Welcome to Holy Name of Jesus Church. We are happy that you made us a part of your Christmas celebration. For many of us Christmas holds many wonderful memories. For me I always knew Christmas was truly upon us when the choir sang “Go Tell It On the Mountain” at the end of Midnight Mass. Now we could go home, in my memory with snow falling and Christmas music playing, to put in the final few hours before the wonder and excitement of Christmas morning. In many, many households this moment of wonder and excitement is replayed each year, if not in reality then in memory of long ago Christmases.

Unfortunately for some Christmas may not have good memories just another day with an abusive alcoholic father or a child that is lost to drugs or any of the countless other stories of who we are. For some Christmas memories are tarnished by an empty chair of a loved one who has died. The season seems all the harder because there is almost a mania for people insisting that everyone be happy during this season.

But at the center of the Christmas season is memories of Christmas past. Whether good or bad we tend to be fascinated by the story at the heart of the celebration. A child is born, in a manger for there is no room in the Inn, poor parents in an out of the way place, yet angels sing to shepherds and Wise Men travel a great distance bringing gifts. The innocence and humility of such a monumental moment, a Savior is born and wrapped in swaddling clothes and the first guests are a little sketchy with tales of angels singing. Maybe the fascination with the Christmas story is just that, something so amazing and earth shattering is accomplished in such a humble way.

Jesus, the Emmanuel, God with us, comes not in a palace surrounded by gold and glory, but in a stable open to all surrounded by animals and those who care for them. This amazing story begins with a child being born not a powerful warrior coming onto the scene. The King of Kings is not the head of armies with wealth untold but the child of Mary and Joseph who believed that what God promised them would come to be. This Christmas season let us remember that Jesus is still present in our lives. That he comes to us where we are, he does not insist that we find him or come to him but simply open our hearts and he will be there. 

At HNS there are always activities and opportunities for involvement. Here are things you can look forward to: registration, a St. Patrick's Party, and a 5K color/run







YOUTH GROUP NEWS

The fall semester has come and gone, and again have proven to be very busy, and exciting months for the youth ministry program here at Holy Name Parish. Holy Name High School Youth are currently meeting almost every Sunday night from 6:30-8:30pm.

In August we had an overnight in the multipurpose room with members from St. Jerome in Fancy Farm youth group and went to Holiday World for the Christian Concert. On October 20 and 21 the 7th and 8th grade had their retreat at Gaper River and there were many great prayer experience along with fun and activities and group bonding, there were 81 people in attendance. Owensboro Diocese Youth Conference (ODYC) took place November 9 and 10. There were 24 people from Holy Name in attendance. We went Christmas caroling on December 12 and there were 53 of us split between St. Joes apartments, Colonial, and Redbanks. The youth did amazing, as expected. Prior to going we talked about respect, and how this experience is about more than singing Christmas songs. When we all got back to eat I heard many of them saying very positive things. I loved hearing how they saw God through the elderly that we spent time with.



We recently added one Discipleship small Group. We currently have three groups going, total of around 30 youth in discipleship groups. We are currently working on adding one and possibly two more groups. Discipleship groups give youth who are ready to dive deeper into their relationship with Jesus the opportunity to do so in a smaller group setting and a more flexible schedule.

Our schedules for January-June will be going out soon, so please keep an eye out for those. If you do not receive one and you need one please contact Peyton. We are continuing with many of Holy Name Youth Group traditions, such as Jell-O Olympics, 7th and 8th grade retreat at Gasper River, and Mission Missouri. However, we are also making some changes, one of the big changes is that we are going to be attending one conference and one mission trip in the summer of 2019. The conference will be June 13 -16 and Mission Missouri will be June 23- June 29.

The Salvation Army sponsors a wonderful ministry in our community and part of that ministry is providing a hot noon meal for those in need. They have reached out to other organizations and individuals to help them in this endeavor and Holy Name is happy to have been a part of this ministry for many years. At one time the Good Samaritan Society, the Youth and the Religious Education Program arranged for volunteers.

Now, on the third Saturday of the month, our Latino community provides volunteers and on the fourth Saturday of the month a variety of groups from the parish (Parish Council, Social Action, Men's Club, Knights of Columbus, RCIA.)volunteer. Every group has come away with rich experiences of the blessing received in the service of others.

