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Going Bananas

Bananas contain three natural sugars (sucrose, fructose and glucose) combined with fiber. A banana gives an instant, sustained and substantial boost of energy. Research has proven that just two bananas provide enough energy for a strenuous 90 -minutes workout. No wonder the banana is the number one fruit with the world's leading athletes.

But energy isn't the only way a banana can help us keep fit. It can also help overcome or prevent a substantial number of illnesses and conditions, making it a must to add to our daily diet.

Depression: According to a recent survey undertaken by MIND amongst people suffering from depression, many felt much better after eating a banana. This is because bananas contain tryptophan, a type of protein that the body converts into serotonin,, known to make you relax, improve your mood and generally make you feel happier.

PMS: Forget the pills -eat a banana. The vitamin B6 it contains regulates blood glucose levels, which can affect your mood.

Anemia: High in iron, bananas can stimulate the production of hemoglobin in the blood and so helps in cases of anemia.

Brain Power: 200 students at a Twickenham (Middlesex) school were help through their exams this year by eating bananas at breakfast, break, and lunch in a bid to boost their brain power. Research has shown that the potassium – packed fruit can assist learning by making pupil more alert.

Constipation: High in fiber, including bananas in the diet can help restore normal bowel action, helping to overcome the problem without resorting to laxatives.

Hangovers: One of quickest ways of curing a hangover is to make a banana milkshake, sweetened with honey. The bananas calms the stomach and, with the help of the honey, builds up depleted blood sugar levers, while the milk soothes and re-hydrates your system.

Heartburn: Bananas have a natural antacid effect in the body, so if you suffer from heartburn, try eating a banana for soothing relief.

Morning Sickness: Snacking on bananas between meals helps to keep blood sugar levels up and avoid morning sickness.

Mosquito Bites: Before reaching for the insect bite cream, try rubbing the affected area with the inside of a banana skin. Many people find it amazingly successful at reducing swelling and irritation.

Nerves: Bananas are high in B vitamins that help calm the nervous system.

Overweight and at work? Studies at the Institute of Psychology in Austria found pressure at work leads to gorging on comfort food like chocolate and crisps. Looking at 5,00 hospital patients, researchers found the most obese were more likely to be in high-pressure jobs. The Report concluded that, to avoid panic-induced food cravings, we need to control our blood sugar levels by snacking on high carbohydrate foods every two hours to keep levels steady.

Ulcers: The banana is used as the dietary food against intestinal disorders because of its soft texture and smoothness. It is the only raw fruit that can be eaten over-chronicler cases. It also neutralizes over-acidity and reduces irritation by coating the lining to the stomach.

Temperature Control: Many other cultures see bananas as a “cooling” fruit that can lower both the physical and emotional temperature of expectant fathers. In Thailand, for example, pregnant women eat bananas to ensure their baby is born with a cool temperature.

Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD): Bananas can help SAD sufferers because they contain the natural mood enhancer tryptophan.

Smoking: Bananas can also help people trying to give up smoking. The B6, B12 they contain, as well as the potassium and magnesium found in them, help the body recover from the effects of nicotine withdrawal.

Stress: Potassium is a vital mineral, which helps normalize the heartbeat, sends oxygen to the brain and regulates your body's water balance.. When we are stressed, our metabolic rate rises, thereby reducing our potassium levels. These can be rebalanced with the help of a high-potassium banana snack.

Strokes: According to research in "the New England Journal of Medicine, "eating bananas as part of a regular diet can cut the risk of death by strokes by as much as 40%!

Warts: Those keen on natural alternatives swear that if you want to kill off a wart, take a piece of banana skin and place it on the wart, with the yellow side out. Carefully hold the skin in place with a plaster or surgical tape!

So a banana really is a natural remedy for many ills. When you compare it to an apple, it has four times the protein, twice the carbohydrate, three times the phosphorus, five times the vitamin A and Iron, and twice the other vitamins and minerals. It is also rich in potassium and is one to the best value foods around. So maybe its time to change that well—known phrase so that we say,

" a banana a day keeps the doctor away!"

