## **Fruit of the Holy Spirit**

**(1 Corinthians 13, Galatians 5)**

### **Lesson 8**

Introduction: Talking with Christians about the Holy Spirit can sometimes get pretty confusing. Last month we studied the specific "gifts" of the Holy Spirit - which to an outsider sounds like the Holy Spirit might have something in common with Santa Claus. This month we study the "fruit" of the Holy Spirit, which sounds like the Holy Spirit might have something in common with an fruit tree. How would you explain the difference between the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the fruit of the Holy Spirit? Let's dive into our study of the Bible and find out!

#### **1. Gifts v. Fruit**

1. Read [Galatians 5:22-23](#). Why is it appropriate to call "love, joy, peace, etc." the "fruit" of the Holy Spirit? This sounds like no fruit I have ever seen in the grocery market. How do you explain this?
2. Read [Matthew 7:15-17](#). How does Jesus use the term "fruit" in this context? (Just as a tree bears fruit, so people bear "fruit" in their actions and attitudes.)
3. Read [Matthew 7:18-19](#). What does the "fruit" of a person, say about the person? (Fruit reveals what kind of a person you are. If you are a bad person, you bear bad "fruit." A good person bears good "fruit.")
4. Let's look again at the subject of our study last week. Read [1 Corinthians 12:8-10](#). If someone is given the "gift" of wisdom by the Holy Spirit, wouldn't the "fruit" of that be "smart thoughts?" Would not the fruit of the gift of healing be healthy people?
  - 4:a If so, why are these not mentioned as "fruits" of the Holy Spirit?
  - 4:b Read [1 Corinthians 12:7](#). What is the purpose of the gifts of the Holy Spirit? (The "common good." The idea that I see is that everyone has one or more "gifts" from the Holy Spirit that is used to build up the church - the body of believers.

Thus, saying that a "fruit" of the gift of wisdom is "smart thoughts" for the individual is not exactly right. The idea is that the gift helps others, it does not just improve the holder of the gift. Everyone works together with their different gifts to make the entire church body better.)

5. Read [1 Corinthians 13:1-3](#). Notice that this text puts gifts and fruits together. What is Paul saying about them?
  - 5:a Is Paul saying that a person can have a gift without having a fruit? (Yes, apparently. He also appears to be saying that things like "smart thoughts" are not a fruit of the Holy Spirit.)
  - 5:b If Paul is saying that, what do you think is wrong with having a gift but not having fruit?
  - 5:c Let's look at the examples that Paul gives us. If someone has the gift of "faith" - the faith to do special miracles, such moving a mountain, but does not have love, why is that a problem?
  - 5:d Last month we discussed the fact that not all Christians have all gifts. Is it possible that "love" is just not the gift given to this person who can move mountains?
  - 5:e If someone with the gift of faith heals me from cancer, do I care if that person is loving or not? I would rather have someone who healed me from cancer without love than someone who loved me but was unable to heal me. "My lawyer (doctor) is really nice, but basically incompetent."
  - 5:f Notice the other example: the gift of tongues. What did we decide last month was the purpose of the gift of tongues? (To communicate.)
  - 5:g What is Paul trying to tell us when he says the gift of tongues without love is like "a resounding gong or clanging cymbal?" (You hear the sound, but it doesn't mean anything to you.)
6. Have you ever seen someone who had a wonderful, expensive, powerful tool - but did not know how to use it properly? I think that illustrates the difference between gifts and fruits. Gifts are the "tools" that the Holy Spirit gives to us to promote the common good. Fruits are results in our personal life of the use of those tools.)

6:a Are gifts and fruit related?

7. Read [Matthew 7:21-23](#). Is this a "gifts" and "fruits" problem? (Yes. Remember that the fruits demonstrate the type of tree? Here, people are demonstrating the gifts of the Holy Spirit, but they did not truly know God. The fruit of love shows that the person knows God and has a relationship with God.)

8. Friend, if you are a Christian, this is scary stuff, right? You can exercise the very "top" gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to Matthew 7, yet not be saved because your fruit gives you away as not knowing God. That makes the fruit very important, so let's turn next to the first fruit of the Holy Spirit mentioned in [Galatians 5:22](#).

## **2. First Fruit: Love**

1. Read [1 Corinthians 13:4](#). Since cars had not yet been invented, is there a "driving the car" exception to patience? Should there be?

