no goals, no objectives, no action plans whatsoever. Go to such a place to empty your mind. To write without purpose, to imagine without an end game, to live fully and completely in the moment of his or her experience, now. Not in the past nor in the future, but now.

To prepare yourself for this exercise, try sitting down where you are, closing the door, telling everyone who might bother you to give you ten minutes without a disturbance of any kind.

Unplug the phone, turn off your computer, sit down, face a wall, close your eyes, place your hands in your lap, breath deeply and just stay there, just like that. You'll see immediately what I mean, and why that's important.

You must do this first exercise every single day!

### **The Second Exercise**

Get a blank piece of paper. You have nothing in mind. Sit with the blank piece of paper, and let whatever comes to mind go to the paper.

Whether it be a sentence, or just three seemingly unrelated words. Whether it be an entire paragraph, a thought, a concern, a conclusion, let it write itself down. The key here is to let "It" speak. To let "It" say what "It" wants to say. To let "It" have the room to breath.

Do it for only 10 minutes. Do it once a day.

And save those pieces of paper, with the date on the top right hand corner. Save them in a box, or a file folder, and know that that box or file folder is a sacred place. Because your dreamer has created it. Your entrepreneur has become vulnerable. Your creator has expressed himself or herself, and you've been a witness to it.

### **The Third Exercise**

Maintaining an entrepreneurial journal is a daily process, and I highly recommend it. Buy yourself a journal, preferably with leather covers, a rich-looking journal, a journal that impresses you because it looks so rich, so permanent, so significant. Write in that journal

what you learned that day. Write in that journal what you felt that day. Write in that journal anything that came to mind that day, as you sat with a blank piece of paper, as you sat in your chair facing the wall for ten minutes with absolutely no interruption at all, as you felt your feelings come up, your feelings of being blocked, your feelings of being ashamed, your feelings of excitement, your feelings of despair...whatever came up that day, record it, even though you may not think you're an accomplished writer--or even if you think you are. Your entrepreneurial journal is not about the writing; it's about the recording. This is your life, someone once said. This is your life, and if you don't take it seriously, who will? This is your third exercise, and it will feed your first exercise and your second exercise, and you will know it.

Believe me, you will know it.

### **Satan Vs Jesus Lesson 4 of 13**

#### ***The War Comes to Earth***

(Genesis 4,6&11)

Introduction: Have you heard the old joke, "Question: Why do you beat your head against the wall? Answer: Because it feels good when I stop!" Sometimes we get so used to things we do not realize how life could be otherwise. For example, there are areas of the world in which war has been going on for decades. War just becomes part of life. In the U.S., war has not existed on the mainland for over 100 years. This extra-ordinary period made the shock of September 11 that much greater. Have we become so used to the war between good and evil that we no longer really notice? Do we accept evil as a usual part of life - a usual part of our life? Let's jump into our lesson and see if we can sharpen our senses!

#### **1. War Comes to Your World**

1. Read [Revelation 12:7-9](#). Do you feel like the toxic waste dump of the universe?
  - 1:a Why did Satan and his angels get hurled to earth? Why not earth's moon? Why not Pluto?
  - 1:b Was this just bad luck for us? Satan and his angels were shoved off heaven and we just happened to be spinning by at the time? (This was not some sort of accident. This was not just bad luck. Satan came to live with us because we distrusted and disobeyed God. [Genesis 3:1-6](#))
2. In the last three weeks we have gone over the Genesis account of the entry of sin into our world several times. As a review, how would you say sin entered our world? (Eve wanted to be like God. Motivated by self, she distrusted what God said and disobeyed. Adam was worse, he flatly chose Eve over God. See [1 Timothy 2:14](#). In both cases humans distrusted God and chose a course that elevated their desires over God's desires.

The results are discussed next.)