PS: Want a quick shine on your shoes? Take the INSIDE of the banana skin, and rub directly on the shoe...polish with dry cloth.

Sin Part III

Man's Problems

Adam was the head of the human family, the source of the entire human race. God did not create millions of people to populate the earth. He created only one man Adam. From him came all human life. Thus God sees the whole human race as one race in Adam. Because of this, what Adam did affected the whole human race.

Every person born into the human family is born into Adam's sinful race. As a member of this sinful race, man has many problems.

1. Man is Separated from God's Life.

The moment Adam disobeyed God, he died spiritually. He was separated from life of God. Adam's sin resulted in spiritual death, not only for himself, but for the entire human race. By nature, every person born into the world is spiritually dead separated from the life of God. Romans 5:12

2. Man Has Inner Emptiness.

God made us with a deep inner need to feel that we are worth something. Man needs a purpose in life that makes him feel worth while. He also needs to be loved and accepted by someone who is important to him. It was God's plan that He Himself should meet man's needs. God had a work for man to do that made him feel worth while. Man was loved and accepted by God. As long as man was in the right relationship with his creator, his inner needs were fully met. He was happy and satisfied.

But man has rebelled against God, and he is separated from God. Therefore his deep inner needs are not being met. Man is restless and dissatisfied. He has no peace within.

3. Man Has a Sinful Nature.

As created by God, Adam was in right relationship with God. He loved God, he worshipped God, and he obeyed God.

After Adam sinned, a change took place in his heart. Instead of loving God and wanting to do His will, Adam now loved himself and wanted to do his own will. Adam now had a sinful nature. Adam passed his sinful nature on to his children and to the whole human race. Adam produced a race of sinners. Every person is born with a sinful nature. All of this is the result of Adam's disobedience. Romans 5:19

Gen 1:1 God is the great creator the one who created the stars, the sun, the moon, the earth and the heavens. The Bible does not tell us when this took place, but it does tell us how God created the heavens and the earth.

Psalm 33:6 He created them by His Word! God spoke and the stars, the sun, the moon, the earth came into being. He also controls them by His mighty powers. Joshua 10:13

Isaiah 45:2 we know these things by faith in God's word, in His book the Bible.

Rev. 4:11 God is worthy of all praise, honor, and worship. Because He is the creator of all.

God created the Angels Psalms 103:20

Angels are spirit-beings which were created by God to be His messengers and servants. Though angels are beautiful and very powerful creatures they are not to be worshipped. Only God is to be worshipped.

4. God Most Wonderful Creation.

Gen. 1:26 When God created man, He created Him in His own image & likeness. God created man for His own glory. Man is (Gen 1:27) a unique creature and the only one in the Bible created in God's image. Gen 1:28

God made the first man out of the dust of the ground. His name was Adam. God made a beautiful wife for Adam her name was Eve.

Man did not come from a lower form of animal life. God made man different from all the animals. Man has a soul that will live forever. Man also has a spirit. The spirit is that part of man which can know God and receive His life. God wanted man which can know God and receive His life. God wanted man to be able to know Him, to worship Him, and to receive His life. Man was created in such a way that God lives in him. God is spirit and, because man has a spirit, God's spirit can dwell in man.

5. The Creature-Creator Relationship.

When God created man, He put in him a deep inner need to feel that he was worth something. Man needs a reason for living a purpose in life. Man also needs to be loved by someone who is important to him. Without these needs being met, man feels that he is not worth anything and that life is not worth living.

In the beginning man had a wonderful fellowship with his creator. Because man was in the right relationship with his creator, his inner needs were met. He was happy and satisfied. God loved man and provided for his needs.

6. Now What's Man's Responsibility to God?

Man is in the right relationship with his creator- God when he loves, worships and obeys Him. This is what we were created for and this is the way it was with Adam and Eve in the beginning.

