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**ACTS 14**

3. How did Paul and Barnabas respond when the people of Lystra tried to worship them, and what does this teach us about humility and giving glory to God?

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4. What sustained Paul and Barnabas after being persecuted and even stoned, and how should we respond when faced with opposition in ministry?

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**ACTS 15**

5. What was the central issue at the Jerusalem Council, and why was it important for the unity and theology of the early Church?

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6. How did the apostles and elders resolve the debate about circumcision and Gentile salvation?

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7. Why did Paul and Barnabas separate at the end of chapter 15, and what can we learn about conflict resolution and God's ability to use even disagreements for His purpose?

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## **ACTS 16**

8. What led Paul to Macedonia in Acts 16, and how does the “Macedonian call” model obedience to the Holy Spirit's leading in missions?

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9. Why was Lydia’s conversion significant, and how did her hospitality impact the growth of the church in Philippi?

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10. How did Paul and Silas respond to being beaten and imprisoned in Philippi, and what does their response teach us about worship, suffering, and God's power to deliver?