#### **2. The First Casualty**

1. Read [Genesis 4:1](#). How do you think "mom" viewed Cain's future? If you have children, think back to the moment your first child was born. What kind of emotions would you have if this was not simply your first child, but the first child ever born?
  - 1:a How do you think Adam and Eve viewed Cain's childhood?
2. Read [Genesis 4:2-5](#). Did Cain think that his offering should have been accepted? (Yes. Verse 5 says he was angry.)
  - 2:a Take Cain's point of view. Tell me why his offering should have been accepted?
  - 2:b Was this another example of the "second child" stealing the attention and honor due to him?
  - 2:c What was wrong with Cain's offering?
  - 2:d Read [Genesis 4:6-7](#). What do these verses suggest was wrong with Cain's offering? (God clearly indicates that this was a matter of obedience. God does not say, "I liked the looks of Abel's offering better." Cain apparently had instructions on what kind of offering he should make. Since we know about the Old Testament's sacrificial system, this is no doubt what God is speaking about. The fact that Abel offered a "firstborn" ([Genesis 4:4](#)) suggests he understood the sacrificial system requirements recited in [Deuteronomy 12:6](#).)
  - 2:e Since it is clear that God gave Cain instructions on what kind of sacrifice to make, and he did not, what would you say was the basis for Cain's decision? What was he thinking? (He was no doubt annoyed that he would have to get his sacrifice from his brother Abel. This would be an admission his work was not as good, or as valued, as that of his brother. Next, he decided that he would make his own decision on what was appropriate, instead of listening to God. This gets back to the old problem of wanting to be like God. Instead of just obeying,

Cain decided he would make up the rules in place of God.)

2:e What do you think about God coming to Cain to talk with him about his sacrifice? (It shows God cared about Cain. Not only did He try to explain the situation to Cain, but He warned him about his future.)

3. Read [Genesis 4:8](#). Is this a premeditated murder? (It seems so. Cain invited Abel out to the field to kill him.)

3:a How do you think "mom" Eve viewed this?

3:b Did Adam and Eve blame themselves? Should they have?

3:c You probably view several murders a week if you watch television. Have you dulled the impact of sin in your life? Are we beating our head against the wall and not even realizing it?

3:d How do you explain this level of evil one generation from perfection? (Satan is a monster. He influenced Cain to kill Abel. Sin leads to death. I'll bet Satan's lie in [Genesis 3:4](#) was ringing in "mom's" mind. We are so used to sin that we do not realize how terrible it really is.)

3:e Do you think this was the first killing for Satan? (It makes me speculate that some angels must have been killed in the war in heaven that we discussed in our earlier lessons on this topic.)

### **3. The First Taste of Judgment**

1. Read [Genesis 6:3](#). Does God sound like the father of a teenager? What attitude is reflected in this verse towards people? (This suggests that God is having trouble with humans. He has to "contend" with them. God does not want humans to grow very old and very wicked.)

2. Read [Genesis 6:4](#). How did these Nephilim come into existence? What does it mean "the sons of God" had children by "the daughters of men?" (They say the three rules of real estate are location, location, location. I think this rule applies to the Bible as well.

If you want to understand what a text means you need to examine its context (location, location, location). [Genesis 4:16](#) ff. explains where Cain lived and lists his genealogy. Genesis 5 gives Adam/Seth's genealogy. After presenting these two genealogies of the righteous and the unrighteous, it is logical to read Genesis 6 in light of what was revealed immediately before that. Thus, the "sons of God" in verses 2 and 4 of chapter 6 logically refer to Seth's descendants (see also [Hosea 1:10](#)) and the "daughters of man" refer to Cain's descendants. This conclusion is also bolstered by the fact that God always had trouble with "His people" marrying unbelievers. [Deuteronomy 7:3-4](#); See, [2 Corinthians 6:14](#).)

3. Read [Genesis 6:5-6](#). How is the conflict between God and Satan going?

3:a What do you think it means in verse 6 when it says "the Lord was grieved that He had made man?" What is God's reaction to your sins?

3:b How would you compare God's grief to Eve's grief over the Abel murder?

3:c In comparison, how do you view the sin in your life?

4. Read [Genesis 6:7](#). Is this fair? Should Satan be complaining about a rule change? (There is no change in the rules. God told Adam and Eve if they sinned they would die. Satan knew this rule. [Genesis 3:3-4](#).)

4:a Do you see any "good news" in this? (Yes. If sin grieves you. If you want to see the end of sin and death, this is a sample. This story demonstrates that sin will not last forever. God is not only the source of ultimate love, He is also the source of justice.)

4:b Is the flood a victory for Satan or God?

1. Read [Genesis 11:1-4](#). What do bricks represent? (A technological breakthrough. They don't have to find and fit stones. They can make bricks to a pre-determined size.)