God placed Adam and Eve in the beautiful Garden of Eden. God had prepared this garden especially for them. In it was everything Adam and Eve needed. The trees were filled with good things to eat. A sparkling river of pure water flowed through the garden. Best of all, they had fellowship with the creator. Each evening God came down to walk and talk to them. Adam and Eve were very happy but one day something happened which changed all this. Sin came into the world!

7. How sin Came Into the world.

When God created the world. He made everything beautiful and good. But now many things are not beautiful and not good. There is sickness and death. There is hatred and fighting. There are selfish and wicked people. Sin has spoiled God's wonderful world.

How did sin get into the world? How did sin get into men's hearts? The Bible tells us how this happened. First, some of the angels rebelled against God. Then man rebelled against God. Let us consider these two rebellions.

8. Rebellion of the Angels.

When God created the angels, He placed one angel over all the other angels. His name was Lucifer. He was the most beautiful, most powerful, and the wisest of all the angels in Heaven.

It seems that, for some time after he was created. This mighty angel loved God and obeyed Him perfectly. But a time came when Lucifer chose to rebel against God. Because he was so beautiful and so powerful, Lucifer's heart was lifted up with up with pride. He decided that he should be God! He rebelled against God. He said in his heart,

I will ascend into heaven,
I will exact my throne above the
Stars of God
I will sit also upon the mount of
The congregation.....
I will ascend above the heights of
I will be like the most high
God

Isaiah 14:13-14; Ezekiel 28:11-17

What was Lucifer's great sin? It was the sin of rebellion against God.

Lucifer's heart attitude was. "I will not obey God! I will do what I want to do!"

Lucifer was no longer content to be the highest angel under God. He wanted to take God place and be worshipped as God. What a terrible thing it is for a created being to rebel against the great creator.

God saw what was in Lucifer's heart and he cast him down from his exalted position. His name was changed from Lucifer to Satan which means "adversary or enemy. Satan is the enemy of God and our enemy as well.

Satan was the first angel to rebel against God, but 1/3 of the angels followed him in his rebellion. These angels who followed satan are called "fallen angels". While those who remained true to God are called "holy angels". Satan and his fallen angels were cast out of heaven.

Satan along with his fallen angels set up a kingdom opposed to God. Ever since satan's rebellion, there have been two spiritual kingdoms in the universe- The kingdom of satan and The Kingdom of God.

Satan's kingdom is the Kingdom of darkness;

God's kingdom is the kingdom of light.

Satan's kingdom is the kingdom of rebellion;

God's kingdom is the kingdom of obedience.

Satan's kingdom is the kingdom of
hates, lies, and wick ness;

God's kingdom is the kingdom of
love, truth, and righteousness.

Between these two kingdoms
there is constant warfare.

(Spiritual & Natural)

God is the Almighty God, and He will not permit this rebellion against Him to go on forever. One day Satan, his fallen angels, and all those people who have followed him will be cast into the lake of fire, where they will be punished forever and ever. But right now, God is giving people the opportunity to choose whom they will follow- GOD or SATAN.

9. The Rebellion of Man.

Gen 2:17 When God created Adam and Eve and placed them in the Garden of Eden he told them that they could eat of every tree in the garden except one "The tree of knowledge of good and evil".

God commanded them not to eat of this tree and warned them that, if they disobeyed Him, they would surely die. One day, satan in the form of a serpent came into the garden. His purpose was to deceive Eve. Satan told Eve that she would not die if she ate the forbidden fruit.

He told her that she and her husband could become as gods by eating this fruit. Eve believed satan's lie. She took the forbidden fruit and ate it.

When Adam returned, Eve offered the fruit to him. No doubt, she told him what the serpent had said about how they would become as gods by eating the fruit. Adam had to make a choice. He knew what God had said. God had plainly told him that eating the forbidden fruit would result in death. Adam was deceived by what satan had told Eve. He knew better! Nevertheless, Adam took the fruit and ate it. What was the great Sin? It was the sin of rebellion against God. Adam knew what God had commanded; yet he chose to rebel against God. His heart attitude was, "I will do what I want to do."

