Regular Meeting
July 13, 2026
7:00 p.m.

Dave Zanicky, Don Reed, Tyler Kovach, Jane Bauldoff, Aaron Raible, and 13 signed in guests were in attendance.

A show of hands indicated this was not an audio or video recorded meeting.

Open to the Public: Ed Cashmere asked why ATV on Cornetti Road was allowed with the horse drawn carriages. There is no problem, most farms have ATVs. There was a lengthy discussion how ATV/UTV users are required to follow our ordinance and DCNR regulations. Dave mentioned statistics have shown there are reduced accidents going from point A to point B when riding roads are legal. Its also reduces the township liability as accidents are covered with the users' insurance. Mr. Cashmere said he has called the State Police in the past over riders doing donuts and also using his property. He was told they do not chase them. Phil Hay told him to call DCNR who regulates registration and to give this a chance to work.

Mr. Cashmere was thanked for cleaning up Long Run Road in the past collecting 130 tires and 35 televisions.

Discussed resident burning plastic and smoke infiltrates the valley. We have no burning ordinance. He was told to call DEP Clean Air who regulates this.

Mike Bergbigler asked if there were planting tree setbacks and told 'no'.

Dave related learning about 'Asphalt Rejuvenation' at the Hershey Convention, a new idea to keep roads in good condition longer, not yet approved for PennDOT use but is currently being tested. Townships are permitted to use at this point.

Jake related learning of grant opportunities at the Spring Convention.

Discussed the SALDO and how it will keep resident's safe with any developments.

Old Business:

The minutes from the June meeting were read. Don made a motion to approve the minutes. Tyler seconded. Carried.

New Business:

The treasurer's report was read. General Fund \$150,700.10. Deposits \$26,075.64. Disbursed \$41,127.38. Ending \$135,648.36. State Fund \$309,935.87. Deposits \$12.74. Disbursed \$.00. Ending \$309,948.61. Sewage Fund \$9,947.81. Deposits \$.42. Disbursed \$0.00. Ending \$9,948.23. Capital Reserve Fund \$381,205.009. Deposits \$125,240.95. Disbursed \$0.00. Ending \$506,446.04. Equipment Fund \$67,765.61. Deposits \$2,502.93. Disbursed \$.00. Ending \$72,268.54. Building Fund \$57,945.06. Deposits \$1,002.41. Disbursed \$0.00. Ending \$58,948.47. Traffic Light Fund \$37,052.61. Deposits \$.91. Disbursed \$.00. Ending \$37,053.52. Don made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Dave abstained. Tyler seconded. Carried.

Don made a motion to approve transferring from General Fund-\$2,500 to Equipment Fund, \$1,000 to Building Fund, and \$500 to Money Market. Tyler seconded. Carried.

Tyler made a motion to purchase 6-month CD at 3.5% in the amount of \$270,000 using \$50,000 from Building Fund, \$50,113.19 from Equipment Fund, and roll over existing CD. Dave seconded. Carried.

Tyler made a motion to purchase the 50T initial fill of salt. Don seconded. Carried.

Dave made a motion to place Solicitation Ordinance 26-08-01 in Butler Eagle legal ads for possible adoption at next month's meeting. This ordinance will not affect farmers or homeowners. Tyler seconded. Carried.

Tyler made a motion to apply for HARIE Safety Grant for MIG welder, helmet, and gloves in the mid-price range. Dave seconded. Carried.

Planning Commission: The supervisors accepted the resignation of Denny McLaughlin from the Planning Commission. We will be accepting resumes and place on website for filling the position at next month's meeting.

Building and Sewage Permits: 4 building permits were issued.

Complaint from Sherly Vogt on George Floyd shed not within property setback was discussed. The shed was built on a concrete pad approximately 15 years ago by 3 owners ago. He has already complied with the former complaint of his pavilion within setback and moved it. Don made a motion to take no action and not hold him accountable. Dave seconded. Carried.

With no further business, Don made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Dave seconded. Carried.
