As Rex Mitchell became an Octogenarian last week he brought along a Birthday Cake for supper. Happy Birthday Rex and thanks Theresia, the cake went down well.

A method overcoming difficulty starting an engine due to high compression. (from Ian Partleton)

I recently purchased a 60cc RCGF petrol engine with the view to fitting it into a 2 meter wing span 234 Sebach. After installation of the control surfaces and engine it was time to power it up. The engine was fitted with a 22 X 8 propeller and 75mm aluminum spinner and due to the lightness of the Sebach (Thin Laser cut Ply wood) there was difficulty turning the engine over without warping the fuselage. With a gloved hand I began turning the motor over when it back fired giving me some pain in the fingers. I tried starting it with a 12 volt geared starter powered with 24 volts; no luck here, all it achieved was a loud squeal from the rubber drive cup. Next on the list was the use of a chicken stick (top half of a pick handle) after 2 attempts it back fired again which resulted in a damaged propeller. I replaced the prop with a new one and it also received damage from a

kickback. There was no way that I could safely start this motor. Some research into different engine compressions led me to believe that a 60cc RCGF could be as high as 9 to 1 or even 10 to 1. Whereas a DLE 30 was back at 7 to 1. Having 2 DLE engines, a 35cc and a 40cc twin I found that the power needed to turn them over was very little. To enable the engine to be used in the Sebach I needed to reduce the compression in the engine. I purchased a 2 mm thick duralumin plate so as to machine it to fit between the cylinder head and the crank case. The compression was reduced to that similar to 7 to 1 as in the DLE engines. Starting is no longer a problem and the engine doesn't appear to have lost any power.

Combat Classic Event 3

After numerous delays the Combat Classic Event 3 was run on Sunday 10th November 2024 with 6 starters. The day started out with some light drizzle but luckily it wasn't heavy enough to wet the grass much and the grass had dried out by 11.00am when the action began.

Round 1 saw Wayne have to get a backup model so he had a late start. There were several "clips" but no streamers cut in this round.

Round 2 saw some very close action, with several "clips" and Wayne cut Brian's streamer and Brian cut Godwin's streamer.

Round 3 saw some excitement with Brian and James having a mid air collision. Brian's SPAD went down with James's fuselage attached. James's wing went in another direction. Ian got a cut on Lofty. Dave used Samantha's drone to locate the wing in the long grass for James.

Round 4 saw more excitement when Wayne & Godwin had a midair collision. Godwin got a cut on Wayne and Brian got a cut on Lofty. Then Godwin was knocked out of the sky with 10 seconds to go in the round whilst Wayne landed with the RH aileron hanging off just after the buzzer. Godwin had wing damage to the balsa built up wing and wayne had some fuselage damage and the aileron hanging off.

It was all over in 40 minutes. The results are...best 3 scores out of the 4 rounds.....

Godwin flying a Nitro Combat Model 680 points

In the final results only the 3 best scores out of the 4 Events are counted so those that missed a round can still win.