1:a Have you seen someone who obviously had important gifts of the Holy Spirit, but did not seem to be patient or kind?

1:b Would you fall into that category?

1:c What relationship do envy, boasting and pride have to each other? (They have in common comparing yourself to others. Either others are doing better and you do not like it, or you are doing better and you want them to know about it.)

1:d This past weekend my son, Blake, who is the webmaster and primary funding source of this website ([www.GoBible.org](http://www.GoBible.org)) graduated from Andrews University. He graduated with the highest honors possible: Summa Cum Laude and an Andrews Scholar. I mentioned this to friends (actually, to just about anyone who would listen) several times before and during last weekend. Have I sinned in writing this? Was it boasting and pride that is not love to tell others?

2. Read [1 Corinthians 13:5](#). Do you see any relationship between being rude, easily angered, self-seeking and keeping score of wrongs? (These are the opposite of being patient, kind and not proud. If you cannot tell if you are patient, kind and not boastful,

see if you can find yourself described in verse 5.)

2:a Why should we not keep a record of wrongs?

3. Read [1 Corinthians 13:6](#). What does it mean to delight in evil? Can you give me an example?

3:a Would [1 Corinthians 13:6](#) be a special text for newspaper editors? (Rejoicing in evil would be to appreciate the misfortunes of others.)

4. Read [1 Corinthians 13:7](#). In what way do you think that love "hopes" and "perseveres?" (As opposed to rejoicing in the misfortunes of others, instead you hope that they will do well. You continue to look forward to the day when things will get better for them.)

5. Read [1 Corinthians 13:8-10](#). In what other way is the fruit of the Holy Spirit unlike the gifts of the Holy Spirit? (This text tells us that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are not a constant thing. They come and go. But, the fruit of the Spirit is something that should be constant in our life.)

5:a Which do you think is more important, gifts or fruit?

6. Read [1 Corinthians 13:13](#). Why is love the greatest of the fruits of the Spirit?

Friend, what kind of fruit do you find in your life? If your "fruit" shows that you are a bad "tree," then I invite you today to confess your sins, ask Jesus to save you and have the Holy Spirit give you good fruit.

*Matthew 6:19-21 Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.*

*Ever heard of "shorting the dollar"? I have to admit, don't know a whole lot about financial investing, but I do know that there are people who invest in other currencies, hoping the dollar will continue to decrease in order to increase their own wealth.*

*"Well, that's not very nice," you might be saying. But there may be a lesson to be learned from them. What these people are actually doing is looking at a bigger picture. They examine the way the dollar is functioning in the global economy and then make an educated investment. These guys recently made billions.*

*Unfortunately, speaking of "shorting," we kinda got the short end of the stick as far as the dollar is concerned. The exchange rate in Israel has really hurt Israeli-based ministries this year. We once received 4.74 shekels per dollar — and now we're only getting 3.77 shekels on the same dollar — so keep us in your prayers!*

*But here's my point. We too, need to be looking at the big picture and become wise investors today — but not just in earthly opportunities.*

*Yes, we need to be wiser stewards of the finances God has entrusted to us. Perhaps God is calling us to be a Joseph, storing up goods to help others in future hardships. That is our heart's desire here in the Land. But most importantly, we need to step up as believers and realize how the investments we now make in prayer and sharing the Gospel transform into eternal investments — with a guaranteed rate of return that will exceed our wildest imagination!*

*Let's not settle for small-time investments — let's get serious about investing in the Kingdom of God! There's so much work to be done!*

*What the mind thinks can't always come out of the mouth. When someone curses you. You can't curse them back. You must discipline yourself to hold your tongue and think far into the situation. If you are in the spirit the spirit will convict you. If you are in your lower nature, you may be convicted or you may not for running your mouth. You may be separated from God.*

*GEN 3:23-24*

*David had the opportunity to kill King Saul, His mind had to think but the action could not be carried out. As a karate student practices moves over and over again for self-defense, then practices moves over and over again to strike his opponent. When the time comes to fight. He acts on his actions before his mind tells him too, he has practiced the moves so much that they are a part of him. His body (actions) move before he thinks it through. He has disciplined himself to automatically follow through on practiced moves and actions.*

