and witness of this Parish in the Most Holy Name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

In a way, you see, you experienced this first year with me. Suffice it to say there are many more things that I can add but in short, I wish to say thank you.

Be assured of my continued prayers for each of you and this parish! I ask that you also pray for me. Remember that building up the kingdom of heaven takes work; it takes you! We need your prayer, your love and your reverence. You make this parish and, I am blessed to be a part of it.



EXPLANATIONS OF PARISH FUNDS: THEIR USES AND HOW THEY ARE FUNDED

<u>The Parish Operating Fund:</u> This account pays for the normal operations of the parish, providing for salaries, benefits, utilities, phone bills, postage, and computer services as well as routine maintenance such as mowing, snow removal, waxing floors, light bulbs, and filters. In addition, it pays all expenses necessary to operate the many ministries available in the parish, the largest of which is the school subsidy. The Parish Operating Fund account is funded by collections. Annually, a budget is prepared based on an estimate of the operating expenses and this determines the amount needed in collections for the coming year. It is through these collections that the many ministries are made possible.


The Parish Plant Fund: This account pays for capital expenditures. Capital expenditures are items for all properties: church, school, St. Margaret Chapel, convent, including building repairs and improvements, land and parking improvements, possible land purchases, large furniture and equipment repairs and purchases. A "plant fund" monthly envelope is provided however these larger items required additional funding. The parish is depended upon receiving estates and memorials for these major expenses.

The Cemetery Fund: This account pays for all expenses of the St. Louis Cemetery. These expenses would include: lawn maintenance, road improvements, and landscaping, fencing, and computer expenses. The cemetery is self-supporting. As to date, the sale of grave spaces have been enough to maintain the property.

Food Pantry: This investment account is solely for maintaining the food pantry. Withdraws are made annually for the amount needed to purchase food for the pantry.

At Holy Name Parish, **Charitable Giving Activities** make a profound difference in the Henderson Community through the Mary & Martha Fund which is funded by 5% of offertory collections. This year, our outreach effort provided a total of \$69,082.42 for assistance with rent, utilities, and food to those in need. The Food Pantry has been enhanced by a generous family who's donation ensures that the Food Pantry is supported for years to come. In addition, Holy Name extends support to various nonprofits, including Marsha's Place, Habitat for Humanity, National Fire and Safety, a small parish in the Diocese and The Fr. The Holy Name Men's Club is a cornerstone of community service and support, boasting a membership of 71 dedicated individuals, with 20-25 actively involved in 2024. Their calendar is filled with impactful activities such as the Fall Festival featuring barbeque chicken, pork chops and fish fries, requiring 24 hours of commitment from many. During Lent, they host six Fridays of fish fries, alongside monthly meetings with meals for members. They contribute significantly to the community through events like community dinners, fundraisers, youth group meals, and church activities like Halloween hot dog meals and RCIA support. Over the years, they have consistently supported Holy Name School with donations, including \$4,000 for athletics and academics, and a recent contribution of \$500 to the Boy Scouts. Their achievements include providing scholarships annually and maintaining essential facilities like banquet tables and chairs. Our ministry extends beyond the parish with involvement in the community at the Salvation Army soup kitchens and with Mission Henderson. Highlights of this year include, integrating our Adult Special Needs Groups in some of our Youth activities and participating in the Thursday morning prayers group at HCHS. Our goal for the upcoming year is to add a retreat to our food giveaway in Steele, MO, which underscores our commitment to service and spiritual growth. The Community Health Nurse ministry continues to expand its impactful parish and community initiatives through community outreach, partnerships, fellowship, grants for the Welborn Foundation and countless volunteers from our parish as well as others faith communities. Some of the programs offered are "Strong People Strong Bodies", low impact exercise 3 times a week; "SoulCore", prayer and stretching various times throughout the year; "Pickleball", introduction to the game; and "ZUMBA" offered at local Nursing Homes and Assisted Living facilities. Monthly breakfast gatherings for HNS parents and students through the "Fruit Moms" program have engaged over 400 individuals, fostering healthy options. Additionally, the church hosts the Red Cross Blood Drive thrice yearly, with enthusiastic participation from 20 to 30 donors each time. Our senior parishioners benefit from regular luncheons
