About us...

Who are we?

Heimstaed Lodge is a non-profit organization, dedicated and committed to taking care of the seniors in our community. The Lodge is owned and operated by La Crete Municipal Nursing Association (LCMNA).

LCMNA is a registered non-profit charitable organization who, in addition to owning the Heimstaed Lodge, also owns the Care & Share Thrift Store. Proceeds from the Care & Share go towards supporting the Heimstaed Lodge.

History:

Construction of Phase 1 (now referred to as Cottage 1) and the dining room and kitchen started in 1999 and finished in 2000, with the grand opening in June of 2000. The land was donated by churches.

By 2003, the Phase 2 (now referred to as part of Cottage 2, Cottage 3 and part of Cottage 4) was completed, with a total of 45 client units now available.

In 2004, it was discussed that there was a need for expansion, including dementia units. The plan was put to action, and Phase 3 (now referred to as Cottage 5) was completed by summer of 2008. This resulted in a total of 80 client units within the Heimstaed Lodge.

The house purchased just north of the Lodge has capacity for an additional 4 individuals.

What we do:

We are pleased and proud to offer a combination of housing, personalized supportive services, and personal care for our clients. The team at Heimstaed Lodge takes great pride in providing a broad spectrum of service and care for our clients who may have either physical disabilities or chronic medical conditions. Heimstaed Lodge promotes and values a community and atmosphere which is flexible, individualized, and innovative.

Our team of staff promotes independence, personal choice, privacy, dignity, and collaborative relationships to ensure excellence in care. This includes:

Nursing Department, providing personal client care and assistance with daily living, as well as access to medical assistance.

Housekeeping Department, to ensure cleanliness of the building and client rooms, as well as personal laundry for clients;


Kitchen Department, providing three nutritious meals per day plus the provision of snacks and beverages;

Recreation Department, organizing and implementing activities for client enjoyment; and

Maintenance Department, looking after the upkeep of the building and property grounds.

The Heimstaed Lodge team encourages clients to maintain primary responsibility for their own health with the understanding that the care team is here to assist and support them at any time. We work in partnership with the resident, family members and the Alberta Health Services (AHS) Case Manager to ensure clients are able to function to the best of their abilities. We encourage and welcome the support of friends and family.

Services Offered

Supportive Living (SL2) mostly independent living, with access to Health Care Aides (HCAs).

Designated Supported Living 3 (SL3) provides on-site health and personal care by Health Care Aides (HCAs)

Designated Supportive Living 4 (SL4) provides on-site health and personal care for more complex needs by Health Care Aides (HCAs) and Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

Designated Supportive Living 4 Dementia (SL4D) provides on-site health and personal care with specialized dementia care in a secure environment.
