In Minnesota I guess the unofficial start of fall is Labor Day weekend or maybe the State Fair. Here in Palmer, the real start of fall is Palmer Day. Yea, we get back to back fun weekends.

Palmer Day is Saturday September 11th. Due to the date conflict there will not be a BLCA board meeting on the 11th.

The Palmer parade is always fun. In my August letter I asked for volunteers to do a BLCA float in the parade. No volunteers yet. If you are interested, please

The BLCA has a food booth in the pavilion as a fundraiser. We can use some help setting up on Friday, workers in the booth Saturday, and clean up Sunday morning. Thanks to a "heads up" from Bre Bauerly, in the August letter I let you know Purple Loosestrife was found in the Briggs bayou and some other areas on the lake. When I wrote about it, I'm sorry to say I had no idea that this weed was so invasive and finding it is a big deal. Fortunately we have readers who know this is a problem that needs immediate action. Mike Flanery is a resident and our local expert on bad weeds and good weeds. Scott Ruiter is chairman of the TLID (Three Lakes Improvement District) and a member of the BLCA board. As a team, they sprang into action. A company was contacted and hired to do a survey and identify weed locations. Scott & Mike also did their own survey and observations. Property owners with the weed were contacted. The noxious weeds were pulled up by the roots and destroyed. They didn't get them all but got most of them. This all happened within 10 days of announcing we have a problem. Another example of the good things that happen behind the scenes working to keep our lakes healthy.

GOOD NEWS about Eurasian Milfoil for Rush Lake. A few years ago milfoil was found on Rush. The TLID contracted with a vendor for an aggressive program to spray for the weeds. It took a few years. A recent survey confirmed no milfoil has been found in Rush for three years. This is a huge success. Only a few other lakes in the state have eradicated milfoil like this.

BAD NEWS about milfoil in Big Elk. Last fall milfoil was found in Elk. Volunteers jumped into action and organized a group to go in the lake and hand pull the weeds. They got a lot of weeds. A recent survey finds their efforts didn't work. The milfoil area has expanded worse than last year. Professional help is needed. A weed control vendor has been hired and will do a spraying in the next 10 days. Elk will need more treatment over the next few years to get this under control.

Curly pondweed is another weed. For the most part, this is likely the weeds you have on your shoreline It is considered invasive. However curly pondweed, like crabgrass, is a nuisance weed and we want to get rid of it around our docks and swimming area.

In the past the BLCA used our preferred vendor Lake Management to control weeds on individual property shorelines. For several years weed control was spraying the shoreline. This year Lake Management opted out of the shoreline spraying. They offered a granule application property owners could buy from them and apply themselves. I ordered the granules and used them. Lake Management let me know 60 properties on the four lakes ordered the product.

Megan Weber from the MN AIS Research Center and I will be visiting Briggs Lake two more times to complete our initial study on Golden Clams. Next week we plan to be there with a film crew, who wants to collect some footage and interviews about the project. In September, we plan to visit the lake on the 23rd from 1pm to 3pm.



On the September 23rd visit date, we would like to gather as many clams as possible and record their size. The reason for this is that we hope to build a large dataset from which we can draw "age classes" or "age cohorts" from. You can't quite tell the age of a Golden Clam by counting rings or strips, like you can for a zebra mussel, or for aging a tree. But if we collect 200 clams, measure them, and a see large groupings in two or three size categories, then we can reasonably say that we have a group of clams that could be 1 year old, another group that is 1.5 years old, 2 years old, etc.

We could use some volunteers to help sort through sediment for clams and then measure them, about 5 or so volunteers would be great. Please pass this note along to any of your AIS committee folks or others that would be interested. No special equipment needed – folks can dress for the weather. If a few folks want to bring waders or shorts that would be fine – a few people will need to get in the water but most can remain on shore.

ANY BRAVE SOUL WANT TO VOLUNTEER TO CLEAN UP LILLY CREEK?