Third, God brings clarity through difficult times. As we learn that His ways are higher than ours, we gain greater understanding of His amazing attributes. At the same time, our self-awareness starts to sharpen, and old, unproductive thought patterns begin to fade.

Fourth, God promises that He will never desert us. Brokenness can feel lonely and empty, as we are losing the things that once captured our loyalty. But our Father replaces those with Himself--and He is vastly more satisfying and dependable.

Fifth, the Lord is always patient. He knows our background and deeply rooted thought patterns. Yet He also sees the end result and knows that the journey is worth it.

When you face hardship, remember God's promises and keep your eyes fixed on the goal. He has your best interest in mind, so seek His lesson for you

Then she ladled the coffee out and placed it in a bowl.

Turning to her daughter, she asked, "Tell me what you see." "Carrots, eggs, and coffee," she replied.

Her mother brought her closer and asked her to feel the carrots. She did and noted that they were soft. The mother then asked the daughter to take an egg and break it. After pulling off the shell, she observed the hard boiled egg.

Finally, the mother asked the daughter to sip the coffee. The daughter smiled as she tasted its rich aroma. The daughter then asked, "What does it mean, mother?"

Her mother explained that each of these objects had faced the same adversity: boiling water. Each reacted differently. The carrot went in strong, hard, and unrelenting. However, after being subjected to the boiling water, it softened and became weak. The egg had been fragile. Its thin outer shell had protected its liquid interior, but after sitting through the boiling water, its inside became hardened. The ground coffee beans were unique, however. After they were in the boiling water, they had changed the water.

"Which are you?" she asked her daughter. "When adversity knocks on your door, how do you respond? Are you a carrot, an egg or a coffee bean?"

Think of this: Which am I? Am I the carrot that seems strong, but with pain and adversity do I wilt and become soft and lose my strength?

Am I the egg that starts with a malleable heart, but changes with the heat? Did I have a fluid spirit, but after a death, a breakup, a financial hardship or some other trial, have I become hardened and stiff? Does my shell look the same, but on the inside am I bitter and tough with a stiff spirit and hardened heart?

Or am I like the coffee bean? The bean actually changes the hot water, the very circumstance that brings the pain. When the water gets hot, it releases the fragrance and flavor.

If you are like the bean, when things are at their worst, you get better and change the situation round you. When the hour is the darkest and trials are their greatest, do you elevate yourself to another level? How do you handle adversity? Are you a carrot, an egg or a coffee bean?

May you have enough happiness to make you sweet, enough trials to make you strong, enough, sorrow to keep you human and enough hope to make you happy. When you were born, you were crying and everyone around you was smiling. Live your life so at the end, you're the one who is smiling and everyone around you is crying.

You might want to send this message to those people who mean something to you (I JUST DID); to those who have touched your life in one way or another; to those who make you smile when you really need it; to those who make you see the brighter side of things when you are really down. **The Crucibles that Come**

([Deuteronomy 28](#), [1 Peter 4](#), [Romans 1 & 2](#))

Introduction: What should a committed Christian expect in life? The Bible gives us all sorts of advice for living better lives. Deuteronomy 28 promises us that if we obey God He will give us a better life here on earth. On the other hand, if we are careless about obeying God we will have a difficult life here. Why, then, do we find these texts in the Bible which tell Christians to expect bad things? Let's dive into our lesson and see what we can learn from the Bible!

**1. Don't Be Surprised**

1. Read [Deuteronomy 28:1-8](#). What does God promise us if we "fully obey" Him? (He promises us blessings. If you read [Deuteronomy 28:1-45](#) you will get the full flavor of this. If you disobey God, your life will be pretty terrible and frustrating.)

2. Read [1 Peter 4:12](#). After reading Deuteronomy 28, you bet I'm surprised. Suffering is strange when placed against the backdrop of Deuteronomy 28. If God does not change, and His word is reliable, how do you explain these apparently contradictory statements?

3. Let's look at the context of [1 Peter 4:12](#). Continue by reading [1 Peter 4:13-16](#). Should we expect to suffer for our disobedience to God? (Yes. Peter says you can expect to suffer as a meddler, murderer, or thief.)