*As the body moves in sin to do something that it shouldn't. The consequences can be devastating. The consequences can be everlasting. Stop the body (actions), stop the mind, think what would Jesus or his disciple do in this case. The mind is faster than any computer.*

## ***Curse of a Culture: A Divided Nation***

Today's Focus: Curse of a Culture:

A Divided Nation

Scripture: Matthew 12:25

Greetings Kingdom Citizens

In this installment we will deal with how the Egyptian culture proved to be divisive and how this has carried over to America. In ancient Egypt of course there were numerous false gods but also those gods who were particular to a certain level of society. Only the pharaohs could carry Horus and Osiris because those gods were specific to the leadership. Isis and Bastet were particular to women and children. What is funny, if you look up the Egyptian mythology, the gods fought each other for power over the land of Egypt. If your leadership is divided, how can your nation be united. Christ was not specific to any rank or status of person. He came to save all of mankind. The true and living God wants all of His children to be saved but what is sad is that some will still believe in false gods and shall spend eternity in hell believing that even though Christ shall come back and reveal Himself to all.

Let me make this very clear and I would like for you to pray about what is being said. The body of Christ is being divided by false gods, denominations and secret organizations. Christ said "I am the Way, the Truth and Life" and He is the only way. Christ strictly forbid the taking of oaths and swearing because it causes His children to take allegiance with other things of this world. You have to be COMPLETELY sold out to Christ to truly understand His power and your assignment. You cannot be associated with other deities or secret organizations. Christians should not join any organization where they have to go into a situation blind. In addition, no Christian should join an organization where:

1. You have to humiliate yourself to be a part
2. They will lie to you in your face about what you have to go through to be a member
3. Be a part of any rituals or rites of passage
4. There is proclamation of light given that you know nothing about (blind at first then "brought" into the "light".)
5. Christ is not the head or where they say all religions are equal.

With Christ, it is all or none. He needs your whole heart and not 99%. What happens is that the people in these secret organizations hold themselves to a

higher level than those who are not a part of the organization. This presents a division within the body of Christ and in some situations cause that portion associated with the organization to be misguided spiritually. We walk around with all of these symbols and organization symbols on our cars and proclaim our allegiance to them, but when it is time to proclaim Christ, few are found. Our very government is run by many involved in various secret societies. Some of these societies try to inject some Christian beliefs but pervert the gospel just to get members. This is truly the spirit of the Antichrist. Those who put the mark of these organizations on their bodies is just like putting graffiti on the temple of the Lord. Isn't your body an indwelling for the Holy Spirit? So, your body is a temple. I had to personally denounce the organization I was in and when I told some of the members, they said "I can respect that and I had their support". If Christ came today to you and said it's either me or the organization, what would you pick? That is what He is asking today for us to do. To deny the world and the things of the world, pick up our cross and follow Him. You can not follow Him and look at the organization at the same time. Status means nothing to Christ because you are nothing without Him.

Many young people have come to me and asked me about joining various organizations and I give them the same answer. Is Christ the Head and only deity, do you have to take an oath or go through a rite of passage and do you know everything about this organization? All organizations are not bad, but I do bring into question what is there to hide that these organizations do not want all of us to know about? Christ did not hide anything and we should not go into something blind. The Kingdom of God is revealed to those who want to know how to operate and live and this Kingdom is never divided because the King that is there today was there yesterday and in the time to come.

Scripture: Leviticus 19:28

Greetings Kingdom Citizens

I do not understand why we get tattoos when God clearly says in the scripture not to do it. But the problem is, we are ignorant to what they mean and where it comes from. When you take a bite of an apple that's not ripe the problem isn't with the apple; the problem is we didn't wait for the tree to get to the place where the apple is ripe. It's our timing that is the problem, not the apple nor the tree.

This is a powerful message for us, because it makes clear that the only real problem we have is that our process is not yet complete. We cannot beat ourselves up because we're angry, sad or depressed, or because we haven't reached our goals.. We're just a work in progress. We are the fruit not yet ripe for the picking. Our imperfection doesn't make us bad.

This applies to our relationship with our spiritual growth. It also means we can't judge anyone, or say that they are bad or not worthy. Not one of us isn't good enough. Not one of us isn't worthy enough. Whether we are at the seed, or the branch, or the fruit — remember, it's all about process.

