

With the goal of offering products that have less environmental impact, Canadel recently obtained GREENGUARD certification for its low-VOC varnish, which reduces to a minimum the amount of volatile organic compounds and their polluting emissions. From now on, not only will Canadel furniture be in greater harmony with nature, but this new certification also means a healthier and more pleasant workplace for the team.

ATTENTION TO DETAIL

Whether it's a piece from the Canadel, Champlain, Downtown, East Side, Gourmet or Loft collection, the finishing is meticulously executed by hand by the company's experienced carpenters and upholsterers. For 40 years, they have mastered this art with precision and a degree of detail that is impossible to miss.

Behind every chair is a multi-step process and many, many hours of work. Specialized employees closely supervise construction, from the original birch board all the way to assembly. All the finishing, down to the last stitch, is painstakingly and precisely handcrafted.

TESTED AGAIN AND AGAIN

Throughout its construction, each model is tested and inspected several times to ensure it meets safety and quality standards. Canadel's exemplary consistency on this point makes it a leader in the industry. And quality control doesn't stop in the plant. 



But there's a design element, too-your home should be comfy and relaxed, and you can get the look by adhering to some of the most important trademarks of Scandinavian style, including using lighter color palettes (think whites, creams and light greys); natural, unstained woods or warm wood tones; greenery; a less-is-more approach with simple, beautifully crafted furniture pieces; clean lines; and warm textures like chunky cable knits and soft leathers are good choices.

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

famous Italian designer once said, "styles come and go. Good design is a language, not a style." These words ring true today. Trends and tastes evolve, and you'll find some design choices of yesteryear have remained in the past. But there are also a significant number of design elements that will never go out of style-design decisions, furniture pieces and colors that return season after season, year after year, era after era. This is the definition of timeless design. It's not built on fads or trends. Instead, the hallmark of classic design is that it has staying power and it's created to last. These are design elements that have become iconic.





There are many characteristics and pieces that make up timeless design. At its core, it's simple, sophisticated, functional, and adaptable. It's not about being dull or bland, but it's also not opulent or ornate. Interior designers say white kitchens, gallery walls, canopy beds, subway tiles, marble countertops, toile, fresh flowers, sconces, and sisal carpeting, for example, are all considered classic and have stood the test of time. So too have neutral paint colors, like white, beige, grey, and taupe. These shades will forever be considered fashionable. >







If you want to infuse timeless design into your interiors, don't worry; there are many ways to incorporate its features in every room in your home. First, you'll want to create a focal point, a spot where your eye naturally rests in a room. If you already have big picture windows, a fireplace, or a stunning wood table, you might use these as the focal point. If you don't have an element that naturally works, create your own using architectural accessories or an incredible piece of art for example. The remainder of furniture in your room should be arranged around it. Once you've established this, consider symmetry in the space and add pairs where possible. In your dining room, for example, you might place matching vases and tableware on your table and bring in a set of long candles. >

POWER OF TIME

When you're accessorizing your space, opt for more classic patterns. While some prints tend to come and go (such as animal prints), there are a plethora of patterns that offer a timeless feel. Consider using plaid, checks, stripes, and botanical prints, and don't be afraid to bring multiple patterns into a room. If you tend to gravitate toward a pattern or print that doesn't have tried-and-tested staying power, don't use it for wallpaper, drapery, or bigger pieces. Instead, have fun with trends in smaller, easier-to-change items like toss cushions, bed sheets, and throws. Finally, one of the hallmarks of timeless design is using good-quality pieces—accessories, furniture, and fabrics that don't break the bank but are well constructed and offer plenty of character and functionality. It's a good rule of thumb to opt for more bigger anchor items that are well-made (dining sets, sofas, or hutches, for example) because they'll last for many years and can be accessorized with pieces that complement your style and decor.

Ice cubes 2 oz. (60 ml) your favorite almond liqueur 1 oz. (30 ml) orange juice 6 oz. (180 ml) ginger ale Orange zest Small sprigs of rosemary

PREPARATION

Fill your glass with ice cubes. Pour the almond liqueur and the orange juice in the glass. Top up with the ginger soft drink. Curl up the orange zest. Using a cocktail pick, hang the orange zest and the rosemary on the edge of the glass.