3:a What seems to be the exception to the rule of obey and prosper, disobey and suffer? (Peter points out how Jesus suffered. Jesus was leading the charge in the conflict between good and evil. As a result, He was targeted by Satan and his followers. Peter says we can expect the same thing.)

4. Read [1 Peter 4:17-19](#). Peter continues in the vein of Deuteronomy 28 by comparing those who follow God with those who do not. Have our expected outcomes changed from the Old Testament to the New Testament? (No! Peter says "If you think you've got problems as a follower of Jesus, imagine what is coming upon the unrighteous!")  
4:a What seems to be the primary source of problems for the unrighteous? (The judgment of God.)

5. Read [1 Peter 5:8-9](#). Will our sufferings only come from unbelievers who are unhappy that we follow Jesus? (No. Satan is looking to harm us.)

5:a If Satan is looking to harm the followers of Jesus, what good is it to "be self-controlled and alert?" (This suggests that Satan is looking to cause us to sin - which will then trigger our suffering.)

Is it only our sin that causes us to suffer?  
5:b (The sense of verse 9 is that our suffering causes us to consider abandoning our faith. It refers to "our brothers" undergoing the same kind of suffering. Thus, we are suffering attacks of Satan even though we are obedient.)

6. Read [1 Peter 5:10-11](#). Will God return us to a state of blessing if we are faithful? (Yes. We suffer "a little while.")

6:a Is this state of blessing here on earth? (The text does not specifically say, but it refers to us being called to "eternal glory in Christ." That is a reference to heaven.)

**2. No Excuses**

1. Read [Romans 1:18-20](#). Are you getting the picture that life might not be perfect? (Good thing we studied Psalms 23 last week!) If we obey, Satan is prowling around to harm us. If we disobey, the wrath of God is being revealed to us.

1:a Does anyone have an excuse for disobeying God?

2. Read [Romans 1:21-24](#). How does this suggest that God's wrath works? (That if we reject what is obvious, God allows us to continue in our own way and we continue to slip lower and lower into sinful activities.)

3. Read [Romans 1:26-31](#). What does this suggest about the penalty for sin? (That sin brings its own reward! There is a great truth here if we contemplate it. Obeying God gives us a better life. Disobeying God gives us a worse life. The Christian's life is only worse because of the existence of sin which disrupts the natural order of things. This sin harms us in one of three ways: 1. Satan targets us; 2. General sin in the world catches us in its grasp; or, 3. We commit sin.)

4. Read [Romans 1:32](#). Is the world today in the condition of the world in Paul's time? (Yes! How many today "approve" of the sins listed by Paul? How many today approve of the sin of homosexuality?)

4:a How about you? Do you approve of the sins listed by Paul?

4:b Read [Romans 2:1](#). How do we walk the line between "judging" others and not "approving" of sin?

4:c Read [Romans 2:2-4](#). What brings us to repentance? What brings those sinners we read about in [Romans 1:26-32](#) to repentance? (God's kindness! Should we take any other approach?)

### **3. Getting Better**

1. Read [Jeremiah 9:7](#). We just said that Satan and sin in general can injure us. For what other reason can we have what seems to be trouble in our life? (God says He will "refine" and "test" us.)

1:a What kind of picture do you see in this text - that Joe Christian is innocently walking down the street when all of a sudden the refiner's fire hits him and knocks him to the ground? (No. Notice the last part of verse 7:

"what else can I do because of the sin of my people?" Our sin triggers the refiner's fire.)

1:b Is anyone perfect? Since I assume the answer to that question is "no," should we act surprised when faced with the "refiner's fire?"

1:c What should be your attitude towards a refining fire? (You should be grateful. God sees merit in you. He sees that you can be "golden." The goal is not punishment, it is your improvement.)

2. Read [2 Corinthians 12:7-9](#). Paul says that he was given some wonderful revelations about heaven (2 Corinthians 12:1-6), and later Satan sent him "a thorn in my flesh" to torment him. Why does Paul say he received the "thorn?" (To keep him from becoming conceited.)

2:a Paul asked God to take away this thorn from Satan. Why didn't God take it away?

2:b What does God mean when He says "My grace is sufficient for you?" (I think of grace as Jesus' offer of salvation on my behalf. Thus, I read this as God saying "I'll take you to heaven where you will not have any pain or suffering. That should be an adequate answer to your present suffering.)

