College Q&A Sessions Continue

In October, a.k.a. "College Month," Mason CAN held 12 online sessions featuring Michigan's public universities, local community colleges, and financial aid and scholarship resources. In November. "College Cash Month." and December, Mason CAN will hold 15 College Q&A sessions, and a week of sessions devoted to helping students and families understand the intricacies of "Paying for College." Mason CAN Sets Goal for FAFSA!

In October, Mason CAN's Leadership Team met and provisionally approved these goals for Mason County in 2020 and beyond. A small team will explore local data:

- FAFSA Completion Goal: 75% of seniors complete each year (See Paying for College page 3)
- College Access Goal: 67% of graduates enroll in college (any post-secondary program) within 6 mos. of graduation
- College Completion Goal: 60% of graduates complete a credential within 6 years of graduation.

On November 9th, the Leadership Team will meet with the Promise Zone to explore how Mason CAN and the Mason County Promise could collaborate more to support student success.

FAFSA Completion by March 1: FREE Promise T-SHIRT!

FAFSA completion is important for all seniors who are considering any kind of education after high school. Mason County Promise has sweetened the deal for seniors who complete their FAFSA by March 1, 2021: Students who apply for the Promise and complete their FAFSA get a free Promise T-shirt for Decision Day on May 1. More incentives are in the works so that Mason County can encourage students and families to complete the process, and never spend any more money on college than they have to! In 2018, Michigan's families left \$100 million of federal and state aid unused. Let's encourage FAFSA completion and college enrollment so students pay less now to earn more later!

Did you know: TIP no longer has a separate application process? Just do the FAFSA! TIP is also available for students to use for up to 10 years after graduation! TIP pays for 12 credits a semester toward an associate degree for many Michigan students who had Medicaid health insurance after age 9.

Mason County Promise Launch Virtual Success Coaching for Fall 2020 for Promise Scholars; WSCC Selected to Host MCAN Completion Coach!

125 Promise Scholars at WSCC now have the opportunity to participate in virtual Success Coaching for fall 2020. First year scholars have online discussions, Zoom meetups, and are encouraged to meet with an advisor to earn a participation incentive. Returning Promise Scholars can also participate and earn incentives. WSCC has also been selected for a College Completion Corps Success Coach, who will serve Promise Scholars in Winter 2021, to help build their academic skills, strengthen their campus involvement, and navigate college with the aim of completing their program at WSCC.





<u>Futures for Frontliners closes Dec. 1</u>

More that 60,000 Michiganders have already applied for the Futures for Frontliners (FFF) program funding. FFF is a Michigan-based program that Mason County adults without a degree can access if they who worked half-time or more outside of their home in a "frontline" job for 11 weeks from April-June 2020 during the pandemic. FAFSA completion is required. *The application closes December 31st.* Apply at michigan.gov/frontliners/