Often we find ourselves in relationships that seem to go nowhere, or working on business projects that can't get off the ground. Sometimes it takes 10, 20, or even 100 planted seeds before fruit is borne. But there is no such thing as wasted effort - each seed planted and each effort made is what makes ultimate success possible.

We can certainly plant the right seeds and know that our labor of love is not in vain. So stop judging yourself and others for not being ripe. Figure out which trees need more patience from you. And look back on your previous harvests and know the total fulfilment is on its way.

Last week looked at how we can relate our spiritual process to the growth process of an apple. If something isn't right in our lives it's like we are picking a fruit before it is ripe. It's not the fruit's fault — we're simply looking for results before they are complete.

The first thing we need to get beyond is feeling that we aren't capable, that we outside of the Light of the Most High. How the Most High chooses to shine on us is not always in our hands to know, but a huge obstacle to tasting the fruits is the belief that I don't deserve to see fruit or that I'm some sort of low life unworthy of G-d's love.

There's enough limitation in our world without negative thinking, even the very illusions provided by our five senses can oppose the truth of who G-d declares that we are. We can stunt our own growth when we get to thinking that we are not deserving.

Secondly, there may be fruits already in our life that we don't see simply because we don't truly believe that we are capable of seeing our seeds become fruit. Even when our seeds become fruit, we think they didn't. We think they are invisible, worthless, of little value, or unimportant. As far as we are concerned, the seeds went into the ground and nothing came about. We did put forth positive actions, good deeds, invested our energy and think it was all done in vain. But what we don't realize is, we put energy in and created something special in the universe. We just don't see the value that we created.

The fruits might not always look or taste the way we expect them to. Sometimes they're hidden, unclear. But every seed/action we do, a fruit is

eventually created. And the only people who see their fruits are those who believe they'll see them. They're the people who know their actions have power. As the holy scriptures state, the worlds were formed by faith. As long as we, on any level, believe there will be fruits — there is no question there will be. The key is to plant in faith, joy and love believing that you will see a harvest.

Remember:

## The Cosmic Conflict Between Christ & Satan

Satan Vs Jesus Lesson 11 Of 13  
Lesson 11

### The War Within

(John 12, Matthew 16, 26 & 27)

Introduction: Last Month we learned that at the cross Jesus won the conflict between good and evil. His victory gives us the opportunity to choose between good and evil, life and death. How are you choosing? Restoring our choice means that the conflict is still to be decided in our life. Let's explore how that conflict played out in the lives of two of Jesus' disciples.

#### 1. Judas

1. Read [John 12:1-2](#). Two months ago we discussed the emotions of Mary, Martha and Lazarus during the time that Lazarus was dying and Jesus did not come to help. What kind of feelings and emotions do you think they now have about Jesus? (They love Him more than ever! Imagine what an event this is - a dinner to honor the man who raised one of the hosts to life. I would like to have been there.)

2. Read [John 12:3-5](#). The perfume was "worth a year's wages." What is the average annual wage? Let's say that you bought a bottle of perfume that cost the same as a new car. Would that be sinful?

2:a Does Judas have a point? Isn't this a terrible waste of money?

2:b Why did Mary do this for Jesus? (I think Mary is a more emotional person than Martha. Remember John 11:20 tells us that Mary "stayed home" and did not come out to meet Jesus when He arrived after Lazarus had died. She was upset with Jesus. He had let Lazarus die. Now that Jesus raised her brother to life, her strong emotions have swung the other way and she wants to show Jesus how much she loves Him.)

2:c Who is Judas criticizing? Mary or Jesus? (Jesus. If he were criticizing Mary, he would simply say "Why didn't you give the money to the poor instead of buying this expensive perfume?" Instead, Judas takes the purchase of the perfume as a given and says "Why wasn't it sold instead of used on your feet?"

Judas remarks are directed at the point that Jesus "takes control" of the gift.)

3. Read [John 12:6](#). Have you ever had someone question your motives for good work? Here we have Judas looking out for the poor, and John is questioning his motives, right?

4. Read [Matthew 26:14-16](#). What is Judas' motive for betraying Jesus? (It seems to be money.)

4:a How does this make any sense? Isn't Jesus the "cash cow," the "golden goose" for contributions? Isn't He the reason why people would contribute? Isn't it short-sighted to take money now to "kill the golden goose?"