James 4:17 The sin of rebellion was followed by an act of disobedience. Adam took the forbidden fruit and ate it. Adam had followed Satan in his rebellion against God. Adam and Eve died spiritually the very day they disobeyed God.

10. Adam and Eve Were Kicked Out of the Garden of Eden.

Genesis 3:13-17 Adam and Eve had disobeyed God. A righteous God could not overlook their sin. He could not pretend that nothing had happened, or that he did not know about it. God called Adam and Eve before Him. Then he pronounced his judgment upon them. They would have to leave the beautiful Garden of Eden. No longer would they have fellowship with the creator.

Sin had come between them and God. No longer would they be able to eat from the beautiful trees in the garden. Hereafter, Adam would have to work hard to get food. Eve would be subject to her husband and would bear children in sorrow and pain even the ground would be cursed because of their sin. Of all the things that happened to Adam and Eve as a result of their disobedience the worst was this, they were separated from God.

God still loved Adam and Eve and on that same day he made a wonderful promise to them. He promised them that one day he would send a savior. That savior would be God's own son The Lord Jesus Christ. He would die for the sins of the world.

11. Sin Came Into the World Because of One Man's Disobedience.

Eph 2:2 The Bible speaks of "the spirit that now works in the children of disobedience". That spirit is the spirit of Satan! Satan rebelled against God and said in his heart "I will have my own way"!

Now you and I come along and say the same thing in our hearts. Isaiah 53:6

12. Man Commits Many Sins.

Because man has a sinful nature, he commits many sins. Some people have committed greater sins than others but all have sinned. Rom 3: 10-12

What is sin?

People like to set their own standards as to what is right and what is wrong. Some ask, "What is sin?" The best way to answer this question is to see what God says about sin in his word.

**Transgressing God's laws is sin*

In his word, God has told us what is right and what is wrong in his sight. To transgress God's laws means to break or disobey his laws. It means to go beyond what God has said is right. Any transgression of God's law is sin. 1 John 3:4

** Unbelief is sin*

The Bible is God's Holy Word. Not to believe what God says in his word is one of the greatest sins we can commit. 1 John 5:10

**Not doing what you should do is sin*

We sin against God when we do things which we should not do. We also sin against him when we do not do the things we know we should do. James 4:17

** Rebellion against God's authority is sin*

Authority means the right to rule and the right to be obeyed. All authority belongs to God because he is the creator of all things. Rebellion against God's authority is sin. 1 Sam 15:23

** All unrighteousness is sin*

The Bible says that any failure to obey God's commandment is sin. It is true that some sins are more serious than others, but it is also true that any wrong doing is sin. The Bible says, "All unrighteousness is sin". 1 John 5:17

In His word, God has set forth his **STANDARD OF PERFECTION**. We all have come short of that standard. We have all sinned. Rom 3:23

13. The Root Cause of Sins'

It is most important that we discover the root cause of sins. It is not enough to know that we have sinned we need to understand why we sin.

The root cause of sins is **SELF** that sinful nature of ours which says,

“I will do what I want to do!”

Man has taken God off the throne of his heart and put SELF there. Instead of loving God and wanting to do his will, man loves himself and wants to do his own will. SELF says, “I must have my own way. “And If I don’t get it, I will be displeased and I may get angry.”

This attitude of self- will and selfishness is in the heart of every human being. The world considers that it is natural and normal for a person to live for himself and seek what pleases him. It even encourages people to live selfishly. The world says, “Seek your own fulfillment. You have a right to do what you want to do and seek what pleases you. Regardless of how it may affect other people.

The Bible however says that our sinful SELF life is hateful to God and destructive to us. Jesus pointed to it as the source of all our sins. Mark 7: 21-23

We can not live for ourselves and, at the same time do the will of God. No one can follow the Lord so long as SELF is in control. Luke 9:23

14. Man's Attempts to Solve His Problems

Every person has a conscience an inner voice that tells him when he does wrong. This inner voice says, “You have broken God’s laws you are guilty”. As man continues to so his own way, not obeying God, he loads himself down with an unbearable load of guilt. Because he is tortured by his accusing conscience and because he fears the wrath of God, man tries in many ways to solve his problem or to escape from them. Let us consider a few of these ways.