The truth is that it gives us great joy to bring a little love in the form of food and service to those who need it most, see the faces of Jesus in all of them always fill our hearts with love every time we are going to serve in this ministry," Mrs. Gaby Angeles

"It put a human face on poverty around us. It felt good to be able to serve them and provide a little dignity," Rick Courtney, RCIA

"It was just an overwhelming experience to be able to enter-act with those less fortunate in Henderson County. You just don't always realize how many depend on these type of services to get by on a daily basics. Everyone we encountered where very "Thankful for the hot food". Awesome to get the opportunity to offer them a meal filled with nutrition. And see how much they enjoyed themselves when we served them their meal to the table. Also how all the volunteers came together as a team to accomplish preparing the meal and clean up. We took the time for meet and talk with them. All that attended were appreciative and the children were very well mannered. Just an unexpected blessing to see God's work," Bonnie Drury, RCIA

"It was very humbling and made me appreciate the things I may take for granted every day that some don't have such as a hot meal," Aaron Willett, RCIA

"To me it was a very humbling experience and made me examine my own life in regards to my blessings. I thought that it would be a somewhat sad day- but everyone had a positive attitude and you could feel the spirit in the room. People were grateful and thankful for the blessings," Alisha Perry, RCIA

"It was a great experience working together as a team outside the church office and a wonderful opportunity to see, first hand, the amazing blessing the Salvation Army is to the Henderson Community," the Holy Name Parish Staff

This experience of service has encouraged us to open this opportunity up to our students at Holy Name School. LIVING the Cardinal 10: Recently 8, eighth grade members of the Faith House helped serve lunch. They worked from 10:45am- 1pm, serving 90 people (the kids were shocked about that number). People were incredibly thankful – One even referred to us as God Lovin' people. The students were shocked to see people in their own community with real needs. Someone asked for diapers, food to take home, shelter because they were homeless, etc. The Salvation Army employees were very excited to know that Holy Name School was coming back. ...with EVERY house.



"When the administrative and early learning faculty and staff worked, we were very moved by the incredible work happening there and the needs of those in our community. One child in particular stood out to us and we took up a collection to assist with her basic needs and Christmas. We look forward to continuing with this service to our community and building a relationship between the Salvation Army and the school community," Faculty, Staff, Students, and Parents of Holy Name School

For this special edition of our Parish Newsletter I reminisce of Christmas past. Remembering a time when the people of Holy Name shaped me and how now I try to "pay it forward" each day.

To understand my story allow me to shed light on my beginnings. My parents graduated from HNS, married and began a family. I am the third of five children and have strong memories of church as a young child. I attended Religious Education classes (called CCD in the 1960's) which I enjoyed. My parents stopped attending church when I was in 1st grade, so Baptism was the only sacrament I received. I loved attending church and missed it so much that I would ask to stay at grandparents for the night just to be able to go to mass the next day.

My grandparents were of the generation where children did not question faith, religion or church. I, on the other hand, questioned everything. I would ask many questions but soon learned that answers were not going to be given. I would sit in mass in awe of the beauty but not understanding much. This went on for several years. In that time my love for God grew deeper but my relationship with the Catholic Church was limited and my understanding remained at a child's level.



As a young teen I asked to join Holy Name and after two years or more of instructions in faith, I was confirmed and received communion! Best Day Ever!!!! Why is it necessary to reveal the details of my journey? So that you realize when I attended mass I usually came by myself.

It would be easy to allow yourself to attend mass and never get to know anyone around you, to become an island in a sea of people. But in my case there were a handful of parishioners who made sure that did not happen. There were adults involved in the lives of youth—even in the 70's! Don and Sharon Speaks is at the top of this list for me. They knew my parents and each time I attended mass when they were present, both would hug me and greet me with joy...pure joy!!! Ralph and Jeannine O'Nan invited me to their home on special occasions and made me part of their family. Steve and Pam Raleigh added me to their flock when traveling to youth events, without them I would not have been able to experience life-changing TEC. Finally, I must add Kenny Perkins to this evangelizing list of people of my early days. Without his persistence and support 36 years ago, I may have gone down a very different path leading away from Holy Name.

What is it that all these people have in common? Love...they love with their whole heart. They love God above all else and they go out of their way to reveal that love to people they see needing God's love. They modeled and continue to model with their very lives in word and action.

How does all this cause me to reminisce about Christmas past? It is at this time when many new faces will be in the pew beside us. Family members and friends, Catholic or not, sharing company while hearing stories of birth, hope and love. What a great opportunity to reach out in a different way to those around us and welcome them. Greet the person across the aisle with a smile. Look up and around. Notice who is worshipping with you and see them as sinner needing God's love...just as you are! Appreciate the child who may be restless and the family attempting to comfort him as the loving Holy Family with struggles unknown to you...but they are in church and need comfort and support. See the person who came in alone...move over in the pew and invite her to sit with you and your family.



Christmas is a time of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Let us pay forward the love given to us by sharing with those we encounter during this Season of Christmas.