5. Let's read skip down one chapter in Matthew. Read Matthew 27:3-5. If money motivated Judas:

a) What did Judas think the Jewish leaders were going to do to Jesus?

b) Why would he give the money back or hang himself?

(I think Judas' motivation was money and power, but not the 30 pieces of silver. Judas calculated that he was more sophisticated about this kind of thing than Jesus and the working-class disciples. He figured that Jesus would be forced to declare Himself King and take power. When that happened Judas would become a powerful man and have lots of money. The 30 pieces of silver were just "icing on the cake" for this smart move. What Judas did not expect was that Jesus (v.3) would be condemned. When Judas saw that Jesus was actually going to die, he felt remorse for killing an innocent man AND his grand future was down the drain. Without the future he planned, he killed himself.)

6. What lessons do you learn from Judas that you can apply to your life? (We have a lot of money flying around in this story, but I do not think this is about money. The perfume Mary bought was the equivalent of wages for 300 days of work. The 30 pieces of silver were worth wages for 120 days of work. Judas' problem was the attitude that he knew better than Jesus how to usher in the Kingdom of God. When we look at the teachings of the Bible and decide that they do not apply to us because we are too "sophisticated," we make the same mistake as Judas.

Mary took very expensive perfume to perform the role of a servant - washing Jesus' feet. Judas decided that Jesus should be servant to Judas' plans.)

## 2. Peter

1. Read [Matthew 16:21-23](#). A few verses ([Matthew 16:16-18](#)) before this Peter was complimented by Jesus because he recognized Jesus was the Son of God. Now Jesus calls Peter "Satan." Why? (This is the "Judas problem." Peter is sure he knows better than Jesus what the future holds for Jesus.)

2. Read [Matthew 26:31-35](#). What is Peter's attitude? Does he believe he is more faithful than the rest of the disciples? (Verse 33 reveals Peter's confidence he was more faithful than anyone else.)

2:a Do you think Peter is serious about being willing to die? Or, does he think he would never die defending Jesus, the Son of God?

3 Read [John 18:3-5](#), 10-11. Is Peter willing to die? (A detachment of armed soldiers has come for Jesus. However, the verses that I skipped contain the account (v.6) of the soldiers falling to the ground in Jesus' presence. Peter is certainly willing to fight. I'm not sure he thinks he will die.)

3:a Was Peter willing to have Jesus die? (No. Verse 11 records Jesus speaking to Peter on just that point.)

4.3:b Was Peter faithful? (Yes! Whether he is willing to actually die is not clear, but it certainly is clear that he is willing to fight for Jesus.)

4. Read [John 18:15-17](#), 25-27. Why the change in Peter? (Peter thought Jesus would never die. Peter was willing to fight to keep Jesus from dying. When it seemed that Jesus would not fight and He might die, Peter was uncertain of his ground. Things were not turning out as he had expected.)

4:a Are Judas and Peter similar? (Judas was looking out for himself. Peter was looking out for Jesus. What they had in common was an attitude that they were right about the future. Judas was willing to stake his "plot" on his view of the future and Peter was willing to fight for his view of the future. When the future did not turn out as they planned, they were both devastated.)

5. Read [Matthew 26:75](#). Judas went out and hung himself, and Peter went out and wept. What makes the difference between the two at this point?(First, we have a difference in attitude. One was looking out for Judas and the other was looking out for Jesus. Second, I think Judas believed that Jesus let him down. Life would not be as he expected because Jesus did not fulfill Judas' plan. Peter also saw things were not working out as he had expected, but he believed that he had let Jesus down. The one stuck with his plan and his pride and killed himself because there was no future. The other stuck with Jesus and repented.)

6. How about you? Do you "manipulate" the gospel to make yourself rich and powerful? Do you have certain expectations of the gospel for which you are willing to fight - but only if things turn out as expected? (A theme I keep seeing in these verses is "Come, follow Me." Not, "Jesus, come follow my plan.")

## 3: The Light

1. Read [John 8:12](#). What is the key to living in the light according to this text? (Following Jesus.)

2. Did Judas or Peter understand the future? Were they living in the light?

2:a What was their failure? (They failed to just be willing to follow Jesus. Peter changed after he learned this lesson the hard way.)

Friend, this is the secret to taking advantage of the victory that Jesus has already won - to put aside our own ideas and simply follow the directions of Jesus. This will give us a life "in the light."