2:c What does God mean when He says, "My power is made perfect in weakness?" (This is a theme of the Old Testament - God wants it to be clear that He is the Author of victory, not humans. Thus, when we do great work for God, He is glorified when it is clear that He did it and not us. When we suffer some sort of difficulty, that makes God's power that much clearer.)

3. Read [2 Corinthians 12:10](#). What is Paul's final attitude about this annoying problem? (He ends up delighting in it because "when I am weak, then I am strong.")

## ***The Personality and Divinity of the Holy Spirit***

(Matthew 12, Genesis 1, Mark 3)

Introduction: The nature of God is a major subject of the Bible. What separated the followers of the Living God from the rest of the world was their belief in a single living God, and not a large number of gods. Even today, observant Jews wonder how Christians could get "off the track" with their belief in three, not one God. Why do we believe that the Holy Spirit is one part of the Trinity that is God? Who is the Holy Spirit? What is His nature? Our study this Year 2009 takes us into these questions about the Holy Spirit. Let's begin by plunging into our study right now!

### **1. Holy, Holy, Holy**

1. Read [Genesis 1:1-3](#). At what point in the Bible are we introduced to the Spirit of God? (The very beginning.)
2. Read [Psalms 104:30](#). Does this text, and Genesis 1, suggest that the Spirit of God created us? (Yes.)
3. Read [John 1:1-3](#). Who does this text say created us? (The Word.)  
3:a Who is the Word? (Read [John 1:14](#). This chapter in John makes clear that Jesus is the Word.)
4. Do these texts contradict each other? Some texts say the Spirit of God created us, others say that Jesus created us. How do you explain this? (Read [Genesis 1:26](#). God uses the plural when He says that He is going to make humans in His image. In the very beginning of the Bible we are introduced to this idea of the "plural" nature of our one Living God.)

5. Read [Isaiah 6:3](#) and [Revelation 4:8](#). Do you wonder why when praising God the heavenly beings repeat "Holy" three times? (This also implies a Trinity of three.)

6. Read [Matthew 28:18-19](#). After Jesus' resurrection from the dead He gives this instruction to His disciples. When Jesus directs us to "baptize them in the name," what is He saying? (The new converts are to enter into a new relationship with their God. They acknowledge their allegiance to their new God.)

6:a Who is the God whom they now serve? (In [Matthew 28:18](#) Jesus announces that now that He has defeated Satan, all authority has been returned to Him. He re-enters His rightful place as one of the three facets of God: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.)

6:b For the purposes of this lesson, we are most interested in the Holy Spirit. What authority does the Holy Spirit possess? (It is fully part of the Trinity. When we are baptized we accept the Holy Spirit as God every bit as much as we accept the Father and Jesus as our God.)

### **2. Blasphemy**

1. Read [Matthew 12:22-23](#). When the people see Jesus perform this great miracle, what thought comes into their minds? (That He could be the promised Messiah, the "Son of David.")
2. Read [Matthew 12:24](#). What alternative answer do the Pharisees suggest to what the people are thinking? (That Jesus is using the power of Satan to do miracles. He is not simply a man, he is a man who uses evil power.)
3. Read [Matthew 12:25-27](#). How does Jesus answer the accusation of the Pharisees? What logic does He use?

(What common sense is there in Satan driving out His own forces? Why would Satan do that? If it is true that Satan is willing to drive out his own forces, then when the Pharisees drive out demons they might be relying on Satan too!)

4. Read [Matthew 12:28](#). What does this verse teach us about the Holy Spirit? (1.) That He is stronger than Satan. (2.) That He is willing to work with humans to overcome Satan. (3.) His work is proof of the presence of the Kingdom of God.

5. Read [Matthew 12:29](#). Is Jesus telling us that He and the Holy Spirit are robbers?

5:a If so, what is being taken by the robbers? (Sinners! Those captive to sin. I was going to skip over this text until I realized the importance of what Jesus is saying: We cannot defeat Satan without the power of the Holy Spirit. We cannot convert sinners without Satan being first bound by the Holy Spirit.)

6. Read [Matthew 12:30](#). What is it to "gather?" (Help convert others.)

6:a Why can't we be neutral? Why is the absence of "gathering" "scattering?"

