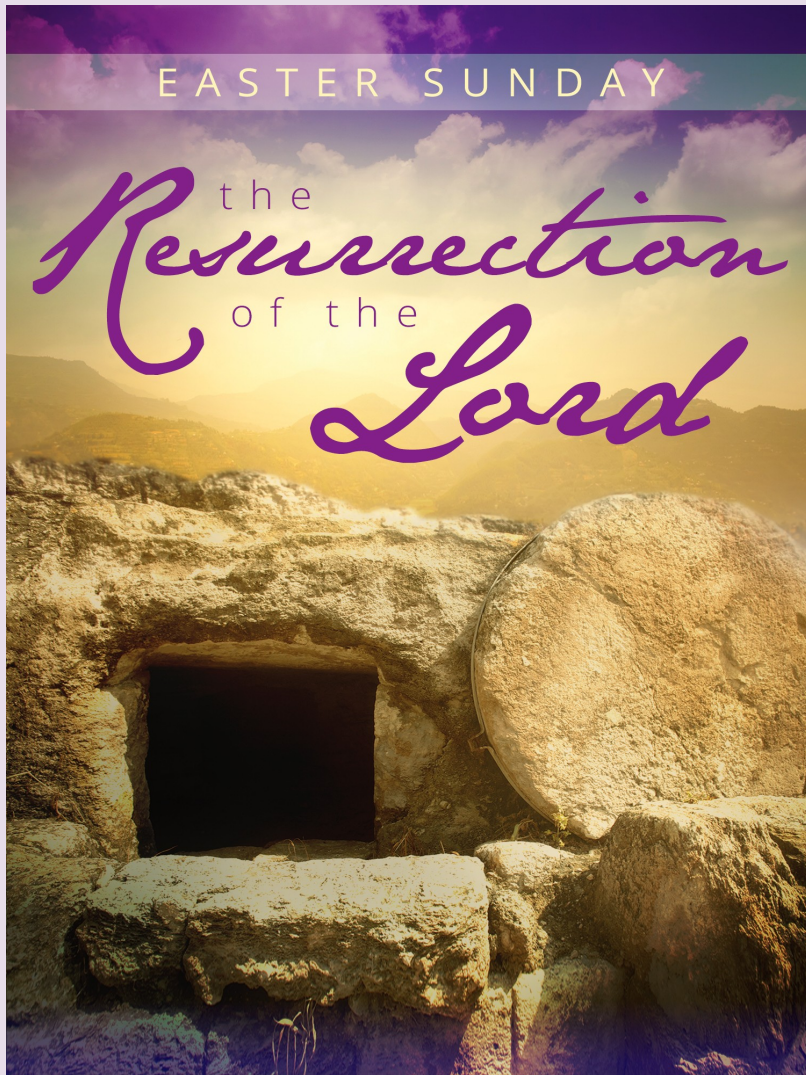

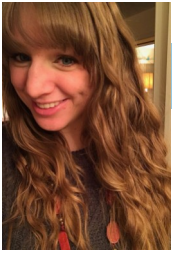

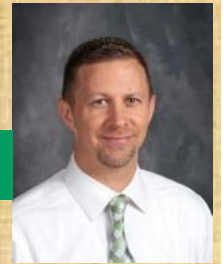

Praying the Psalms *By Frances Summers*

I have always loved the Psalms but did not know a lot about them. I considered them beautiful poetic ideas about all the human conditions.

My friend, Jean Trigg wrote such beautiful poetry about ordinary things she found on the family's farm. She was a published authoress and winner of poetry awards from our local college. My brother "Kitty" had this same gift of seeing beauty in common, daily things but he did it with photography.

At work, my desk had two photographs under the glass top—one of a lone purple thistle flowering

in the dirt by the country road side. The other one, a writing spider's rather large web clinging to a rusty wire fence. Jean put her observations into words and "Kitty" in his photos.

I place the Psalmists of old in this category except, they were inspired by the Holy Spirit. It is in praying the Psalms, singing them and meditating on them that we come to know they are one of the best ways to praise God.

Recently I picked up my copy of Thomas Merton's THE LITTLE BOOK OF PSALMS and read it again. Things jumped out at me from this little book.

The priests' Liturgy of the Hours, that they pray each and every day is composed of almost one-third Psalms.

That the laity should also pray the Psalms and make them a part of their daily prayers. This might be hard at first but by using them we can begin to gain an understanding of them.

That the beautiful MAGNIFICAT composed by the Mother of God was her direct heart-felt response to praying the Psalms every day of her life.
