Walks Noreen Walk:

A suggestion for YRE was to have a picture of the start box location, and of the box. Some locations are a challenge to locate the box. Also a few pictures of what you might see along the way to encourage the interest of those perusing the site.

Webmaster Heidi is willing to setup, and maintain the website. We would give her membership in Rose City Roamers. There was no objections to this request.

New Officers Dick was still looking for someone to fill the secretary position. Carolyn Smith asked what it entailed, and after finding out the requirements, was willing to accept the position.

- Due to the timing of having the new officer's ready before the August meeting, Dick will send out for an email vote the list of new officers. The officers will be: Ed Hainline, President; Debbie Esmond, Vice-president; Carolyn Smith, Secretary; and Jim Wolf, retaining his position as Treasurer.

Regional Director

- Regional Conf. It is in September and currently these are the numbers of registered walkers: 21 from Washington, and 1 from Oregon (Ed). The first 100 registered will have option for the Dinner, and Buffet. The plan is to have seven walks. Four walks have been confirmed but still waiting for three walks from OPE club.

- Seasonal and YRE Renewals

For 2025 Sharon has suggested that to wait until the 2nd quarter to decide which walks (PPSF or STD) to keep and which to let stay idle for a year. The Canby walk is a good example of one that may be best to let rest a year. There were only 4 people who walked it all year. Should it be kept or stop at end of quarter? Even though there is construction happening in Canby the walk is still very doable. To decide what to do.

- Forms 990A, 990B The additional of a blank category for participation. The current clubs have forms that work well. Motion made whether to keep the YRE registration form as is currently for Rose City Roamers.
- -"Striders" Carolyn explained what this was. Medicare Advantage (Part C) health plans will often cover fees for sports/health clubs and activities. You sign up at Grouper groups.com/AVA. It will ask which health plan and your member ID. If you qualify, you will get an email stating you qualify and are officially a "Strider

There are no fees paid to walk. You identify yourself as a "Strider". Grouper pays the AVA four dollars, two dollars for AVA, and two dollars for the club. The walk reports will be the drivers for us to receive the club portion, so will need to have the numbers of "Striders" so Jim will be able to report it correctly. AVA has already changed the participation report.

Train Ride Olympia: June 20 (Thursday) meet with Olympia group at train station and the 4T walk. Dick has made some changes so that the 6K isn't walking UP the hill. The tram tickets are \$8 round trip for the day of. Dick said Pam from Olympia sanctioned the walk as they were wanting to do this walk. Centralia Train ride: July 10 (Wednesday). Best to get the tickets early, as the prices change quite a bit.

Side note: Is the Albany group going on the train ride? Didn't know will need to contact the club and find out.
