County Extension of Ocean Shore Boulevard 1 Expected Soon

The extension of Ocean Shore boulevard will start at its present terminus at Montecito and run diagonally across Block 1, Brighton beach, block 2, Brighton Beach and through a portion of block 1 in Cottage City and connect with

Casino Way at Birch Lane, then follow Casino south to Clarendon Road.

The right of way along Casino will be widened on West side sufficiently to permit the wider road.

It was found impossible to extend

It was found impossible to extend the Ocean Shore Boulevard along the beach, because of the high surf and the low shore line through this area, which is the reason for changing the location to Casino Way and bringing the extension farther inland.

The right of way through Block

1, Brighton Beach is being ac_
quired by the County from the

Sharp Park Sanitary District. Construction of the boulevard across Sharp Park Sanitary Dis-

trict property will be of mutual benefit to both County and Sanitary District in that it will pro-

vide a dike to protect the sewage

disposal plant from high waters during storms, in the past storms having washed over the present

site of the disposal plant.

The balance of the road provides an outlet for traffic on Ocean Shore boulevard. During weekends and holidays this traffic is quite heavy. It will also be an improvement to property adjoining the road through Cottage City.

This extension, however, makes necessary the moving of several buildings and the acquiring of right of way, which will ad materially to the cost of this extension.