*** Seeking worldly success**

God made us with certain deep inner needs which only he can meet as he dwells in us. But man has rebelled against God. He is out of the right relationship with God: Therefore, his deep inner needs are not being met. Many people try to find satisfaction in life but accumulating things such as cars, houses, big screen TV’s, luxuries, designer cloths, shoes, and conveniences. These things may make life easier but they do not meet the deep needs of the heart. Luke 12:15

Many people try to meet there inner needs by seeking worldly success. They think that by doing great things, they will be looked up to by others and feel good about themselves. But success, money, and power do neither make a person happy, nor do they prepare him for the judgment of God that comes after death. Mark 8:36

*** Seeking worldly pleasure**

People often try to escape from their problems by seeking worldly pleasure. The world says, “Eat, drink, and be marry, for tomorrow we die”. One thing wrong with this is that we don’t usually die that soon. Instead, we live to reap the bitter fruits of our wrong doing. As an example of this. A 50 year old woman lamented “When I was young, I fell into sins that have marred my life. My secret sins were committed in my teenage years. I have cried and cried in remorse. If only God would give me peace and take away the awful guilt out of my life.”

*** Drinking, taking drugs, medications.**

Our great enemy, Satan hates us and seeks to destroy us by whatever means he can. John 8:44 One of the ways Satan destroys people is through alcoholic drinks and drugs. People often turn to these things to escape from their troubles. Drinking and drugs may soon to give relief from the problems of life. But eventually they destroy those who use them. Proverbs 23: 20-21, 33-35

*** Trying to reform**

Some people realize that they have lived very sinful lives so they say to themselves, “I will reform, I will live a good life from now on”. Maybe that will make up for my past sins but no one can live the rest of his life without sinning, no matter how hard he tries. Even if he could, it would not make up for his past sins. Proverbs 20:21

*** Becoming religious**

Many people go to church, pray, give money, and do many religious things in the hope that they will be forgiven of their sins. But becoming, religious does not take away sins, nor does it change a person on the inside.

*** God’s solution to our problem**

God knows all about our problems. He knows them better than we do. God knows also that we can not solve our problems by ourselves. God’s solution is his son the Lord Jesus Christ. The name “Jesus” means “Savior”.

He is the Savior the one who saves us.

And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world. 1 John 4:14

Isaac and Rebekah: Rearing Rivals

(Genesis 24-27)

For Better or For Worse: Lesson 3

All scripture references are to the New International Version (NIV), copr. 1973, 1978, 1984 International Bible Society, unless otherwise noted. Quotations from the NIV are used by permission of Zondervan Bible Publishers. Suggested answers are found within parentheses.

Introduction: How do you find a spouse? How do you know when it is the right person? Once you are married, what basic rules should you follow? The story of finding a spouse for Isaac recounts another time and another culture. But, there are important lessons we can learn for today. Let's jump right into our lesson and see what we can learn!

1. Finding a Wife

1. Read Genesis 24:1-4. Isaac should be about 45 years old right now. Would you guess that he had noticed potential wives among the Canaanites?

1. Why did Abraham reject them? (They were not followers of God.)

2. What does it say about Abraham, Isaac and Eliezer, that Abraham consults with Eliezer about finding Isaac a wife, and Isaac goes along with this? (Eliezer has been running Abraham's household for decades. He is apparently a very competent, intelligent and wise man who follows God. Isaac has a history of trusting his father's judgment. (See Genesis 22, where Isaac has been willing to be sacrificed by his father.))

1. What lessons do we learn from this about marriage for today? (Two things. First, it is important to seek to marry someone with a compatible religious background. Second, when seeking a mate, you should pay close attention to the views of those who are mature and wise followers of God. Taking counsel is critical.)

