Food items can often come from unexpected sources. One such food is the humble mushroom, which is neither a plant nor an animal. It is a fungus, and grows on animal waste and straw. The mushroom is a universal favourite for use on pizzas, pastas, salads and sandwiches soups, noodles and a lot more. There are many varieties of edible mushrooms. Oysters, porcini, morels, shitake, truffles, etc. are some well known ones. The most widely eaten variety is the button mushrooms. While button mushrooms cost only a little more than most vegetables, some varieties are considered a delicacy and are amongst the most expensive foods in the world. The white truffle mushroom often sells for hundreds of dollars per kilogram. This mushroom, also called the 'white diamond', is mainly grown in Italy. It is expensive because of its aroma and heavenly taste, and is mostly eaten raw.

Button mushrooms however should never be eaten raw because they contain cancer - causing compounds. Further, mushrooms require special conditions to grow-dark regions and damp straw and animal waste. So mushrooms should be watched thoroughly.

Many species of mushrooms are extremely poisonous. Hence care should be taken while selecting mushrooms.

Mushrooms contain nutrients like protein potassium, copper etc. and vitamins like B-complex, B2, B3 and B5.
