Dear Sir or Madam,

With the passage of HEA1001 by the Indiana General Assembly, Indiana’s budget for FY2022 and FY2023 has been finalized and approved. The Indiana Department of Correction is amending the CY2021 Community Corrections and Justice Reinvestment Grants contracts to continue funding for the remainder of the CY2021 grant cycle, beginning July 1, 2021 and expiring December 31, 2021.

We look forward to utilizing our partnerships to improve the criminal justice system throughout our great state.

The Indiana Department of Correction is pleased to announce that **Warrick County** has been awarded the following for the continuation of operations, programs, treatment, and services. This amount is to be divided as follows:

All expectations regarding grant management, financial management (including payment schedules, local fund set up, and expense procedures), data requirements, performance expectations, and minimum program standards are outlined in our CY2021 grant procedural manuals that correspond with the grant cycle beginning January 1, 2021. Your assigned program director will continue to provide technical assistance to your advisory board to ensure your programs continue their operations guided by evidence-based practices and in compliance with grant requirements.

As a reminder, the funding for continuation of operations under CY2021 may not be utilized for the following:

- Construction, renovation costs, or land acquisition
- Weapons and/or accessories
- Vehicles
- Ammunition (lethal or less-lethal)
- Electronic Immobilization Devices (“EID”)
- Wearing apparel (i.e., clothing, uniforms, personal protection vests)
- Capital Expenses (i.e., Series 400 items)



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Your assigned program director will provide you with instructions to ensure we have the appropriate documentation and corresponding budget information by **5/10/2021**.

The contract will be sent electronically to the county auditor or signatory authority for electronic signature of the contract with the State of Indiana. Please verify the information listed below.
