Winthrop Avenue Principal: Mrs. Curto

- Third graders are setting in wonderfully and enjoying the many choices of activities they have at recess.
- Will be starting Front Field Fridays soon.
- Mrs. Curto met with co-Presidents Brianna Bachrach and Carla Wong & co-Executive Vice Presidents Jamie Guggenheim Shiner and Jill Mosca over the summer; she is looking forward to all of the PTA's upcoming activities, such as the yoga and Zumba clubs.
- Winthrop administrators and staff members are focusing on the district's core values and currently emphasizing the importance of being proactive.
- Mrs. Curto will introduce Mindful Moments, encouraging students to take a breath and ground themselves in their seats to promote self-regulation and hit their pause buttons.
