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MICHIGAN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP FOR CLASS OF 2023!

Class of 2023 graduates can qualify for the new Michigan Achievement Scholarship, which supports students who attend 2-year, 4-year colleges & universities in Michigan, and some trades program. The scholarship will be offered to students whose families have a \$25,000 EFC or less (estimated to be about 80% of households), based on the Student Aid Report provided after completing the FAFSA. Trades, 2-year, and 4-year institutions have differing rates of support, with a maximum of \$5500. Support received depends on whether a college is public or private, the total cost of attendance, and a student's remaining financial need after other grant and scholarship aid is applied. Michigan Student Aid is offering information sessions for students and families, with limited space for attendance. Here are the upcoming dates: Michigan Achievement Scholarship eligibility requirements.

To prepare, students should complete their FAFSA as soon as possible, and register for an upcoming session to learn more:



COLLEGE CONNECTIONS PROGRAM AT MCE!

For a second semester, Mason County Eastern's 9th graders are learning about college. This semester, they're aquiring new college knowledge directly from WSCC faculty. In January, 9th graders got a sampling of how business and graphic design come together by testing their entrepreneurial skills at a "Lemonade Stand" game. Professor Katie Stewart and Associate Professor Eden Foley led the sessions, sharing about how each field they teach applies to everyday life, and about careers in the fields offered. Students learned not only about those programs offered at WSCC, but they learned about their own interests and aptitudes. Here are some student takeaways:

THE PROMISE & WSCC INVITE AREA SENIORS TO "SHOW UP" APRIL 12


Mason County Central and Mason County Eastern Seniors will be spending their annual state testing day a bit differently than in previous years. The State of Michigan requires all schools to provided content for their seniors of annual testing day, which falls on April 12th. This year, West Shore Community College and the Promise wanted to provide that content, in order to ensure that students are ready for their next steps after high school.

Over 70% of seniors surveyed indicated that they would like to be more financially aware for life after high Filer Credit Union stepped forward to help, and teamed up with the college and the Promise to host a morning "Financial Reality Fair." where students will experience a mock version of a month in the life of being employed in the career field that most interests them. The event will have them sample monthly income and expenses. complete with car payments, rent. utilities. loans and banking, insurance, and so much more.

Following the Fair, students will get to explore campus, tour facilities related to their fields of interest, meet WSCC students, and enjoy lunch courtesy of WSCC.

Changes to the Mason County Promise Scholarship

In January 2023, the Mason County Promise has been approved to update its scholarship offerings, which now include:

- 6-Year Availability: This is effective immediately, changing the Promise from up to four years of availability to up to six. The Promise continues to be available for up to 72 attempted credits. This is the only change retroactive to the 2018 cohort.
- Eligible Resident Graduates: The Promise expanded to cover resident homeschooled graduates and resident graduates who attend non-Mason County-based high school for 2023 and beyond. Limitations apply. Visit masoncountypromise.org for more information.
- Educational Supplies Award: The Promise added up to 2 years of support for purchasing Educational Supplies for qualifying Scholars in fall 2023 and thereafter. Deadlines and limitations apply.

Across the United States, freshman college enrollment for women last fall fell by more than 3% versus 1.2% for men.

It's not too late for students to apply to college! Spring Application Week is at the end of March, and MCAN will be sending out various resources, including information about application fee waivers, to help to promote postsecondary opportunities and encourage college applications.
