FAFSA opens on October 1st!

FAFSA is good news, because it means college financial aid opportunities for high school seniors, returning college students, and adults who are planning to head to college or post-secondary education. FAFSA.gov is where families can apply. Dependent students will need parental support to complete the FAFSA and renew each year. To learn how FAFSA defines dependent students or to access tutorials or support, you can use resources at FAFSA.gov, Federal Financial Aid's youtube channel, go to Michigan's MiStudentAid website, or parents & students can attend the October 6th College Month Session hosted by Mason CAN with guest Deanna Hudson from Michigan Student Aid.

Futures for Frontliners is a Michigan-based program to support frontline workers in free tuition toward a certificate or degree at Michigan's Community Colleges. Michigan residents who worked outside of their home in a defined frontline job at least part-time during the pandemic qualify if they don't already have an associate degree or higher. WHY PREP FOR THE SAT?



SAT helps with College Admissions Opportunities!

This is a common reason that most students prepare. Most colleges have a range of SAT scores that can qualify you to be admitted. Outstanding SAT scores may help you qualify for elite schools & scholarships.



SAT can help with an imperfect GPA! If your GPA is below a 3.0, your SAT score can help to demonstrate your aptitude to an admissions counselor. GPA is a great indicator of success skills, but is not the only way a college knows you're ready to learn.




SAT can help you save money on college classes!

Strong SAT scores may help you place into higher Math courses, or signal to a college advisor that you should take a CLEP test to get credit instead of taking English classes. Fewer required general education courses mean less money in the long run!



SAT scores can help colleges know if you need extra support from developmental courses before you pursue your major. These courses can add time or cost to your degree, but they can also help you succeed in your major. NOTE: If you feel your SAT score doesn't represent your skills (maybe you were too tired or having an "off" day when you took it) ask to take a placement test at your college.
