Recruiting, Resumes and Film

Before I say anything – please know that ALL recruiting depends on your academic index. You must be able to get into a college with your grades – which includes your level of classes AP, Honors, CP, general and your testing profile. Those 2 items make up your "academic index".

(NOW is NOT the time to hold back. Self promotion and quiet / composed confidence is important. You have value and you need to know that)

TO DO- LIST RIGHT NOW

(3 weeks before every event/clinic/college visit)

Before starting the letters, resume and film ...

SOCIAL MEDIA - Clean it out. No college coach wants to see red solo cups in the hand of a possible future player. Your pictures tell a story of you. Do not post or let yourself get tagged in anything you would not be proud to represent. Search your name - and clean out anything you wouldn't be proud of.

STARTING THE COLLEGE SEARCH

Everyone from 9th grade & up should be creating an athletic resume, and a list of the possible colleges you would love to attend. Make sure that list of colleges is broad from Division I – Division III and include reach schools for both your athletic and academic ability. Then do your research – look up the schools and find out; DO they have your major / minor of interest? ARE they within a distance you are willing to travel? DO they have a lot of international players on their team? DO you know anyone that attended this school and had a good experience there?

*Start having meaningful conversations with your student/athlete \mathcal{E} /or parents about all the things you find out.

FILM

6 minutes MAXIMUM. Start with a head shot of you in your high school or NJ GRIT Uniform. Show a screen of your vitals. Name, position, uniform number for both high school and NJ GRIT, stats / teams you would like them to be aware of (like a highlight page from a resume). Then show some fundamental drills of footwork, receiving, lead passing, elimination skills, defensive play and outletting. They want well rounded players that they can make into what they want on their field.