2. Read Genesis 24:10-14. On what does Eliezer depend to obtain the right wife? (He did the reasonable things - like bringing gifts. But, primarily he prayed that God would lead him to the right woman.)

1. What lesson do we learn for today about how to find the right spouse?

(Gifts and the normal aspects of courting are important. But, the most important thing is to seek God's guidance in finding the right spouse. I have been praying for many years that God would lead my children to the right spouse. This week, my son Blake (who is my partner in putting this lesson on the Internet), is getting married to a girl who is clearly the answer to my prayers. Are you praying for God's guidance for the marriage of your children?)

2. What do you think about the "test" that Eliezer sets up to determine God's leading in this? (Eliezer is looking for someone who is gracious, considerate and hard-working. Seems like an intelligent approach.)

3. Read Genesis 24:15-19. What do you think about God's response to the prayer of Eliezer? (God answers immediately! Not only that, He provides a woman who not only fits the requirements of Eliezer's test, but she is also very beautiful!)

4. Eliezer explains to the father and brother of Rebekah his mission, the "family stock," the wealth of Abraham and Isaac, and the Lord's guidance in selecting Rebekah. Read Genesis 24:50-51. What does the reaction of the father and brother tell you about them? (That they were also followers of God and believed in His divine leading in the affairs of His followers. There is some debate about whether this is Bethuel the father of Rebekah, or whether the father has died and this is a son who bears his name. In any event, the appropriate "authorities" in the family give their consent.)

1. Read Genesis 24:55-58. What is Rebekah's view of this arranged marriage? (She seems to agree because she is willing to go right away.)

1. Is Rebekah loved by her family? (It seems yes - for they want a few days to say goodbye.)

2. Why would you guess Rebekah is so willing to go right away? (I think she is excited about this new life and this new adventure and she is ready to go! Perhaps hanging around for additional time would only prolong the sadness of leaving.)

5. Read Genesis 24:59-60. They prayed for a blessing for Rebekah.

Do you see any significance in this prayer? (It suggests that Eliezer explained the promise of God to make Abraham a "great nation.")

2. The Marriage

1. Read Genesis 24:61. Was Rebekah poor? (Her family had money because she has more than one maid.)

2. Read Genesis 24:62-63. I think there is a lot of meaning in these two verses. Is Isaac living at home? (He is not living with his father. This suggests that he is setting up his own place to get ready for his new wife.)

1. Why does Isaac return to his father's place? (My bet is that he has carefully calculated the time, distance and camel speed, and figures his new wife may show up about now. So, he wants to be present for the big occasion.)

2. Isaac went out to "meditate." I thought this might mean pray, but that does not seem to be the case. It means "pensively muse." What would you guess he is musing about? (The new wife, of course!)

1. Is his musing rewarded? (Yes. I recall when my parents were alive and they would drive to visit us. A visit was pretty rare, so I would stand outside my home, or start walking down the sidewalk to see them coming. Isaac sees the camels in the distance and his hopes start to rise.)

3. Read Genesis 24:64-65. There is an old song I like, "Some enchanted evening, you will see a stranger, you will see a stranger, across a crowded room. And somehow you'll know, you'll know even then, you'll see that stranger again and again." These two see each other across an uncrowded field. I love the mental picture.

1. Why does Rebekah get down from her camel to ask Eliezer to confirm Isaac's identity? (Would it be refined to start shouting, "Eliezer, is that the guy?" Since she suspects this is Isaac, it would be impolite to remain seated on the camel when he is walking. Sort of the reverse of standing up when a woman arrives.)

2. What good news does Rebekah get when seeing Isaac?

(He is interested in her coming. He is not off on a hunting trip or a sheep-shearing adventure. He is waiting.)