6:b When I took a course in logic in (a Christian) college, my professor pointed to a similar statement by Jesus as being an example of the "Black/white" or "Division" fallacy. My view then, as now, was that the sayings of Jesus could not be a logical fallacy. So, how do you understand Jesus' statement? (In many situations of life we can be neutral. Thus, the logical fallacy is accurate. But here the context is very important. Jesus tells us that a "strong man" is at work who already has "possessions." We don't start out neutral. We start out as fallen humans, sinners, who are the possessions of Satan. When it comes to spiritual matters, there are no neutral parties.)

7. Read [Matthew 12:31-32](#). Can you blaspheme someone who is not God? (No. This is further proof of the divinity of the Holy Spirit.)

7:a Is this proof that Jesus is not divine, since speaking against Him can be forgiven? (No. The assumption in Jesus' statement is that speaking against Him is blasphemy too. It can, however, be forgiven.)

7:b What, exactly, is the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit here? (Go back to the story of the healing of the demon possessed man. Attributing to Satan the power of the Holy Spirit is the blasphemy.)

7:c How can we avoid blasphemy against the Holy Spirit in the future? (I recall articles in religious (non-charismatic) publications which pretty directly called certain faith healing the product of the power of Satan. This kind of statement is very dangerous. You need to be 100% sure before you make any statement like that. Calling the work of another Christian the work of Satan is a dangerous thing.)

8. Read [Mark 3:28-29](#), another account of Jesus' statement. Why is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit the unpardonable sin? Standing alone, these two verses in Mark would contradict each other. Obviously, Jesus does not consider them to contradict each other. How do you reconcile these two texts? (A Commentary, Critical and Explanatory, on the Old and New Testaments has an explanation, part of which I like. It looks at [Mark 3:28](#) and concludes "There is no sin whatever, it seems, of which it may be said. 'That is not a pardonable sin.'" Thus, verse 29 explains verse 28, it does not contradict it. There is nothing in the nature of any sin in itself that would make it unpardonable.)

8:a Then what is it about this sin that makes it unpardonable? (Read [John 16:8-11](#).

1:a Why would building a tower "make a name" for them?

1:b Are you building a tower to make a name for yourself?

1:c Why build a tower? (Once again the context is very important. Just after the flood account, we find a people building a tower. Although God had promised in [Genesis 9:11](#) that He would not send another world-wide flood, these people did not believe God and determined to take matters into their own hands and build something higher than the waters had reached.)

1:d Read [Genesis 9:1](#), 18-19. What do you think about the goal ([Genesis 11:4](#)) of the tower builders to avoid being scattered? (God wanted them to be scattered and fill the earth. Again, these are people who do not believe or obey God.)

2. Read [Genesis 11:5-8](#). Consider especially verses 6 and 7. What do you think about this statement by God? Does God fear man? (These people were working in opposition to God. God does not fear man, but He does not have to allow His opponents to work efficiently. The result of confusing their language is that God's direction to scatter throughout the earth is fulfilled.)

Friend, how about you? Do you believe God and trust Him? Or, are you taking your own steps to fulfill your own goals? Are you even conscious of how your actions affect the war between good and evil?

Friend, how about you? Are you suffering from some problem today? If it stems from your sins, then turn away. If it is sent to refine your character, look forward to the final results. If Satan is just injuring you, know two things: First, God's grace is sufficient for you. Second, God works more effectively for His glory when we are weak.

## *The Father, The Son, The Holy Ghost!*

This is a text about the work of the Holy Spirit. It is the Holy Spirit which brings conviction of sin and salvation. If you reject the power of the Holy Spirit in your life, if you attribute the Spirit's work to Satan, then by necessity you will never confess sin or accept God's gift of salvation. It is not that any sin is unforgivable, it is simply that if your sin is rejecting the power that convicts you of sin, you will never be convicted of your sin!

8:b Is rejecting the Holy Spirit a "one time" thing, or a slow process of the life? (It must be slow because [John 16:8](#) says that the Spirit "will convict the world of guilt." I don't think you need to accept the Holy Spirit to be convicted of sin. It is by steadily rejecting the Spirit's efforts that you direct your path to eternal destruction.)

Friend, accepting the Holy Spirit as fully God is essential to becoming a Christian. Accepting the work of the Holy Spirit in your life is essential to living the Christian life. Will you invite the Holy Spirit into your life today?