3. Why did she cover herself with her veil. Was this a custom for Hebrew women? (No, it was not. Consider Genesis 12:14 and Genesis 24:16. Different commentaries have different answers. One suggested a Hebrew woman would wear a veil at the time of her wedding, thus explaining how (later) the son of Isaac and Rebekah could marry the wrong woman and not know it. Another said a betrothed woman remained veiled until the marriage. Another said the veil was a token of "reverence and subjection" to her husband. I'm sure Isaac had gotten a look at her face when she was up on the camel - since his eyesight was probably better than Eliezer's and Eliezer recognized him. So, she lets Isaac see her beauty, then covers it up to await the wedding. I love this story.)

4. Read Genesis 24:66-67. God guided the work of Eliezer in selecting a wife for Isaac - just as Eliezer requested. How did Eliezer's faithfulness in partnering with God work out? (Good work. Isaac loved Rebekah. Notice the reversal of the order of modern marriages: "so she became his wife and he loved her.")

1. Do you understand how Isaac's marriage could comfort him with the loss of his mother? (My son and my daughter were born before my father died. That helped to cushion the loss. No doubt, Sarah's death helped trigger Abraham's decision to get moving on getting a son for Isaac. Abraham wanted to have this taken care of before he died.)

3. Children

1. Read Genesis 25:20-21. What kind of problem did Rebekah have that sounded a familiar family theme? (She also had no children - like Sarah.)

1. How did Isaac handle this? Compare his actions with that of his father? (Isaac turned to God instead of turning to scheming.)

2. Read Genesis 25:22-23. Where does Rebekah go to have her questions answered? (She goes to God!. This is a godly couple!)

What does she learn that is contrary to the normal order of things? (The older will serve the younger.)

1. Read Genesis 25:27-28. The story so far of the marriage of Isaac and Rebekah sounds perfect. What problem creeps into the marriage? (They have preferences among their children.)

1. If you are reading this you once were a child. Unless you were an only child, what does favoritism do to a family? (My parents suffered from favoritism when they were growing up. They determined never to show any favoritism when they were parents.)

2. The Bible gives food as a basis for Isaac's preference for Esau. Do you see any other reason? (Esau is the man of adventure. He is not hanging around the tents!)

2. Read Genesis 25:29-34. What does this reveal about the characters of Esau and Jacob? (It doesn't say anything good about either of them.)

3. Our story goes down hill from here. Genesis 27 describes how Rebekah and Jacob conspire to deceive Isaac in his old age and deprive Esau of the birthright. Why would Rebekah feel justified in this deceit? (Remember, prior to their birth, God's prediction in Genesis 25:23 that Esau would serve Jacob.)

1. Because of this deceit, Jacob is forced to flee from his home. He never sees his father or mother alive again.

4. Friend, how wonderful things were when Isaac and Rebekah depended upon God. When their lives turned to favoritism and then deceit, it tore the family apart. Will you determine to live in accord with God's rules?

Why did Jesus fold the linen burial cloth after His resurrection?

The Gospel of John (20: 7) tells us that the napkin, which was placed over the face of Jesus, was not just thrown aside like the grave clothes. The Bible takes an entire verse to tell us that the napkin was neatly folded, and was placed at the head of that stony coffin. Is that important?

You'd better believe it! Is that significant? Absolutely! Is it really significant? Yes!

In order to understand the significance of the folded napkin, you have to understand a little bit about Hebrew tradition of that day. The folded napkin had to do with the Master and Servant, and every Jewish boy knew this tradition. When the servant set the dinner table for the master, he made sure that it was exactly the way the master wanted it. The table was furnished perfectly, and then the servant would wait, just out of sight, until the master had finished eating, and the servant would not dare touch that table, until the master was finished. Now if the master was done eating, he would rise from the table, wipe his fingers, his mouth, and clean his beard, and would wad up that napkin and toss it onto the table.

The servant would then know to clear the table. For in those days, the wadded napkin meant, "I'm done."

But if the master got up from the table, and folded his napkin, and laid it beside his plate, the servant would not dare touch the table, because the servant knew that the folded napkin meant, "I'm not finished yet." The folded napkin meant, "I'm coming back!"
